## A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends,

As you know, our 2019 Catholic Stewardship Appeal is underway. To all who have prayerfully and generously made a pledge in support of this appeal, thank you. Every CSA pledge, no matter what the size, is valued and appreciated. If you have not done so yet, you are invited to make a pledge and return your pledge envelope in the collection basket. As Jesus' disciples we are called to help our brothers and sisters in faith. There is no better way to do so than through the Catholic Stewardship Appeal.

In less than 2 weeks, we will begin our journey through the season of Lent—a season that prepares us to celebrate Easter. On Easter we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The Paschal Mystery of Christ's rising from the dead is so deep that the Church invites us to six weeks of preparation before we fully celebrate it.

For those preparing for baptism and other Easter sacraments, Lent is a time of intense spiritual preparation. During the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, they will celebrate baptism and enter the paschal mystery of Christ's dying and rising. The prayers of this season help scrutinize and purify their intentions, removing whatever might block their commitment, and strengthening their resolve.

For the faithful, Lent is a time of penitential practices and spiritual discipline. During this time, we acknowledge our sins and seek God's help to overcome them. Traditionally, we engage in the three pillars of lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These three actions show our dependence on God, our renunciation of the fascinations of this world, and our desire to better the lives of others.

As we embark on our Lenten journey, it is important to plan ahead and give thought and prayer to what will draw us closer to Jesus this Easter. We will all greet Lent with the best of intentions. But sometimes, we reach Easter disappointed in our own efforts. Here are some suggestions for keeping us on task during this time of preparation:

- Plan ahead. Write the dates of our parish mission and Lenten devotions on your calendar. You'll find detailed information about our parish Lenten activities on pages 16 and 17.
- Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the pillars of






### Do No Harm

We listen quite a while before we get to the “punch line” of the first reading today: even though it would be an easy thing to do, David will not harm the anointed one of the Lord. We, of course, know that Jesus is the Messiah, the anointed one of God, but the Bible uses this term for many different people. It is scripture’s way of indicating who has been chosen by God for a special place and mission in salvation history.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus presents a greatly enlarged list of those who, as children of God, we should not harm, but love instead: our enemies, those who curse us or do us harm, those who owe us money, the ungrateful, the wicked. The point of Jesus’ teaching is not to encourage these kinds of behaviors in others, but rather to form us in the image of our heavenly Father by increasing our opportunities to love unconditionally, expecting no return; to be merciful and forgiving, even when it would be easier not to.

### Treasures From Our Tradition


When the Roman Empire turned a favorable eye toward the once-persecuted Christians, among the effects was a population explosion in the baptismal font, as Christian sympathizers stepped from the shadows. With more and more people becoming Christians, laws were passed to protect Sunday as a work-free day. Soon, it became possible to celebrate Mass later in the morning, rather than the older custom of gathering before dawn to celebrate Eucharist. Amazingly, despite the increasing numbers of Christians, there was great resistance to adding to the number of worship events; the Eucharist that began as a few friends around a table soon was transformed into a more formal event with throngs crowding a large hall. All the Christians in a city or town would gather around the bishop for the one Sunday Eucharist, and only when the crowds became unmanageable was there an impulse to divide the assembly by splitting off a new bishop and flock.

Now, sixteen hundred years later, many parishes see a need to trim or combine Mass schedules. This is often seen as tough surgery. Yet, our forebears in the faith would see it as a gain: a filling up of the Eucharist with a large and vigorous assembly, a fullness of ministry, an opportunity to make the Church more fully visible and stronger for service.



### Saint of the Week

**Sr. Thea Bowman**  
1937—1990  
No feast day

*At the time of publication of this article from USCCB in 2019, Sr. Thea Bowman was not a saint. The U.S. bishops voted in November 2018 to advance her cause for canonization on the diocesan level.*

Sr. Thea Bowman was a self-proclaimed “old-folks’ child,” as her parents, Dr. Theon Bowman and Mary Esther Bowman were middle-aged at the time of her birth. Born Bertha Elizabeth Bowman and raised in Canton, Mississippi, Bowman was exposed early to the richness of her African-American culture and spirituality, most especially the history, stories, songs, prayers, customs and traditions. She converted to Catholicism at age 15 and joined the Sisters of Perpetual Adoration, taking the name “Sister Mary Thea” in honor of the Blessed Mother and her father, Theon. Thea, her name in religious life, literally means “God.”

Throughout her adult life, Bowman taught at all grade levels, and later became a professor of English and linguistics upon earning her doctorate. In addition, Bowman was a highly acclaimed evangelizer, teacher, writer, and singer sharing the joy of the Gospel and her rich cultural heritage throughout the nation. During a visit to a general assembly of the U.S. bishops in 1989, Bowman urged the bishops to continue to evangelize the African-American community, to promote inclusivity and full participation of African-Americans within Church leadership, and to understand the necessity and value of Catholic schools in the African-American community.

Despite being diagnosed with breast cancer in 1984, Bowman continued to travel and speak to spread the Good News until her death in 1990. Bowman said that she wanted inscribed on her

tombstone the simple, yet profound words: “She tried.” “I want people to remember that I tried to love the Lord and that I tried to love them,” she said.

