

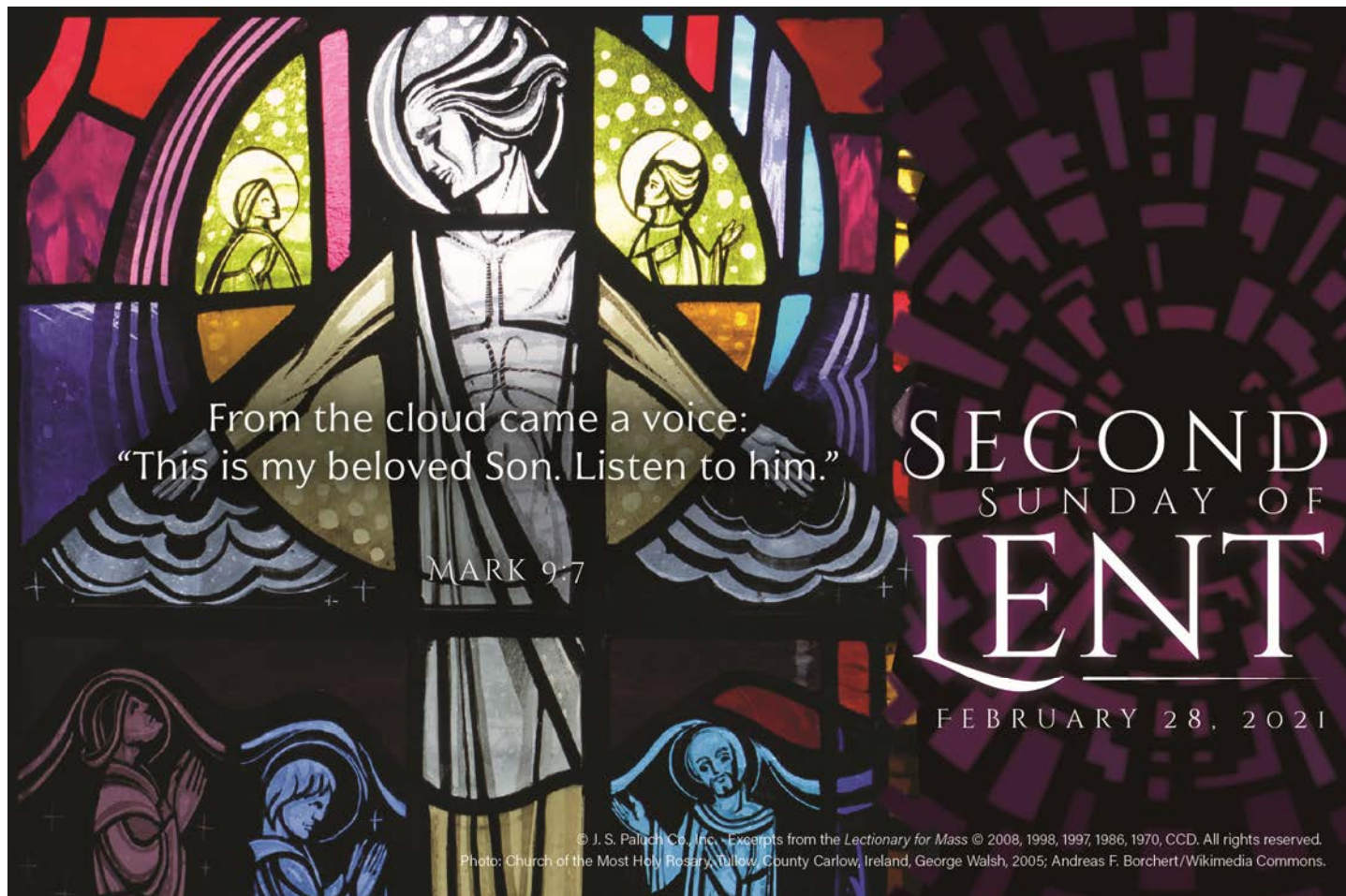

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

KEEPING HOLY THE LORD'S DAY

We're still in "pandemic-mode," as the obligation to attend Mass continues to be lifted by Bishop Thomas up to and including Easter Sunday. While the obligation to attend Mass may be lifted, we still must observe all the 10 Commandments, including the Third Commandment to "keep holy the Lord's Day." Of course, every Sunday is the Lord's Day, so hopefully during this pandemic everyone has done something every Sunday to observe the Third Commandment.

