A Letter from Our Pastor

Dear family and friends of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (SEAS):

WELCOME FR. LUIS!

This week we welcomed **Fr. Luis Van Dam, CJD**, as a shared hospital minister between our parish and St. Anthony of Padua as well. As such, he is not assigned as a parochial vicar (associate pastor) to either parish, but he will provide the Sacramental ministries to the sick and infirmed of both parish families. This is a new arrangement for SEAS and St. Anthony of Padua, and I'm sure there will be some "growing pains" as we figure out how this will work between our parish families. The salary and benefits for Fr. Luis will be shared equally between SEAS and St. Anthony of Padua.

Fr. Luis' primary ministry will be for the Sacramental care of the Catholic patients at both Mountain View and Centennial Hills hospitals, and to some of the various care facilities within the parish boundaries of SEAS and St. Anthony of Padua. He will also be the primary provider of the Sacrament of Anointing for the sick and homebound of both parishes. In no way will this limit or interfere with the continued ministries of our dedicated Sisters and Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist who faithfully visit and minister the Blessed Sacrament to countless individuals unable to be with us at Mass.

As I wrote in the bulletin of two weeks ago, Fr. Luis and Fr. José belong to the Canons Regular of Jesus the Lord. They have been in the Diocese of Las Vegas for the past three years, but this will be the first time that they will actually be able to live together "in community" at SEAS' other rectory. Their religious community is very happy that they finally will share their religious life and charism in the same residence here at SEAS.

While Fr. Luis may be seen concelebrating at many Masses here at SEAS and praying with the parish community before our weekday morning Masses, the major focus of Fr. Luis' Sacramental ministries to the sick is primary for him. Therefore, you won't be seeing him preside at many Masses here at SEAS or St. Anthony of Padua. Fr. Luis will be directly responsible for presiding at the monthly Masses offered at some of the care facili-

ties between our two parishes. No doubt he will be kept very busy in this new ministry.

So, WELCOME FR. LUIS! We look forward to your presence among us and your ministry to those in need of the healing touch of Christ through the Sacraments offered at your hands.

THANKS FROM ME...

...for not bombarding me with requests to start something new and for not asking me to "turn back the clock" to days gone by. It's going to take me quite a while to understand the complexities of all that happens in this dynamic parish and school. Therefore, the **last thing** I need now is someone wanting to start something new or correct something that doesn't need fixing. I'm sure there will be some adaptations to procedures or policies to help us as we move forward, but those will be done with great care and consultation for the good of God's kingdom here at SEAS. As long as we move forward united in faith, love and respect, with our eyes focused on the Lord, we can only have great hope for the future God continues to work through us. For all of this, may God be pleased with all we say and do for God's greater honor and glory.

St. Lawrence

Third Century

Feast Day - August 10

One of seven Roman deacons, Lawrence distributed alms to the poor. The deacons and Pope Sixtus II were arrested Aug. 6, 258, during the persecution of Valerian. All but Lawrence were martyred by the next day. When Rome's prefect demanded church funds from Lawrence, the deacon assembled the poor and said, "This is the treasury of the church." On August 10, the prefect began roasting Lawrence on a gridiron, thinking it would break him. But, according to legend, he asked to be turned and roasted on the other side.

Fact of Faith

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord: What is this Feast All About?

How are we to understand the Transfiguration? The story of the Transfiguration is also proclaimed on the second Sunday of Lent — a key part of Jesus' journey towards the Cross. The Catechism of the Catholic Church draws parallels between Jesus' Baptism and the Transfiguration. Jesus is baptized at the start of his public ministry. His baptism proclaims the mystery of our first regeneration — we die and rise again with Christ. The "Transfiguration 'is the sacrament of the second regeneration': our own Resurrection (St. Thomas Aquinas, STh III, 45, 4, ad 2). From now on we share in the Lord's Resurrection through the Spirit who acts in the sacraments of the Body of Christ. The Transfiguration gives us a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming, when he 'will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body (Phil 3:21)'" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 556).

During the Prayer after Communion, we pray that God might "transform us into the likeness of your [his] Son, / whose radiant splendor you willed to

make manifest / in his glorious Transfiguration." The Collect, or opening prayer, tells us that the mystery of the Transfiguration "prefigures our full adoption to sonship." The Transfiguration, initially revealed to Peter, James, and John, reveals to all of us a taste of what is yet to come.

Treasures From Our Tradition

Apart from the period from Thanksgiving through Christmas, the summer is a favored time for family reunions. We trace family trees and recall our origins. Worship has a family tree as well, and the way we celebrate today has been influenced by various styles and customs through the centuries. We are Western Christians of the Latin Rite. By far, we are the most numerous Western Christians, but there are other ritual families as well. The Archdiocese of Milan in Italy follows the Ambrosian Rite, Toledo in Spain preserves the Mozarabic Rite and the Arab language, and Lyons in France is home to the Gallican Rite. Other liturgical families, such as the Celtic in Ireland and the Sarum in England, faded away after the Reformation. Until recent times, members of some ancient religious orders such as Carmelites and Trappists followed a pattern of Mass that varied slightly from the plan observed in Latin Rite parishes.

