

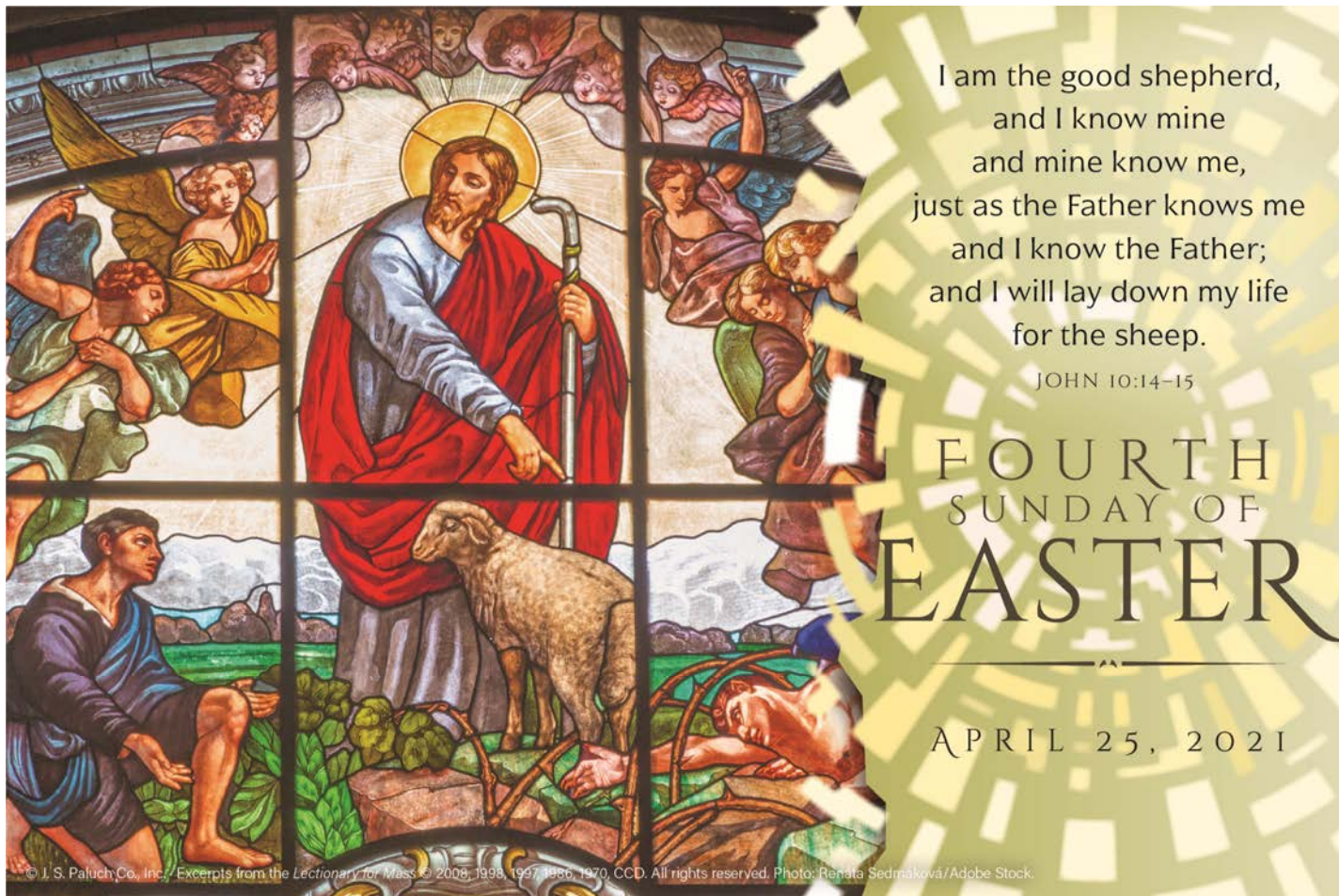

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

GOOD SHEPHERD WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

The scriptures for the 4th Sunday of Easter in all three cycles of readings have to deal with the theme of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. At the same time the church has designated this Sunday as a World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

Every baptized Roman Catholic is called to discern to which vocation they are called by God. Our vocation choices include married life, single life, religious life or ordained life. On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations we concentrate on the celibate calls to Priesthood and/or Consecrated Religious Life.

While we **pray** in a special way for these vocations this weekend, it's also important for us to remember to **do something** as well. Do you recognize something in someone that would lead you to think they might have a vocation to the Priesthood or Consecrated Religious Life? As the slogan goes, *"If you **see** something, **say** something!"* You might be the instrument God chooses to wake up a call in someone else. I remember the people who used to say to me in my younger years, "Jimmy, you should become a priest!" As I look back, I believe those were some of the voices God was using to call on me. I didn't realize it at the time, but now I do.

