



Blessed

When we think of the word "Beatitude" we think of today's discourse from Luke's Gospel, or the more familiar one from Matthew (which begins "Blessed are the poor in spirit . . . "). Actually, beatitudes occur throughout the prophets and Gospels. Today in Jeremiah (with an echo in the psalm) we hear. "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord" (Jeremiah 17:7). Following his resurrection in John's Gospel, Christ proclaims, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29). The evangelists placed these sayings throughout the Gospels as short reminders about the characteristics that one will find in a follower of Christ, characteristics that will help spread the Good News in this life and lead to eternal blessings in the next. In Latin, the saints are called the Beati, the "Blessed," for they are the ones who lived the "blessed" life as described by Jesus throughout the Gospels. How blest are we, when we also strive to make our own days a living beatitude!

Treasures From Our Tradition

In recent years, there has been remarkable progress in drawing persons with disabilities into full celebration. Now it is generally accepted that worship places need accommodations such as ramps or elevators, large-print materials for those who are sight-impaired, and perhaps even an assisted hearing system or signing in American Sign Language. American Sign Language is not merely English translated into movement, but a distinct language with its own grammar, syntax (word order), and vocabulary. For this reason, the American Catholic bishops have approved American Sign Language (ASL) as an official language of the liturgy.

Celebrating liturgy in our own language (the vernacular) means that liturgy must be accessible to all languages and cultures. The fact that Mass is celebrated this weekend in some places in total silence, but with the full participation of deaf people praising God in the movements of their hands, and sometimes even with a priest who is deaf, is nothing less than the Church being faithful to the image of Jesus, who made the deaf hear and the mute speak. Remember too that deafness is an invisible disability, and that there may well be people in your parish who are quietly yearning for Mass to be signed for them in ASL.


Saint of the Week

Polycarp C. 69-c.156 Feast Day—February 23

This disciple of St. John the Apostle was appointed bishop of Smyrna (now Izmir, Turkey), perhaps by John. Representing the Asia Minor churches, he went to Rome about 155 to discuss when to celebrate Easter. The result was that the Eastern and Western churches continued to calculate the date as before. Shortly after his return, Polycarp was arrested and urged to renounce God. He refused and was sentenced to be burned alive. When the flames did not harm him, he was killed by a sword, as recounted in an early Christian document.



Salt and Light

What is the Bible Notion of Justice?

Two examples should help clarify how the Old Testament understands justice.

1. In Exodus 22:22-23, God commands, "You shall not oppress any widow or orphan; if you do oppress them, when they cry out to me I will surely hear their cry."

In a society where individuals depended on their tribe and clan to defend their rights, a widow, who always came from another clan, had no one committed to her defense. All the more was that true of many orphans.

God insists that all of Israel must protect the weak and helpless; otherwise God will do it personally -- and hold them to account for their failure to do so.

2. In Amos 5:23-24, the prophet warns, "Remove from me the noise of your hymns, and I will not listen to the music of your harps; instead let justice pour forth like a spring and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream."

Here the prophet holds that all our formal worship is useless if we do not practice two essential qualities: justice and righteousness. "Mishpat," the word for "justice," generally means the protection of another's legal rights. "Righteousness," "sedeqah," describes being right with God in obedient faithful-

ness. In God's covenant, you cannot have one without the other.

The message of both texts together captures the essence of countless passages in the Pentateuch, the prophets and the Psalms that denounce corrupt officials, economic exploitation, cheating in business, taking advantage of the weak, forsaking God's ways and false-hearted worship.

The key to all these passages is that justice is rooted in a right relationship. The core concern for the poor and the weak, and the insistence that righteousness be combined with just actions stems from the conviction that God cares about the poor and those treated unfairly, and that God always acts justly himself.

To Israel, justice meant maintaining a faithful relationship with God by obedience to his Torah and commandments, and by imitating his love, which reached down equally and fairly to all people. In turn, both society and each individual must treat every person with dignity, respect and concern.

When we turn to the New Testament, we can see immediately how Jesus maintained that sense of justice and acted on it through his teaching and healing miracles for the outcast and poor, by his own humility and humiliation, and by his choice of the least as his disciples.

There is not as much direct accusation of injustice in the New Testament as in the Old, but the demands for right behavior built upon the right relationship with God in Christ, become even more passionate (see the great judgment scene of Matthew 25:31-46).


Paul constantly reminds his converts that they are "in Christ" or "in his Spirit" (Romans 8:9-11; 12:5). And John concludes that the Gospel of Justice is simply to love one another as Christ has loved us! (1 John 23:23-24)

The Sermon on the Plain: A Call to Conversion

The message Jesus delivers in the Gospel reading on this Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time is a difficult one for many to swallow. It is one of those Bible teachings meant to "comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable." The Gospel reading is Jesus' "Sermon on the Plain" and in it we can see how skillfully the writer, Saint Luke, brings us to a place where we must take the words of Jesus with the utmost seriousness (Luke 6:17, 20-26).

