

A Letter from Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

SOLEMNITY OF MARY'S IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

This year since December 8th falls on the 2nd Sunday of Advent, two things are important to note:

One. Mary will not outshine her son. Therefore, because the Solemnity of Mary's Immaculate Conception falls on a Sunday, this Holy Day of Obligation gives way to the 2nd Sunday of Advent as we continue our Advent season.

Two. Because this solemnity falls on a Sunday of Advent, this year the Solemnity of Mary's Immaculate Conception has been transferred to Monday, December 9th. Therefore, **this year the Solemnity of Mary's Immaculate Conception is not a holy day of obligation**. We will, nonetheless, celebrate Monday Morning's 8AM Mass honoring Mary's Immaculate Conception.

In our recent RCIA process, I taught the session entitled, "Mary and the Saints, and Holy Days too!" The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, I explained, almost always causes some confusion. Some still erroneously think that this Holy Day celebrates Jesus' virginal conception in Mary's womb. Sorry, but that's the Feast of the Annunciation which is celebrated on March 25th, which is 9 months before Christmas! The Annunciation is the feast of Jesus' virginal and miraculous conception in the womb of Mary through the power of the Holy Spirit! It's intentional that the Church has placed the celebration of Jesus' virginal conception at the Annunciation (March 25th) exactly 9 months before Christmas (December 25th).

So, what we celebrate on December 8th, is **Mary's Immaculate Conception in the womb of her mother, Anna**. Joachim and Anna (Mary's parents and Jesus' grandparents), while celebrating their love for each other, conceived Mary in the womb of Anna. We believe that Mary, in order to be a pure vessel to bring forth Jesus, would need to be freed from original sin at the very beginning of her life, therefore, her conception was immaculate! The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception celebrates this dogma of our faith (*Ineffabillis Deus*) which was proclaimed by Pope Pius IX on December 8, 1854, 165 years ago. It states:

"We declare, pronounce, and define that the doctrine which holds that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin, is a doctrine revealed by God and therefore to be believed firmly and constantly by all the faithful."

Four years later on March 25, 1858, (interestingly on the Feast of the Annunciation: Jesus' virginal conception in the womb of Mary), Our Blessed Mother revealed in her 16th apparition to St. Bernadette of Lourdes, that she, indeed, is the "Immaculate Conception." St. Bernadette, when she repeated this to her parish priest as a young teen, had no idea what that meant. This was Mary's way of affirming, through the apparition to St. Bernadette, what the Church had already proclaimed just four years earlier.

The proclamation of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception proves that the Church doesn't move quickly. It took over 1800 years from the reality of Mary's Immaculate Conception to formally proclaim it a dogma worthy of belief. Let us continue to practice patience, especially when some may think the Church should be moving faster than she does. Remember, God is in charge, and the gift of our faith is all we really need to move forward in proclaiming God's unconditional love, and practicing it in our own lives as well. To that end, may we let our Blessed Mother help us on our journey!



Isaiah's disillusionment with the kings of his own day led him to envision an ideal king who would rule with divine approval and be led by divine wisdom. For centuries the Jewish people anticipated the arrival of that Messiah, who would usher in a blessed age when the whole world would finally dwell in justice and peace.

After centuries of such growing expectation, the preaching of John the Baptist about the imminent arrival of the Messiah could not help but provoke intense interest. The Baptist's message about preparation for "the one who is coming" (Matthew 3:11) makes clear that Jesus is, in fact, the long-awaited one who is ushering in the new age foretold by Isaiah and all the prophets.

Saint of the Week

Lucy, Virgin & Martyr Feast Day - Dec. 13 c. 284 - 304

This saint, venerated by Christians since her own time, likely was martyred in Sicily, probably during the perse-

cutions of Roman Emperor Diocletian, who ruled 284-305. Legends about Lucy include a rejected suitor denouncing her as a Christian and miracles that saved her from life in a brothel, from being burned at the stake and from having her eyes plucked out. Another legend says she bled to death after her throat was cut. Lucy, whose name suggests light, is among the saints listed in the canon of the Mass; she is the patron saint of electricians and ophthalmologists, and Christians pray for her intercession regarding diseases of the eyes.

"Lucy reminds us of a value which seems to me very important for you too: courage. She was a young defenseless woman, however she faced torture and a violent death with great courage, a courage that came to her from the Risen Christ, with whom she was united, and from the Holy Spirit, who dwelt within her... Lucy tells us that life is made to be given. She lived this out in the supreme form of martyrdom, but the value of the gift of self is universal; it is the secret to true happiness. Be a Good Steward of the Advent and Christmas Seasons

December is such a busy time of year, and a month that tempts us to lose sight of the profound spiritual importance of the Advent and Christmas seasons. The best way to stay focused on the coming of Jesus Christ is to be good stewards of his presence in our daily lives. Here are simple ways to exercise good stewardship of this sacred time of year.

- Give God a very special gift this year: Let this gift be something personal that no one else needs to know about, and let it be a sacrifice. Perhaps your gift will be to commit to spending more time with God daily. Perhaps there is a habit you know you should give up. Why wait for a New Year's resolution? Start now.
- Celebrate the season of Advent: Light the Advent wreath candles each night before dinner. If you have children, let them offer their own prayers to the Christ child for whom we are waiting.
- Set aside a special time to read the Christmas story in the Gospel of Saint Luke 1:5-56 through 2:1-20: Consider reading this account with your family and discussing it together.
- Put a crèche up in your home at the beginning of Advent: Consider having one set that is "kid-proof" which your children are allowed to handle. Kids love to make the Nativity story their own, and they especially love the angels!
- Plan a project to help someone this Christmas: Identify someone with a genuine need, involve your whole family and see how happy

you can make someone this Christmas. Participate in your parish Adopt-a-Family program or call Catholic Charities or another charity and find a family through their programs. Make sure your children take part in shopping for a family who needs extra help and make them aware of the needs in your community.

- Take a group Christmas caroling to a nursing home or a children's hospital: Get people together. Make it festive. Bring the gifts of your joyful smiles and voices to those who may need these gifts.
- Give a surprise gift of service to each member of your family: The idea of giving an unexpected gift of service to members of your family reveals your own love and concern for them. You might consider giving your spouse a day away, running an errand for your brother or cleaning out a closet for your mother. Make it personal and meaningful.
- Send Christmas cards and thank you notes that convey a spiritual message: This is an easy way to share your faith during the Advent season. Don't just sign your name! Include a personal message with each card. Set aside some time after Christmas Day to write thank you notes and help your children to write thank you notes for the gifts they receive. This is a wonderful habit for a lifetime, and a good way to foster a steward's gratitude for all gifts.
- Write a Christmas letter to someone far away such as someone in the service, or perhaps someone working or ministering in a foreign country: It has been said that receiving a letter when you are far away from home is like opening a priceless gift on Christmas morning, no matter what day of the year. Many people are unable to travel home for the holidays, so it can be a very lonely time for them. Write a special Christmas letter to someone of your choice.
- Attend Christmas Mass together with your family: December 25 falls on Wednesday this year so make sure you are present at the Table of the Lord. If you are alone this Christmas or don't have family living near you, invite a friend or a neighbor to join you.






