

Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends,

What wonderful celebrations we experienced for sacred Triduum and Easter Sunday! I am grateful for all those who helped make it both prayerful and joyous. These liturgies would not have been possible without the help of our liturgical ministers: Altar Servers, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Ushers, Sacristans, and Music Ministers—and of course Deacon Aruna and Deacon Steve. Fr. Lourdes. Fr. David. Fr. Tom. our Sisters, and our staff. Thank you all for sharing your time and talents so generously. I would like to extend a special thank you to our guest Fr. James DiLuzio for leading our Holy Week Retreat and for celebrating with us throughout the Triduum and Easter Sunday. His enthusiastic spirit and passionate homilies made our celebrations truly special.

Once again, I would like to congratulate our neophytes (those who received the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil), and extend my thanks to all those who helped them prepare for this special night: Pastoral Associate Marcie Wilske, Deacon Steve Doucet, the RCIA team and sponsors, Helen Silva, Patty Stava, and all those who helped with the RCIC process, especially their parents and sponsors. I ask our parish community to pray for our newest members as they continue on their journey of faith.

Fr. Lourdes, Deacon Aruna & Helen Silva, and I would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to all of you who called, emailed, texted, offered your concern, and asked about our loved ones in Sri Lanka. None of our immediate family members were harmed, but the senseless act of terrorism that took place in Sri Lanka on Easter Sunday did take the lives of three of my distant cousins who were celebrating Easter Sunday Mass. I ask that you pray for them and their family members at this difficult time. I also ask you to pray for the country. For the past 10 years, Śri Lanka has enjoyed peaceful times after many years of civil unrest. Last week's terrorist attacks aimed to destroy the peace and also the economy which is supported by the country's main industry of tourism. Many of you have asked how you can help. An interfaith open-forum fundraising event will be held at Shiraz Restaurant on Thursday, May 2 from

6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Shiraz is located at 2575 S. Decatur Blvd. Money raised will help the families of those who lost their lives in the Easter Sunday bombings. If you are unable to attend the fundraiser but would like to make a donation, please write a check to SEAS with "Sri Lanka" written on the memo line and return it in the collection basket or to our Kairos Gift Shop. You can also make a donation at https://www.gofundme.com/fundraiser-for -the-victims-of-the-bomb-blasts. Your support and prayers will be greatly appreciated.

Today and next Sunday we will celebrate with 119 children form our parish community who will receive their first Holy Communion. We welcome their families who will come to celebrate with them. Also, we thank our parish staff, teachers, catechists, and volunteers who have been teaching and guiding them throughout their studies.

Today we enter into the second week of Easter. We cannot tell the Easter story and celebrate the wondrous gift of salvation in just one day; therefore, Easter continues for the next 50 days through Pentecost Sunday on June 9. The Easter season is a time of rejoicing for God has fulfilled his promise to us through his son Jesus Christ, who has conquered sin and death and gives us eternal life.



The Easter Season

Easter isn't just a day, it's a whole season and stretches all the way to the feast of Pentecost.

At Masses all through the Easter season, our usual practice of reading from the Old Testament is replaced by reading from the Acts of the Apostles. These readings tell the story of the Church's earliest days, and the beginnings of our faith's spreading throughout the ancient world. These stories of heroism, controversies, persecutions and miracles all testify to the continued presence of the Risen Christ in the world, through the lives of his disciples, and the actions of the Holy Spirit.

All of this should be an encouragement and a sign of hope for us today. Despite war, violence, personal struggles, and an under-performing economy, God has not abandoned us, nor left us to our own devices. The risen savior is still with us.

These 50 days of Easter ask us to reflect on his presence, and—even in the face of danger or fear—to live with joy.

Seeing is believing! Since cellphone screens connect us instantly to social media, live TV, and loved ones' faces near and far, "Doubting Thomas" could be our patron saint: "Unless I see, I will not believe!" But how comforting for any of us who share Thomas' doubt, or love "doubters" who do, to see how kindly Jesus responds. By offering the very evidence that Thomas demanded. Jesus doesn't scold Thomas, but seems to understand such skepticism. Could Jesus have been thinking of us, who long to believe that "Jesus is risen!" but see so much suffering, and perhaps even cause some, that we wonder, how could something so wonderful be true? In today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the risen Jesus' healing love comforts through disciples who love others. In Revelation, "our brother John" doesn't just claim he saw Jesus alive, but passes on Jesus' lifegiving words, "Do not be afraid." Seeing Jesus in others is believing!

Divine Mercy Devotion

On Divine Mercy Sunday, April 28, the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed at 2:00 p.m. in the Mater Dei Chapel. Bring your Divine Mercy icons to be blessed. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, a Polish

nun, who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread. The message of mercy is that God loves us—all of us—no matter how great our sins. He wants us to recognize that his mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon him with trust, receive his mercy, and let it flow through us to others.
