Dear Parishioners and Friends,

HAPPY EASTER, COVID STYLE!

Here we are, over a year after the initial lock-down, and we're still struggling with the reality of the COVID-19 pandemic and the after-effects of a unique political season, the likes of which I have never seen before. The frustrations and emotions are still very much present. I think many of us would like to experience a "resurrection" moment from this past year of "passion and death" experiences that have left remnants of sadness, division and, most unfortunate, even serious harm to once-loving family relationships and personal friendships.

But, the resurrection of Jesus reminds us that sadness and death are not the final answers. There is new life beyond the troubles of our relationships. Like Jesus, we need to rise from and leave behind those difficult times to embrace the new and positive life that Jesus offers to everyone. As Jesus offers us a new chance to return to him every time we turn away from him, so we are to offer others a new chance from the difficulties of the past. Easter is that time when we can spring forward in God's love and embrace a new beginning with one another as we leave behind the negativity and division that can continue to weigh us down.

Easter, even a "Covid-style" Easter with continued limitations and safety protocols, can be a source of hope. Remember last year when we couldn't even be together? A year later, we're still not back to "the way we were," but we're definitely on the way forward. And so, we have an opportunity to view these Easter Sunday Masses as positively half-full or negatively half-empty. How about we take some advice from the song made popular in the 1940s with music by Harold Arlen and lyrics by Johnny Mercer. Actually, it was Mercer's publicity agent who heard a homily by a "Father Divine" whose subject was "accentuate the positive and eliminate the negative" and Johnny said, "Wow, that's a colorful phrase!" I'd propose it's a good thought for all of us as we move forward in the joy of this "Covid-style" Easter season:

*You've got to ac-cent-tchu-ate the positive
Eliminate the negative
Latch on to the affirmative
Don't mess with Mister In Between!*

*You've got to spread joy up to the maximum
Bring gloom down to the minimum
Have faith...or pandemonium
Liable to walk upon the scene!*

The fact is, some of you, parishioners and visitors alike, may not have felt welcomed or have been harmed by the Church, her ministers or her people, in one way or another...**We Welcome You!** Your presence here is a sign of hope, and I pray you might be able to accept my apology on behalf of the Roman Catholic Church for any way you may have been harmed or offended by the unjust and sinful actions or words from any of Christ's followers. I pray that one day there may be forgiveness for us: "for what we have done, and what we have failed to do." All in God's time and God's way, not ours.

One who experienced great harm from unjust and sinful actions or words was †**Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.** On this Easter Sunday, April 4th, we remember the very day in 1968 when this modern day prophet and disciple of Christ, saw the early end of his life at the age of 39 simply because he lived and preached the Gospel of God. He saw the inherent goodness in everyone created in the image and likeness of God, even in those who refused to see the image and likeness of God in himself (†Martin) and all people of color.

A few of my favorite quotes from our brother †Martin are worth sharing: "Love is the only force capable of transforming an enemy into a friend." "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." "Forgiveness is not an occasional act, it is a constant attitude."

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord



What is Easter?

The Easter Vigil is the “Mother of All Vigils.” Easter Sunday, then, is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of the Lord’s Resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday of Easter to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death, expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian, Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the Resurrection: “If Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith” (1 Cor 15:14).

“What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind; . . . So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible. It is sown dishonorable; it is raised glorious. It is sown weak; it is raised powerful. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual one. So, too, it is written, ‘The first man, Adam, became a living being,’ the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one” (1 Cor 15:36-37, 42-49)

The Octave of Easter comprises the eight days,

which stretch from the first Sunday of Easter to the Second Sunday of Easter. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday.

The word “Easter” comes from Old English, meaning simply the “east.” The sun that rises in the east, bringing light, warmth and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and is lit for all liturgical celebrations.

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Feast of Faith

The Eucharist: Food for Resurrection

How do we celebrate Easter, the greatest of our Christian feasts? By doing what we do every Sunday and every day: celebrating the Mass. On the first Easter, as the heartbroken disciples walked the road to Emmaus, the Lord was with them but they did not realize it. They only recognized him “in the breaking of the bread” (Luke 22:35).