While Saint Matthew, in his Gospel, begins the "Sermon on the Mount" with eight beatitudes (Matthew 5:3-12). Luke's Jesus begins the Sermon on the Plain with just four beatitudes, "blessings," and four woes. Jesus suggests that there exists a divide between the "blessed" and the "woeful." It is, however, not the divide that our world would create between winners and losers or the successful and unsuccessful. The blessed may be poor or hungry or weeping or hated. But they are blessed by their faith and trust in God's mercy and justice and future for them in the kingdom of heaven. To be "blessed" does not mean an absence of struggle. Indeed, to be in a Eucharistic community that lives the Gospel invites exclusion, defamation and even hatred. To be blessed is to live through such opposition aware that the struggle is temporary and that "your reward is great in heaven."

The woeful, on the other hand, are those who have grown comfortable and smug. They may not

experience discomfort during this life. But their relative abundance, plentiful tables and good times now will place their future in jeopardy. To live under the verdict of "woe" means condemnation.

Notably, Jesus does not ask his listeners to become destitute in order to join the "blessed," but given the options he presents, it is undeniable that he expects a response that reaches out to others and involves sacrifice. Later in Luke's Gospel we will meet characters such as Zacchaeus and the Good Samaritan, individuals who were depicted by Luke as willing to put ample material resources at the service of others.

The Sermon on the Plain is challenging. It means to take us out of our "comfort zone" and into a conversion of heart, a change of attitude, a change of vision, and a change in behavior. It is a call for courageous acts of discipleship, a call to use the gifts we have been given to serve others, even strangers. It is a call urging us to take action now so the world will feel the presence of Christ. The Sermon on the Plain is the Lord Jesus calling us: "Come. Follow me."

A Stewardship Moment

The Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The prophet Jeremiah minces no words in today's first reading: "Thus says the LORD: Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings ... whose heart turns away from the LORD." And the prophet's "beatitude" resembles that of Jesus' teaching in today's Gospel reading when he proclaims: "Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD. whose hope is the LORD." Good stewards understand that what the world values is not consistent with Gospel values. They realize that God has placed in their midst all the gifts, charisms, and resources needed to bring Christ to a world desperately in need of his loving presence. But to exercise good stewardship over God's gifts takes a great deal of trust. How does our stewardship reflect our trust in the Lord? What did we do today to give others hope in Christ Jesus?

In this year's Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA), we are reminded of our call to reflect the light of Christ. The ministries the campaign funds allow us to reflect Christ's light in many ways...

Vocations and Education and Care of Priests (51% of the total CSA budget)

We see the light of Christ shine on those who are studying and discerning the call to become priests. This journey takes at least four years after completing a BA in college. In supporting CSA, you give 28 cents of every dollar to promote vocations and pay for seminary formation.

As those who are priests continue in ministry, the need to help with ongoing education as well as the need to assist with the funding of diocesan priests' pensions is another way in which the light of Christ shines through our stewardship. In supporting

CSA, you give 23 cents of every dollar to assist in the ongoing education of our priests and helping to fund retirement in their old age.

Faith Formation (18% of the total CSA budget)

In Faith Formation, Youth Ministry and Hispanic Catechesis the light of Christ is shown through the training and empowerment of religious education leaders throughout the diocese in both the English and Spanish languages. This includes leaders who serve all ages, from the very young, to those in youth ministry through adult faith formation. Eighteen cents of every dollar you give to CSA allows the light of Christ to shine through these efforts.

Campus Ministry at UNLV (10% of total CSA Budget)

Bringing the light of Christ to those who are involved at UNLV is a way in which the lives of those who are continuing higher education are served by the Catholic Church with campus ministry.

Pastoral Outreach (15% of the CSA Budget)

There are a host of programs that seek to bring the light of Christ into our community. Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada and the St. Therese Center provide direct service to the poor and needy; our Social Ministry brings to light Catholic teachings and opportunities for advocacy; Victim Assistance brings resources for healing to those who have been abused; the televised Catholic Mass on Sunday mornings brings the presence of the church and the light of the Gospel to those who are sick or homebound; our diocesan website serves the local community as well as tourists who visit the Las Vegas valley by connecting them to the activity of our local church.

Leadership and oversight of Catholic Education (6% of the CSA Budget)

In our Catholic schools, the Department of Catholic Education helps to insure high standards are met in the education of students in this system. Six cents of every dollar you give to CSA helps the light of Christ to shine in our schools.






