Parents and Godparents should attend the baptism class on the first Tuesday of the month at 6:30 pm in the Parish Hall classrooms. Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

The ministry of catechist is one of the oldest ministries of the Church. A "catechist" is one who teaches the principles of Christian dogma, discipline, and ethics to prepare people for participation in Christian life. The word "catechesis" means to echo or to resound, an appropriate meaning for what a catechist does in passing of the faith tradition to the children of our parish.

To be a catechist, you must:

- ◆ be a practicing Catholic
- ◆ be in communion with the Church
- ◆ complete a ministry application
- ◆ be fingerprinted and attend the Protecting God's Children Program
- ◆ continue your own faith formation

Stewarding Our Families

When “Back to School” means “Back to the Family Dinner Table.”

August brings us face to face with one of life’s realities: summer vacation has to end. Children may groan and parents may breathe a sigh of relief, but one thing is

certain. The beginning of school brings a return to routine, and this translates into less eating on the run and more scheduled meals around the family dinner table. It’s not always possible for the whole family to eat together, but making it a priority at least some nights of the week can pay big dividends for the Christian steward trying to raise a family of faith. Here are a few dinner table tips:

- Everyone should know certain nights are family dinner nights. Look closely at everyone’s schedule, make a plan, and then hold family nights sacred.
- Whether frozen pizza or prime rib, set the table nicely and sit down. Maybe light a dinner candle or pull out the cloth napkins now and then. Pick up a special dessert once in a while.
- Parents and kids often hit the dinner hour fatigued. Make an effort to relax. Start off with a smile and laughter, even when you’d rather hit the couch.
- If you haven’t already, begin the family custom of praying before meals in a spontaneous way. What was I most thankful for today? Where did I see a situation that calls for prayer? Let everyone take a brief turn. It may lead to a great conversation after the “amen.”
- Resist scolding or criticizing a child at dinner. Never demand to know why the math paper wasn’t turned in, or why the kid will not get out of bed on time. Save it for a private discussion

later. Allow the dinner table to be a place of welcome and support.

- Share the ups and downs of your own day. Listen respectfully to their exploits and complaints.
- As you review the day’s events, don’t forget God. Just as you are interested in what your children are reading in literature class or library hour, express an interest in what’s being taught in religion class or in weekly faith formation.
- Set the rule that everyone remains seated until all are finished. Then the meal is complete.
- But the work’s not done. Divide the duties of setting the table, clearing, washing dishes, even cooking so that everyone has a role to play and the work goes quickly.
- Bring back the custom of an “after dinner” prayer, brief and blessed.

A Stewardship Moment

In today’s second reading, we hear the author of the letter to the Hebrews liken the daily life of the Christian steward to a race, a long-distance race perhaps, certainly not a sprint; requiring endurance and a single-minded focus on Jesus at the finish line. Good stewards are firmly committed to running the race, to live the Christian life to the fullest, to keep their eyes focused on Jesus. They don’t grow weary. They don’t lose heart. They know there is immense joy waiting for them at the finish line. Are you fully committed to living each day for Christ? Are you running the race, or are you simply jogging? Just walking? Sitting? Going backwards? Going nowhere? Some of us may want to reflect on what we can do to run the race with even more conviction. Others may want to reflect on how to simply enter the race and start running.

Revisiting Your Capital Campaign Questions

Who will be asked to give to the capital campaign?

Every parishioner and school family will be asked to participate through a sacrificial gift to the campaign, and every parishioner and school family will be given multiple opportunities to do so. The role of our campaign committee will be to help develop a strategy to appropriately engage the community and encourage sacrificial participation in the campaign from all parish families. We will strive for 100% participation.

Will we be asking families to give an amount above and beyond their regular giving?

Yes. We will be emphasizing to every family that the amount they give is over and above their regular giving since this project addresses a capital need and regular giving is for expenses in our parish operational budget.

What does “generosity of giving” mean?

We learn the meaning of “generosity of giving” in Holy Scripture: “You are being enriched in every-way for all generosity, which through us produces thanksgiving to God, for the administration of this public service is not only supplying the needs of the holy ones but is also overflowing in many acts of thanksgiving to God. Through the evidence of this service, you are glorifying God for your obedient confession of the Gospel of Christ and the generosity of your contribution to them and to all others...(2 Cor. 9:11-13)

How can I make a pledge to the campaign? Can I pledge over time?

Our campaign offers a wide range of gift opportunities to participate at all levels. You may choose a plan that provides you the flexibility to make monthly, quarterly, or annual payments on your pledge over a 3 year period.

Dear Parishioners,

Has the air conditioner ever gone out at your house? It's a big headache, and the repairs are pricey. The severe Las Vegas heat takes a toll on air conditioners, and the ones that cool our parish buildings are no exception.

The parish wants to avoid problems with our air conditioners, which is why they're a priority in our **HONORING our PAST EMBRACING our FUTURE Capital Campaign**. So far, we've received \$1,682,828 in pledges to the campaign.

Our campus has a total of 58 air conditioning units. Of that total, 38 units will need to be replaced in the near future — 23 in the school, 2 in the church, and 13 in the Parish Hall. Funds from the campaign will be used to replace, only as needed, those 38 units. Doing so will avoid breakdowns and costly repairs.

The overall aim of our campaign is to sustain our church and school, address deferred maintenance, and enhance our worship space. The campaign, which has a \$4.5 million goal, is focused on projects you identified in the planning study that led to this vital effort.

Our campaign is running strong, but we still have a long way to go to reach our goal. Everyone must participate for it to become a success.

I ask that if you have not yet had an opportunity to make a gift to the campaign that you please do so. Your gift, along with those from your fellow parishioners, will help our parish continue to thrive and to minister to God's people.

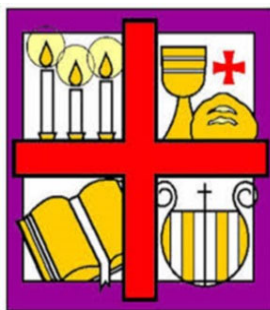

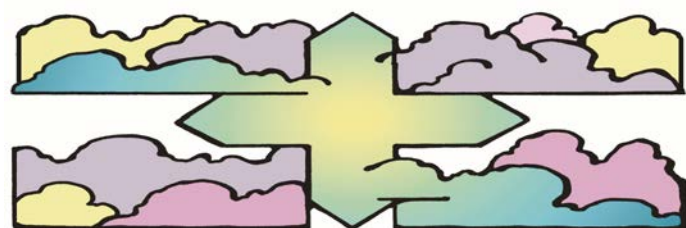