Since it's the season of Lent, a time of penance and sacrifice, perhaps it might be a good time to reflect on how we actually "keep holy the Lord's Day" when the obligation to attend Mass is lifted.

As of this writing, (Tuesday evening of the First Week of Lent), I checked on how many people have viewed our YouTube Masses offered on the First Sunday of Lent. The number of views for all 7 of last weekend's Masses totaled 1,336. That's pretty good, considering most of those views consisted of more than one person! Now we know that not all of the views are our parishioners as evidenced from the notes of gratitude we receive through email and snail-mail from all across the country. But I'm sure the bulk of those views are from our own. Likewise, I know some of our parishioners take the opportunity to attend live-streamed or recorded Masses from different parishes as well.

All in all, counting on an average of 1500 persons who feel comfortable to attend Mass in person on an average weekend, I would venture to say that a majority of our parishioners are sincerely observing the Third Commandment to "keep holy the Lord's Day."

REMEMBER THE PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH?

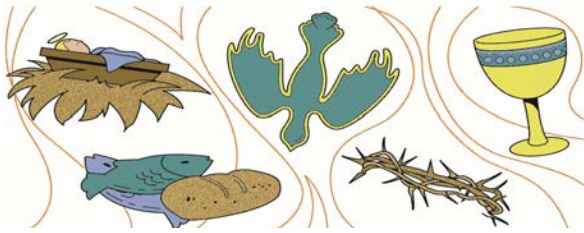
Keeping the Lord's Day holy (in addition to Holy Days of Obligation) is also listed as the first of the five Precepts of the Church.

Together with the **Ten Commandments**, these Precepts are the **absolute minimum** requirements of all Catholics, unless there is a legitimate reason for not observing them like ill health, caring for someone who is sick, traveling when there is no opportunity to attend Mass on a Sunday or Holy Day of Obligation, or even during a pandemic! So, let's review the five Precepts of the Church, which you can reference in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2041-3:

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.** We "sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord" (Sunday), as well as the principal feast days, known as Holy Days of Obligation. This requires attending Mass, "and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days."
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.** We prepare for the Eucharist by means of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). This sacrament "continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness."
- 3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.** This "guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy."
- 4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.** "The fourth precept ensures the times of asceticism [self-discipline] and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart."
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.** "The fifth precept means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability."

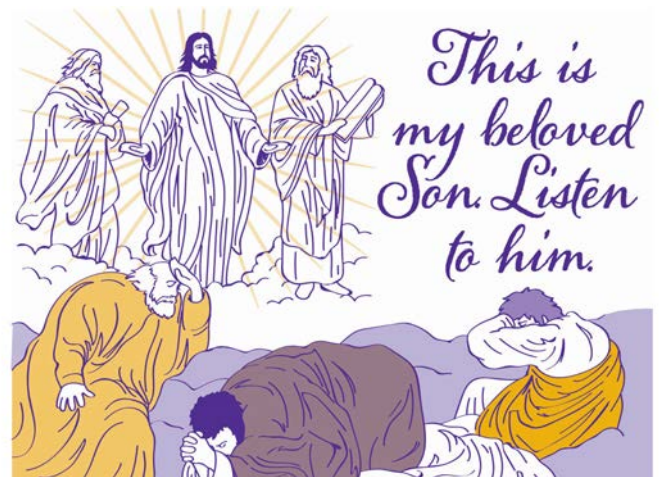

Feast of Faith

The Opening Prayer

At the conclusion of the Introductory Rites of the Mass, the presider says or chants the words “Let us pray,” followed by the Opening Prayer. This prayer is also called a “collect” because it gathers or “collects” the prayers of the entire assembly into one. The Roman collects that we pray in our liturgy—noted for the brevity, clarity, and conciseness of the Latin originals—date from a variety of periods. Some are quite new; others reach back more than a thousand years. They are truly treasures of our tradition.

