

## Saint of the Week

Basil the Great 329 - 379 Memorial - Jan. 2

Born in Caesarea, capital of Cappadocia (central Turkey), Basil studied rhetoric there and in Con-

stantinople and Athens. He was baptized with his friend, St. Gregory Nazianzen, about 358 and ordained around 365. After being chosen bishop of Caesarea in 370, he championed the faith defined at the Council of Nicaea and refuted the Arian heresy. Many of his homilies and treatises are extant, and the monastic Rule of St. Basil is still observed in the Eastern Church. He is revered as a Doctor of the Church.

On his feast day, remember St. Basil said, "Do everything possible to make yourself worthy of the Kingdom. Do not disdain the invitation you have received" (St. Basil the Great, *Exhortation to Baptism*, 7-8, as quoted in *Advent and Christmas with the Church Fathers* [2010], 33).

"St. Basil, in a much-quoted homily, once declared that the bread we clutch in our hands belongs to the starving, the cloak we keep locked in our closet belongs to the naked, the shoes we are not using belong to the barefooted. In these ways in the post-biblical age Christians strove to keep a religious perspective on their use of material things."

The scriptures offer instruction and encouragement on how to share—within our families, parish families and the wider human family—the love that God shares with us in Jesus. Selections from Sirach, Psalm 128 and Colossians encourage us to reflect divine love and thus find holiness in all our human relationships. The reading from Matthew's Gospel offers a living example of love in the actions Joseph took to protect his young family from danger and to nurture them within the larger family of faith of their time.

### Life-Giving Love in a Violent World

Mother Teresa often said that abortion was the greatest threat to peace in the world. Wherever there is violence against life, whether it be physical, psychological or emotional violence, there can never be true peace.

Loss of respect for life increases the cycle of violence in society. Every time an abortion happens, there are two victims of violence: the baby and the mother. The promotion of euthanasia and physician-assisted suicide supports the idea that the lives of the elderly and sick are "not worth living." This idea, along with a culture that places a priority on personal gratification over helping those in need, encourages those who are younger to view elderly people as burdens, placing them at greater risk for abuse and neglect.

Respect for life is fostered in families, most particularly in a person's childhood experiences and formative years. How important it is to educate children and young people from an early age about their personal dignity, and to awaken in them sensitivity for the dignity of others! One need only look on the typical school playground to see children who are ridiculed, bullied or shunned by stronger or more popular children, either because they have special needs, uncommon physical characteristics or other attributes. Sometimes these children experience the bullying and shunning of others even into adulthood, and

then the bullied victims sometimes respond in violent or inappropriate ways in their local communities.

In contrast to the violence of the anti-life mentality, respect for life builds peace. Respect for life comes from acknowledging the dignity of each human being. It is rooted in love, which each of us needs to live. A person without love is at war with himself and the world, causing violence and divisions in the most intimate relationships and extending to the wider society. Love affirms the profound respect and God-given dignity of each person.

In his 2013 Message on the World Day of Peace on January 1, Pope Benedict XVI highlighted the importance of respect for life for peace in the world:

"The path to the attainment of the common good and to peace is above all that of respect for human life in all its many aspects, beginning with its conception, through its development and up to its natural end. True peacemakers, then, are those who love, defend and promote human life in all its dimensions, personal, communitarian and transcendent. Life in its fullness is the height of peace. Anyone who loves peace cannot tolerate attacks and crimes against life."

Disregard for human life - in whatever form this may take - does not make the world more "convenient" or "free." Instead of solving problems, it only causes more pain and division in society. All of us, whatever our calling, can contribute to promoting a culture of life through our own personal daily witness, radiating Christ's love by upholding respect for others. When you help another person discover his own dignity, you are helping to build a more peaceful world, one life at a time.

### 10 Tips on Dialogue from Pope Francis

In *Amoris Laetitia*, Pope Francis calls dialogue "essential" for family life. His guidelines on dialogue are easily applicable to civil society as well.

Can you imagine how this election cycle might be different if we challenged ourselves, candidates, political parties, commentators and others to follow Pope Francis' advice?

- Recognize the real "importance" and dignity of the other person. Recognize others' right "to think as they do and to be happy."
   Pope Francis challenges us to acknowledge the values of the other's "deepest concerns" and what he or she is trying to say (no. 138).
- Try to understand where the other person is coming from: his or her pain, disappointments, fear, anger, hopes and dreams (no. 137).
- Put yourself in the other's "shoes"; try to "peer" into his or her heart. This is the starting point for dialogue (no. 138).
- Be ready to "listen patiently and attentively to everything the other person wants to say." Dialogue requires the "self-discipline" of waiting until someone is finished speaking before responding. And, it means truly listening to what someone else is saying—not planning a

comeback before the other person has even finished speaking (no. 137).

- "Keep an open mind." We need not stick to our own "limited ideas and opinions," but we must "be prepared to change or expand them." Our goal is "synthesis" that enriches everyone involved in the dialogue. We don't seek unity in diversity, Pope Francis says, but rather "reconciled diversity" (no. 139).
- Our goal is to advance the common good.
   Respect and appreciation for the "other" are necessary prerequisites (no. 139).
- Try not to offend, and don't vent. We must choose our words carefully, be sensitive to how others feel and never seek to inflict hurt. We must also avoid a "patronizing" tone, which "only serves to hurt, ridicule, accuse and offend others" (no. 139).
- Love everyone. "Love," Pope Francis writes, "surmounts even the worst barriers." When we come from a place of love, we can better understand others (no. 140).
- Base positions on beliefs and values, not on the desire to "win" an argument or be "proved right" (no. 140).
- Pray! True dialogue, Pope Francis reminds us, "can only be the fruit of an interior richness" nourished by our quiet time with God through reading, reflection, prayer and "openness to the world around us" (no. 141).
- These are challenging words from Pope Francis. How might our own families be different if we took his words to heart? Our parishes? Our neighborhoods? Ourselves? Our society? The current election cycle? Pope Francis' vision is a vision of joy-filled love. Let's share it!

## Being Good Stewards of Our Personal Vocations

To commit ourselves to live as disciples who steward our many gifts and blessings involves every facet of our lives. We will experience God's call differently in distinct moments of our lives. At times, we may recognize the call to give our time sacrificially; at other times, our treasure. In some moments, we may discern a call to active service among the poor, ill or imprisoned; in other moments, our stewardship may be of prayer or the sharing of faith. In all of these times and circumstances, we follow Jesus Christ, and learn to embrace his way of self-giving love.

The young creature in the stall of Bethlehem was a human being with human brain and heart and soul. And it was God. Its life was to manifest the will of the Father; to proclaim the sacred tidings, to stir mankind with the power of God, to establish the Covenant and shoulder the sin of the world, expiating it with love and leading mankind through the destruction of sacrifice and the victory of the Resurrection into the new existence of grace. In this accomplishment alone lay Jesus' self-perfection: fulfillment of mission and personal fulfillment were one (Romano Guardini, quoted in *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, p. 23).

We are all called to discern and live out our vocation, the life vocation that each of us has, and the many calls we experience as followers of Jesus. Another way of saying this is to recognize that liv-

In today's second reading we listen to one of the most compelling exhortations for Christian living: "Whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Col 3:17). "Whatever you do"---that means the whole of life is to be related to Christ Jesus. Everything in life, every activity, can become an act of glorifying the Lord. Good stewards commit even their daily routine to Christ: doing everything "in the name of the Lord." Perhaps it would be a good idea this week to memorize this marvelous verse and repeat it to yourself frequently. Make it part of your morning prayer each day.