My first grade teacher, Sr. Barbara Marie Brylka, CSSF, was and still is a major inspiration in my life. The peace and joy of her life were what I wanted in my life too. It was through her example and encouragement that I entered the Conventual Franciscans right out of high school in 1979. It was later on within that call to the Franciscan way of life that I discerned a further call to priesthood. And so, twenty years later, on May 8, 1999, I was ordained as a Franciscan Priest and served for my first six years of priesthood as the parochial vicar of St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Rockford, Illinois, and then the next five years as pastor and

rector of the Basilica of St. Josaphat in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

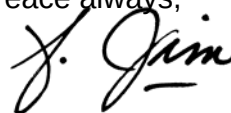
In 2010, I responded to promptings in my heart to pursue priestly ministry in the Diocese of Las Vegas. The need for priests here was greater than the need in my Franciscan Community. Three years later, on June 3rd, I was formally incardinated as a priest of the Diocese of Las Vegas pledging my obedience as a diocesan priest to Bishop Joseph Pepe. (As a little fun-fact, Fr. Gene and I were incardinated into the Diocese of Las Vegas on the same day!) In this diocese I spent my first two years as parochial vicar and later as administrator here at SEAS. In 2012, I was assigned to St. John Neumann as administrator and then pastor after my incardination in 2013. From 2016-2019 I also was the pastor of St. James the Apostle. Since July of 2019 I'm back where it all began, now as pastor.

God's plan for each one of us is very unique. Mine had many twists and turns: from Franciscan Brother to Franciscan Priest to Diocesan Priest. In my eyes, that's enough! I look forward to living out the remaining years of priestly ministry here in the Diocese of Las Vegas, God willing.

But, for me, the beginnings of hearing God's voice came through the voices of others. Maybe you might be the voice God uses to spark a vocation to Priesthood and/or Consecrated Religious Life.

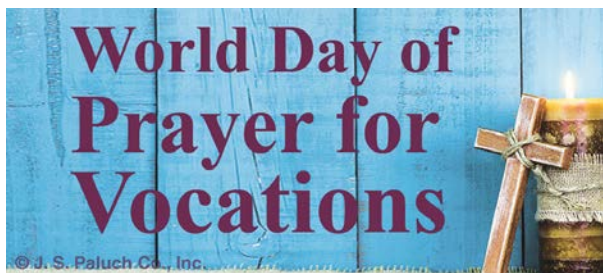

Feast of Faith

The Gospel Reading

The climax of the Liturgy of the Word comes with the proclamation of the Gospel. Everything tells us that something important is happening. We stand. We sing special acclamations. Servers with candles and sometimes incense lead the deacon or priest to the ambo, where the reading is proclaimed from a special book.

All of the readings are important, but the liturgy directs special attention to the Gospel for a reason. "[A]mong all the inspired writings, even among those of the New Testament, the Gospels have a special place, and rightly so, because they are our principal source for the life and teaching of the Incarnate Word, our Saviour" (*Dei Verbum*, the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation of the Second Vatican Council, 18). In the Gospels, the narrative of Christ's saving life, death and resurrection continues to be proclaimed in our midst.

Our Sunday Lectionary is structured so as to allow us to hear as much of the Gospels as possible. The readings are arranged in a three-year cycle. In Year A, the Gospel readings are taken mainly from Matthew; in Year B, from Mark and John; and in Year C, from Luke. In this way, over the course of three years, we hear a substantial portion of all four Gospels.

Saint of the Week

Catherine of Siena

1347 - 1380

Feast Day: April 29

Catherine was the 24th of 25 children of a Sienese dyer; her mystical experiences and raptures began at age 6. She refused to marry, and about 1367 joined the Third Order of St. Dominic. She attracted a like-minded group in Siena for prayer and good works and devoted her last five years to church unity and ending the scandal of rival papacies. Though she experienced the pain of the stigmata, it became visible only after her death at 33. And, in an odd division of relics, her body is in a Roman church, while her head is in a Sienese church. Named a doctor of the church in 1970, Catherine is a patron saint of Europe and Italy, and the patron of fire prevention, nurses and nursing.