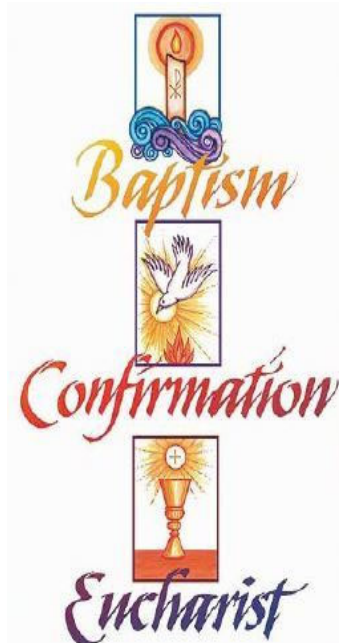
It is the same for us. In the Mass—the breaking of the bread—we meet the risen Lord together. We meet him in each other—for by our baptism into his death and resurrection, we have become members of one body, the Body of Christ. We meet him in his word—in the liturgy the scriptures are proclaimed to us, that they might take root and grow in us. And we meet him in a special way in the Eucharist, the sacrament of his Body and Blood, which is food for resurrection: “whoever eats this bread will live forever” (John 6:51). The Lord is risen indeed, and it is the Risen One who truly presides at this and every Eucharist.

Rejoice and Be Glad

During the first three or four centuries of Christianity, if you asked a Christian to name the feast days of the church, your answer would have been a puzzled stare, for there was only one feast: the Resurrection of the Lord. Every Sunday was a feast celebrating the one great feast. Even though our calendar now has many beautiful and holy feasts, we must continually be called back to the fact that all these other feasts exist because of the feast of Christ's passover from death to life. The psalm today proclaims this message well: "This is the day." It is not one of many days, but it is the day of all days, the one that gives all the others their origin, purpose, meaning and destiny. Listen carefully to Peter's speech in Acts with its recollection of the Passion, to the words of the apostle Paul, and to the account of Mary Magdalene, John and Peter finding the empty tomb, and you will hear the many wonderful works that God has done for us through Christ. Rejoice and be glad!

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Saint of the Week

Saint Magdalen of Canossa

Dates: 1774 - 1835

Feast Day: April 10

This foundress, born to a noble family in Verona, Italy, lost her father at age 5 and was abandoned by her mother when she remarried. Choosing religious life over an advantageous marriage, Magdalen first joined the Carmelites, but left when she saw that their strict rules of enclosure would prohibit her charitable works. She began a new community, the Canossian Daughters of Charity, in 1799 by bringing two poor girls into her own home. The institute spread throughout Italy, and Magdalen helped found an order of priests and a third order for laypeople. Canossians minister today in Italy, Latin America and the Philippines. Magdalen, who was canonized in 1988, famously said, "Those who love are never tired, since love knows no burden."

Easter - A Joyful Season for Missionary Disciples

For those who exercise good stewardship of their Catholic faith, this April is the happiest, most joyful of months for it ushers in the great Easter season — a season of profound hope and joy. During the Easter season, which extends 50 days, from the Easter Vigil Mass of Saturday evening, April 3, to the Vigil Mass of Pentecost Sunday, on Saturday evening, May 22, Christian stewards are exhorted to celebrate and be joyful, for our Savior is with us.

In his apostolic exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium* ("The Joy of the Gospel"), Pope Francis revealed that the best way to live out the joy of Easter is to become a genuine family of faith, an "evangelizing Church that comes out of herself." He urged Catholics around the world to contemplate the mind of Jesus Christ and what it means to be the "light of Christ." From there, Francis believed a spirituality of missionary discipleship could be cultivated that would "help the Church get out of herself" and reach out to those who live in darkness.

At the Easter Vigil, all the great symbols are there: darkness, light, fire, water. The Vigil begins in darkness; not a darkness to be ignored, but a darkness in which we realize where we would be without the light of Christ, a darkness that reveals much about our world, our own sinfulness, the darkness that sometimes envelopes our own lives and even shrouds our own hearts. But then, the great fire of the Vigil is lit, a fire which consumes the darkness, and the procession into the church reminds us of the light and strength provided by the community of the faithful and the saving light of Christ. Indeed, Saint Paul maintains that we are

stewards of this great light. We remember the waters of baptism during the Vigil as we renew our baptismal vows. The Vigil also brings into our community those newly baptized who proceed joyfully with us into April.