The Opening Prayer can be divided into four main parts: 1) the invitation, or “Let us pray”; 2) the silence that follows, during which each member of the assembly lifts up before God his or her own prayers; 3) the collect itself, spoken or sung by the priest; 4) and finally the Amen, by which the assembly says, “yes,” “may it be so,” making the prayer their own.

The collect itself almost always follows the same pattern. It begins with an invocation to God. A petition follows, usually very general. We ask for health, strength, wisdom, grace, forgiveness, faith, awareness. Every collect concludes by offering the prayer to God through Jesus Christ. With the Amen of the assembly, the Introductory Rites of the Mass come to an end.

For nearly a year already, and due to the serious concerns surrounding the Covid-19 pandemic, we have had limitations placed on the practicality of our observance of the 1st through 3rd Precepts. The 4th and 5th Precepts, however, can still be observed by most.

The 4th Precept concerns our Lenten practices of fasting and abstinence. You can find the particulars of how to observe these elsewhere in this bulletin.

The 5th Precept concerns our support of “the needs of the Church.” While we at SEAS had to cut many corners in our parish budget to accommodate the expected decrease in our weekly collections, we are certainly not affected as negatively as some other parishes have been. Our ***It is in Giving that we Receive*** parish stewardship program has already allowed our parish to help some of the more needy parishes of our Diocese.

I thank those who have been able to continue or increase their weekly giving to keep us moving forward. I also have to ask those who have not been able to continue their weekly support of our parish to please consider returning to the faithful observance of the 5th Precept, but **only** if it's possible at this time. For some there might be some serious financial ramifications from the pandemic that might not make weekly contributions possible at this time. It's vitally important to make sure you are able to support the needs of you and/or your own family first. I'm confident that, when we return to some sense of “normalcy,” the faithful observance of the 5th Precept will come back and our weekly contributions will return and hopefully even increase!

I close with one of my favorite quotes from St. Francis of Assisi to his brothers: “...while we have time, let us do good!”

Saint of the Week

Katharine Drexel
1858 - 1955
Feast Day: March 3

The daughter of a wealthy Philadelphia banker, Katharine received marriage proposals but wanted to become a contemplative nun. After inheriting a fortune, she visited the Dakotas and witnessed American Indians' poverty, subsequently pleading with Pope Leo XIII to send them more missionaries. But he and others encouraged her to found a congregation to work among people of color. In 1891, she and thirteen companions became the first Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. For more than forty years, she led the order, using her fortune to establish numerous missions and schools for Native Americans and African Americans. Following a heart attack in 1935, which limited her missionary travel, she retired to a life of prayer. Canonized in 2000, she is the patron of home missions.

"Katharine Drexel is an excellent example of that practical charity and generous solidarity with the less fortunate which has long been the distinguishing mark of American Catholics. May her example help young people in particular to appreciate that no greater treasure can be found in this world than in following Christ with an undivided heart and in using generously the gifts we have received."