"Take as your example your heavenly patroness, St Catherine, a humble and fearless Dominican tertiary who gave herself unsparingly for the Church. For everyone may this great saint be not only a special protectress but a model to follow on the path of holiness." —St. John Paul II, October 10, 1999

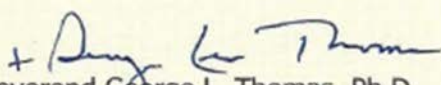
DECREE

Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Mass Extension – April 25, 2021 to May 30, 2021

While I have granted permission to begin the reopening of public Masses, due to the ongoing gravity of the present moment and the restrictions being placed on us during the civil reopening plan, I hereby extend the dispensation for **all Catholic faithful of the Diocese of Las Vegas and those Catholics visiting within the geographic boundaries of our Diocese, from the obligation of attending Sunday Masses and Holy Days of Obligation up to and including Sunday, May 30, 2021.**

While we recognize that many are eager to return to Mass in our churches, it remains important for those who are elderly and otherwise at risk to refrain from returning to public Liturgies until it is manifestly safe to do so. For all the faithful, especially those who are sick, at high risk of becoming sick, and their caregivers, the obligation to attend Mass is hereby dispensed.

Stewardship and Solidarity in a Time of Pandemic

Part II of a two-part series by Daniel Conway

Pope Francis has repeatedly connected the stewardship of creation (care for our common home) with the solidarity that must exist between all members of the human family, each created in the image and likeness of God. Shortly after the pandemic caused the closure of public facilities including churches, schools, restaurants, sporting events and other social gatherings, Pope Francis stood alone in the vast emptiness of St. Peter's Square, in the pouring rain, and prayed for that "blessed common belonging" which makes us all sisters and brothers.

Practicing global solidarity is essential if we are ever to achieve peace, justice and the common good of all. Loving our neighbor has global dimensions—especially in a "shrinking world." As Pope Paul VI taught, if we want peace we must work for justice. And as Pope St. John Paul II added, there can be no peace without forgiveness—especially of ancient, deeply held hurts and grievances. Our love for all our sisters and brothers demands that we promote peace in a world saturated with violence and conflict.

Global solidarity also challenges us to recognize that we are stewards of all God's creation. Care for the earth is not optional or incidental to our Catholic faith; it is a fundamental responsibility given to our first parents, and all of us, at the moment God

breathed life into us and charged us with the mission of exercising responsible stewardship over all His gifts.

As Pope Francis writes in his encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*, "If every human being possesses an inalienable dignity, if all people are my brothers and sisters, and if the world truly belongs to everyone, then it matters little whether my neighbor was born in my country or elsewhere (#125).

Solidarity and stewardship are important to Christian life at all times. But in this time of pandemic, they are essential to both the spiritual and physical well-being of all God's people.

Food Drive and Distribution

Thank you to everyone who donated to our St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Food Pantry in March and April!

- Students from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton School Class 2A brought food to our pantry (picture top of page 13).
- Parishioners donated food during our food drive (picture bottom left of page 13) or gave financial donations so we could shop for them.
- The Elkhorn Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints delivered food to our pantry on Sunday, April 11 (picture bottom right of page 13).

- Eighty people in March and 78 people in April (aged 60 and better) received healthy food from our Golden Groceries program in partnership with Three Square Food Bank.
- More than 240 families picked up food in our drive-thru food distribution in March.

Catholic Social Teachings

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month



5 FIVE WAYS

to protect your children from sexual abuse

Parents play the primary role in educating their children about sexual abuse. Here are 5 tips for teaching safety to the little ones God has entrusted to you.

1

Keep it practical. Teach your children the differences between safe touches and unsafe touches.

2

Tell your children that saying “no” is okay. Empower your children to say “no” if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable or touches them inappropriately.

3

Give your children a way to alert you. Tell your children they can use an excuse or share a special “code-word” with you to alert you about an unsafe person or situation.

4

Tell your children to report an unsafe touch.

Let your children know they should tell you if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe around any adult or peer. You can also identify other adults they can tell about unsafe touches.

5

Tell your children you trust them. If your child makes a report to you, believe him or her. Tell them it is not their fault and that you love them. Immediately bring the allegation to the attention of public authorities.

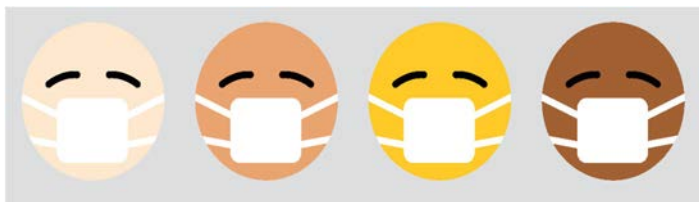

All should remember, that if one cannot make it to confession, even if mortal sin is present, they still can approach to receive the Eucharist if they make an act of perfect contrition with the intention to go to Confession the next time that it is possible. Canon 916 states: *"A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible."*

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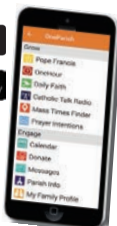