As missionary disciples who exercise stewardship of Jesus' teachings, come into the glory of this April, join with those apostles whose hearts were on fire and contemplate the words of the risen Lord: "Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father" (Matt. 5:16). For missionary disciples, this charge should be enough to bring hope and joy. Indeed, April is the most glorious of months. Christ is risen! Alleluia!

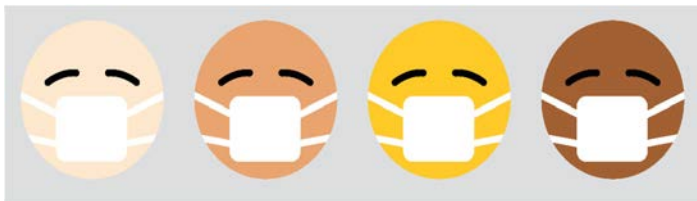


No Confessions on Monday, April 5

the following Monday, April 12 at the regular time of 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. or until those confessions are finished. Confessions are also heard by appointment. To make an appointment, call the church office at 702-228-8311 and press (0) for Sandra, the receptionist.

All should remember, that if one cannot make it to confession, even if mortal sin is present, they still can approach to receive the Eucharist if they make an act of perfect contrition with the intention to go to Confession the next time that it is possible. Canon 916 states: *"A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible."*



Face Masks are REQUIRED at SEAS

Wearing a face mask at SEAS is required by all individuals age 2 and older. The mask is to be worn so it covers your mouth and your nose at all times. Although other states may be lifting their face mask mandates, those policies do not apply to us. Face masks are still mandated by both the State of Nevada and the Diocese of Las Vegas. At SEAS, you are expected to adhere to this safety guideline for the good of all present. There will be no exceptions.

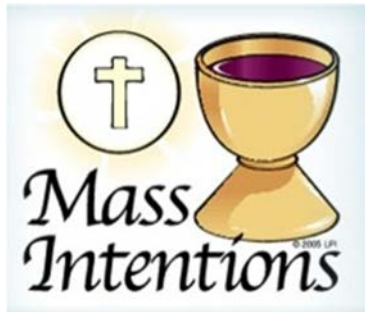

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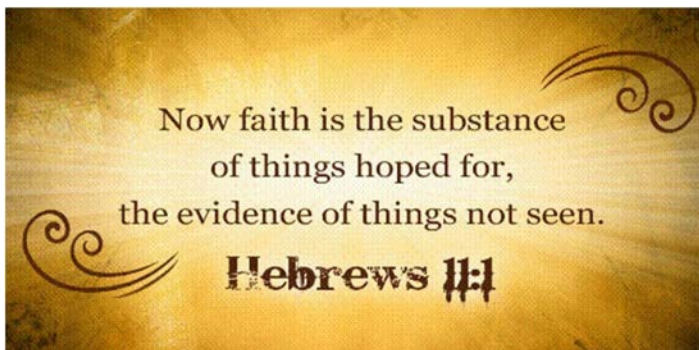

Bible Study on the Letter to the Hebrews Begins Week of April 19

The Letter to the Hebrews is more like a sermon than a letter. In it, the author tries to strengthen the faith of Christians who are slipping back into their old ways of life and turning away from their new life in Christ. Convinced in the truth and superiority of Christianity over other religions, he reviews the history of Israel to demonstrate how Jesus Christ fulfills and even surpasses all the hopes expressed in the Old Testament. Jesus is the unique High Priest who is simultaneously the one who offers sacrifice to God and is himself the sacrifice. Because Christ is both the high priest and perfect sacrifice, his saving action – his death, resurrection and exaltation – has made possible the forgiveness of sins, confident access to God and hope for eternal life with God. Join us for this 7-session study as we explore the eternal message found in the Letter to the Hebrews.

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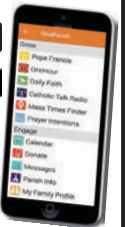