Today, across the United States there are schools; an education foundation to assist needy students attend Catholic universities; housing units for the poor and elderly, and a health clinic for the marginalized that are named in her honor. Books, articles, catechetical resources, visual media productions, and a stage play have been written or created documenting her exemplary life, spirituality, and ministry; prayer cards, works of art, statues, and stained-glass windows bear her image all attesting to Bowman’s profound spiritual impact and example of holiness for the faithful.

Listing our God-Given Gifts Inspires an “Attitude of Gratitude”

Stewardship requires an “attitude of gratitude.” Many times we are inclined to take too much credit for our successes in life and too little blame for our failures. The best antidote I have discovered for the hubris of our sense of self-importance is to set aside time to compile a list of the gifts we have received from God.

**The Gift of Life:** Life is a gift from God. None of us did anything to deserve being born. Spend a few moments being thankful for still being alive. My younger brother, Mike, died at the age of 56. He was a delightful human being, a loving husband, father, teacher, coach and friend. He died too young. His family and my brothers and I could focus on what was taken from us or focus on the gift of having him in our lives for whatever part of his 56 years we shared. Life is a gift and we need to live each day thanking God for it.

**The Gift of Family:** Just as we did nothing to deserve being born, we did nothing to deserve the parents and siblings we were given. Sometimes it takes time to fully appreciate the gift of family. There were times when I would have traded in my parents for another set that would have met my perceived needs of the moment. Fortunately, I have lived long enough to realize that they were the best parents for me. My older brother has expressed it this way, “Our father demanded perfection and our mother convinced us that we could live up to his expectation.” Once we embrace family as gift, it is amazing how the things that could drive us apart lose their power.

**The Gift of Education:** I have never met anyone who did not have a story about a teacher who changed her or his life. I have my list of such teachers; I’m sure you have yours. Education has changed our worldview and our self—understanding. We have learned from coaches,



scout leaders, neighbors, relatives and friends. All learning is a gift from God. We need to be more thankful for the gift of our education.

**The Gift of Vocation:** Nothing in life is as important as discovering what God wants us to do with our lives. I truly believe that God wanted me to be a priest. Many people seem to get lost in their search to discover who and what God wants them to be but the happiest and most fulfilled people I know are those who are doing what they love and love what they are doing.

**The Gift of Friends:** Let us say together, “We do not deserve the friends we have!” The gift of friendship is so precious. Our friends love us not in spite of our faults but because of them. Friends encourage us to grow and take risks. Friends teach us that time is a gift when they chose to share time with us. Most important of all, our friends see our gifts and talents before we do and they lovingly encourage us to recognize and develop our hidden gifts.

The above list of gifts is not meant to be exhaustive; it is offered as an outline. I hope you will use it to create your own list of gifts. Unless we make ourselves aware of the many gifts God has sown in our lives we will never develop the “attitude of gratitude” that is essential for the spirituality of stewardship to take root in our lives.

## 2019 Catholic Stewardship Appeal



*In this year's Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA), we are reminded of our call to reflect the light of Christ. The ministries the campaign funds allow us to reflect Christ's light in many ways...*

### **Vocations and Education and Care of Priests (51% of the total CSA budget)**

We see the light of Christ shine on those who are studying and discerning the call to become priests. This journey takes at least four years after completing a BA in college. In supporting CSA, you give 28 cents of every dollar to promote vocations and pay for seminary formation.

As those who are priests continue in ministry, the need to help with ongoing education as well as the need to assist with the funding of diocesan priests' pensions is another way in which the light of Christ shines through our stewardship. In supporting

CSA, you give 23 cents of every dollar to assist in the ongoing education of our priests and helping to fund retirement in their old age.

### **Faith Formation (18% of the total CSA budget)**

In Faith Formation, Youth Ministry and Hispanic Catechesis the light of Christ is shown through the training and empowerment of religious education leaders throughout the diocese in both the English and Spanish languages. This includes leaders who serve all ages, from the very young, to those in youth ministry through adult faith formation. Eighteen cents of every dollar you give to CSA allows the light of Christ to shine through these efforts.

### **Campus Ministry at UNLV (10% of total CSA Budget)**

Bringing the light of Christ to those who are involved at UNLV is a way in which the lives of those who are continuing higher education are served by the Catholic Church with campus ministry.

### **Pastoral Outreach (15% of the CSA Budget)**

There are a host of programs that seek to bring the light of Christ into our community. Catholic Charities of Southern Nevada and the St. Therese Center provide direct service to the poor and needy; our Social Ministry brings to light Catholic teachings and opportunities for advocacy; Victim Assistance brings resources for healing to those who have been abused; the televised Catholic Mass on Sunday mornings brings the presence of the church and the light of the Gospel to those who are sick or homebound; our diocesan website serves the local community as well as tourists who visit the Las Vegas valley by connecting them to the activity of our local church.

### **Leadership and oversight of Catholic Education (6% of the CSA Budget)**

In our Catholic schools, the Department of Catholic Education helps to ensure high standards are met in the education of students in this system. Six cents of every dollar you give to CSA helps the light of Christ to shine in our schools.