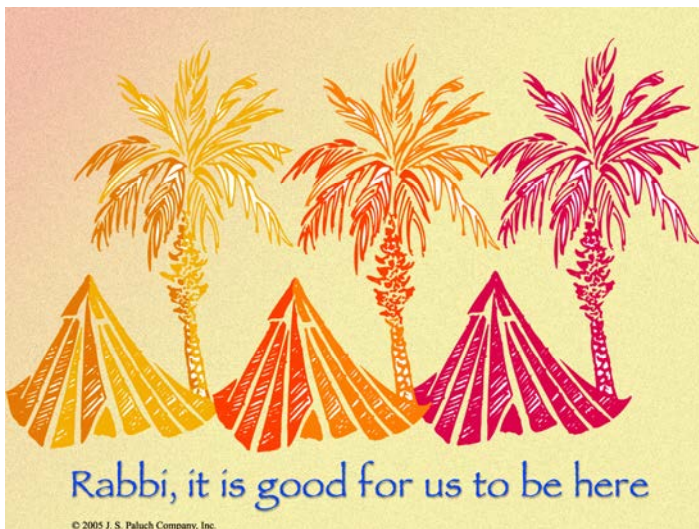

History of Salvation

The first reading today continues the "history of salvation" narrative that we hear throughout Lent this year. Today's story was among the best-loved in the Jewish tradition (surely Joseph told the story to young Jesus as he formed him in the ways of their faith); the early fathers of the Church were very fond of it as a means of explaining the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. The overall tone of the first reading, psalm, and second reading seems a little incongruous with the dazzling Gospel, until we remember that the Transfiguration was placed as the Gospel for this Sunday precisely to remind us of the glory that awaits those who live faithfully and obediently to the will of God. In the life of Jesus, it is a preview of the glory of his resurrection; for us it is a glimpse of the destiny of those who continue, as we heard in last week's Gospel, to repent and believe in the Good News.

Fact of Faith

Lenten Almsgiving

Rev. Larry Rice, CSP*

In his 2018 Message for Lent, Pope Francis said, “Almsgiving sets us free from greed and helps us to regard our neighbor as a brother or sister. What I possess is never mine alone. . . . When we give alms, we share in God’s providential care for each of his children. If through me God helps someone today, will he not tomorrow provide for my own needs? For no one is more generous than God.”

During Lent, Catholics prepare for the celebration of Easter by observing a penitential season of repentance, renewal and on-going conversion. Lent calls us back to the basics of our faith, acknowledging that we are all sinners, all in need of God’s grace. Traditionally, Lent has been a time of renewed prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Of these three disciplines, almsgiving is probably the least well understood. After all, works of charity and giving to the poor are supposed to be part of how we live in every season. But, just as Lent asks more of our prayer, it also asks more of our generosity.

For many people, fasting and almsgiving are connected disciplines. The point of fasting, after all, isn’t merely that we eat less, it could also mean that others can eat more, specifically those who live in poverty and hunger. One very popular Lenten almsgiving program is provided by Catholic Relief Services. It’s called Operation Rice Bowl. The core of the program is a cardboard bowl. During Lent, we’re encouraged to put our alms in the

Rice Bowl. Seventy-five percent of the funds collected go to hunger relief programs around the world, and the remaining twenty-five percent stay in your local Catholic diocese to aid local hunger programs.

You can find information about Operation Rice Bowl and request materials for it by visiting the Catholic Relief Services website: www.crs.org. They have resources for individuals, families, teachers and catechists, and for parishes.

However you choose to give to the poor this Lent, whether you’re giving of your time, talent or treasure, this season can be an important time of spiritual renewal. Part of how we’re renewed is by acknowledging the many ways that God has blessed us and sharing those blessings with the poor and marginalized.

If you're not already in the habit of keeping a prayer journal, try it. You'll be surprised by the spiritual awareness cultivated within yourself as you journey with Christ toward Easter.

Lenten Observances

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been extended through Easter Sunday, of the Resurrection of the Lord, April 4, 2021.

Fasting

In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both Ash Wednesday (February 17) and Good Friday (April 2). To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (excepting water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

Abstinence from Meat

Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

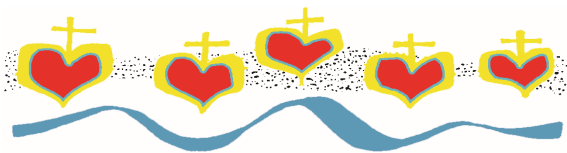

Canon 916 states: *"A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible."*



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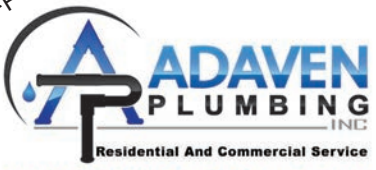