Isn't the Catholic Church the same everywhere? Not at all. It never has been! The existence of so many liturgical families in the West reminds us that unity, not uniformity, is what the Church seeks to achieve among her children. We are united in faith, but wonderfully diverse in rituals, ceremonies, languages, customs, and spirituality.

Living the Faith

Reverence for the Name of God

Everyone's name is important. We honor the dignity of persons by using their names with respect. Surely we will honor each other's names if we acquire a habitual reverence for God's name. Reverencing the name of God honors him. This is the beginning of treating each other with the respect for a dignity that is based on our being created as an image of God.

Scripture highlights numerous ways in which God's name is vital for our faith life. When Job was in the midst of his worst sufferings, he said, "The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; / blessed be the name of the Lord" (Jb 1:21). God's name sustained him in his suffering. When the psalmist wanted to express exultant praise of God and thanksgiving for favors received, the holy name was invoked, "Bless the Lord, my soul; / all my being, bless his holy name" (Ps 103:1).

Jesus taught that he would be present to those who come together in his name, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt 18:20). St. Peter staked his entire ministry on the utter uniqueness of Jesus, the only Savior, by employing the power of his name: "There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved" (Acts 4:12). St. Paul proclaimed that the name of Christ is an occasion for the adoration of the Son of God:

God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth. (Phil 2:9-10)

When the Blessed Virgin Mary praised God for calling her to be the Mother of his Son, she chanted, "Holy is his name" (Lk 1:49). All of these sublime tributes to God's name enliven our faith and love for God. They provide us with the context to understand the meaning of the Second Commandment.

This is a good time for people of faith to witness their love for God's name by appealing to those who err in this regard to reconsider what they say and appreciate how it affects others. Those who are involved in preaching and catechizing should always remember to model and encourage adoration. In order to be examples to society, believers themselves need to be temperate in the use of their tongues.


Using Our Time Wisely

A jar of honey lasts practically forever. The oldest jar of honey ever discovered was over five thousand years old. Honey is quite different from market-fresh produce, then; because most fruits and vegetables last only a few days, we treat them carefully. At this time of summer, we rush to find recipes for cherries and cucumbers so we won't waste a single one. We wouldn't feel that same urgency about honey.

In our own way, we are as delightful and fragile as ripe produce. Today's readings urge us not to spoil, but to make good use of our limited time on earth. Ecclesiastes reminds us that because God provides for us now and always, we can manage our daily affairs without anxiety. Saint Paul encourages the Colossians to keep thoughts of heaven in everything they do, and Jesus himself asks us to treasure not earthly wealth, but God alone.

Do we spend money on articles that make us better ambassadors of Christ? Does our personal lifestyle bring "good news to the poor" (Luke 4:18)?

The school's tuition deficit exists because our school's budgeted breakeven point is 485 students and current enrollment is 350. This creates a defi-


cit gap of 135 students. Our campaign is raising funds to cover this gap while the school works diligently to increase enrollment.

Children's Faith Formation (age 3 – grade 8)

We offer formation classes for children preparing for First Eucharist, Baptism (older than age 7), Continuing Formation (after receiving the sacraments), and the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program for children ages 3 to 5 (entering kindergarten).

The 2019-2020 season starts the week of September 17.

Classes: Tuesdays and Thursdays

Times: 4:30 p.m. to 5:40 p.m.
and 6:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m.

Requirements:

- Parents or guardians are registered members of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish or a Catholic Parish in the Las Vegas Diocese. Regular attendance at Sunday Liturgy is part of the formation process.
- Registration fee is \$150.00 per child. No child will be turned away due to financial difficulty.
- Families must provide a Birth and Baptism Certificate and deposit at the time of registration. Sacrament preparation at SEAS is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and the parent throughout the formation years.

Sacraments:

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a two-year process for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason (7 years), are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil in their second year of preparation.

First Eucharist Initiation:

The two-year preparation process to celebrate First Eucharist teaches children about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The child and the parent will participate in retreats in their second year.

Continuing Formation:

Children in 3rd grade and higher who are baptized and have received First Eucharist will continue their formation in age appropriate classes. It is the practice of our faith that formation is ongoing and is a life-long journey.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):

This is a hands-on, interactive working environment where children are guided toward a greater understanding of God's love in their life. They encounter Jesus the Good Shepherd, who loves them, cares for them and knows them by name. Children are most sensitive to a relationship with God between the ages of 3-6. For this reason, we provide formal faith formation for young children.






