



Kujenga Means to Build (Swahili)

Kujenga leadership retreats develop strong African American Catholic youth leaders in dioceses around the country. In the Diocese of Birmingham, Kujenga is incorporated into Confirmation formation during Lent. It has been instrumental for healing the young church in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina. While some dioceses maintained a continuous program, others rebooted Kujenga after a hiatus through the commitment of Kujengans (alums) who went to college, established careers and families, but never forgot the transformative encounter they had as teenagers.

Several alums like Thomessia Moore-Lawson became seasoned youth ministers and leaders in their parishes and communities. As she recalled, "Kujenga was a magical once-in-a-lifetime experience. We participated in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Mass (with drums); wore African headdress, had African poetry and healthy conversation about the Church's positions on race relations. We also learned about influential African American Catholics. We were an elite group of proud Catholic African Americans who discussed how to defend our faith — armed with knowledge of who we were, where we came from and to whom we belonged."

Kujengan Shaniqua Wilson from the Diocese of Brooklyn, formerly from Rockville Centre, recalls that through Kujenga she traveled to Rome. She met Sr. Thea Bowman FSPA, Most Reverend Emerson Moore, who confirmed her, and twin priests Charles and Chester Smith as seminarians.

Begun in Chicago in the 1970s as the vision of Fr. Martin Carter SA (Franciscan Friar of the Atonement), today many desire to update and bring the Kujenga experience to a national platform. James Watts, Director of Black Catholic Ministry in Birmingham is proud of alums who became leaders in the movement and continue serving the diocese well. He beams as they pass the torch to the next generation.

Stepping outside comfort zones to spend days in a rustic environment, youth from different geographic areas meet at the intersection of Catholic Faith and African American culture. Here they enjoy enriching activities, impressive talks and bonding with other youth. The testimony of Kujenga is that emerging leaders gain confidence to accept new roles as servant leaders wherever they land. Think of Kujenga as Christ Kwanzaa year-round.

Fact of Faith

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

In many Catholic parishes at this time of year, groups of people are gathering to begin the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). This is the formal process through which adults become members of the Catholic Church.

In most places, the majority of new Catholics are children born and raised in the faith. They learn about Catholic Christianity from their parents. But for someone interested in Catholicism later in life, the Church has a lengthy process of initiation that uses the initials RCIA, Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The RCIA process is much more than just a series of classes in Catholic belief and doctrine. It's more a journey of faith which asks its participants to pray, reflect and grow into a relationship with Christ and his Church.

After a period of inquiry, which may include formal classroom instruction, inquirers are formally recognized as people on the way to initiation and are accepted as catechumens. This process and terminology mirrors the initiation process used by the Church in its first few centuries.

The catechumens continue their study and reflection and are often "dismissed" from Sunday worship so that they can pray and reflect on the scriptures together. In the Spring, the season of Lent becomes a time of particularly intense formation for the catechumens, who are now called the "Elect." Their journey culminates in the celebration of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Their integration into the community of faith continues after Easter, during a time that goes by the arcane name of "mystagogia."

Through all of this process, adults seeking initiation into the church are doing much more than classroom learning. They are developing in mind, heart and spirit, seeking God's presence in their lives, at the same time as he is calling them forward. Saints of the Week

Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto

Jacinta: 1910— Feb. 20, 1920

Francisco: 1908— April 14, 1919

Two of the three Fati-

ma visionaries, this sister and brother along with their cousin, Lucia dos Santos, had monthly visions of Mary at Fatima, Portugal, from May to October 1917. Mary asked the shepherd children to promote devotion to her Immaculate Heart and pray the rosary daily. Both Martos died of influenza, Francisco at age 10 in 1919, and Jacinta at age 9 in 1920. Their cousin, who became a Carmelite nun, died in 2005 at age 97. Fatima is among the world's great Marian shrines and pilgrimage sites. On May 13, 2000, both Francisco and Jacinta were beatified. Pope Francis canonized the siblings and on May 13, 2017, on the 100th Anniversary of Fatima, Francisco and Jacinta are the first child saints who are not martyrs in the history of the Church.

One night his father heard him sobbing and asked him why he was crying; his son answered: "I was thinking of Jesus who is so sad because of the sins that are committed against him." He was motivated by one desire—so expressive of how children think—"to console Jesus and make him happy."

the Lord due payment as an inheritance; be servants of the Lord Christ" (Col 3:23-24). Founded upon this scriptural stewardship principle, I invite you to participate generously in this Jubilee Year Catholic Stewardship Appeal as good and faithful Catholic stewards.

The stewardship which we practice in the Diocese assists the Church, her ministries and her apostolates in a variety of ways. Among our shared blessings are those apportioned as follows:

Vocations - 28% of Stewardship

Without the Priesthood there is no Eucharist; without the Eucharist there is no Church. This thought moves us to be generous stewards helping form and educate our seminarians for priestly service in our Diocese. With 10 men now in seminary formation (pictured below) and a growing number discerning the call, this is a great undertaking. Your stewardship is what makes it possible.

Continuing Education of Clergy and Priests Pension Assistance – 23% of Stewardship

Good stewardship helps our priests to continue to be fruitful in their ministry to us, and helps fund the diocesan priests' pensions for those spiritual Fathers who served us so faithfully.

Catholic schools are hidden treasures in our Diocese and its parishes; these schools help form our youth in the way of Christ. Our stewardship helps ensure the highest faith and education standards for our Catholic schools.



O Holy Family of Nazareth, O Glorious Princes of the Apostles, help make us good Stewards of the Faith.

Our 25th Anniversary Silver Jubilee goal for 2020 is \$3,200,000. Every parish in the Diocese shares in this goal based on its offertory income.



Last weekend through a video message, Bishop Thomas spoke of the importance of this stewardship appeal in the life of the Church, offering testimony to the power of faith in action.



There is a two-fold blessing in this stewardship. Once a parish has reached its goal, all funds raised above and beyond that goal are rebated to the parish, 100%, for parish projects. Stewardship: Living the Beatitudes

Three weekends in our February liturgical calendar will turn our attention to Jesus' teachings in the Gospel of Matthew explaining what is to be expected of those who choose to follow him. This is the familiar Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5:1 – 7:29), the most quoted part of the Bible. Jesus' sermon begins with messages of comfort, the Beatitudes (Matt. 5:3-12).

- Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.
- Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.
- Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.
- Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you (falsely) because of me.
- Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.

The word "Beatitude" refers to a state of deep happiness or joy. But these sayings are paradoxes. They turn our normal expectations upside down. Jesus is bringing us a new law, new expectations on how to live. He is bringing forth the Kingdom of God. As the United States bishops write in their pastoral letter, "Jesus does not waste time proposing lofty but unrealistic ideals; he tells his followers how they are expected to live. The Beatitudes and the rest of the Sermon on the Mount prescribe the lifestyle of a Christian disciple."

Each of these "blesseds" is a statement about an important aspect in how we exercise stewardship of our lives. Each of them offers us an ideal of how to live and how we find God living within us. Learn the Beatitudes, memorize them, make them part of your daily prayer life, and ask the Lord for the wisdom and strength to follow this stewardship way of life, a path that follows in the footsteps of Jesus.

Friday: March 13 at 7:00 p.m.






