A Letter from Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN!

This weekend we have our official kick-off of the Diocese of Las Vegas **2020 Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA)** entitled, **A Silver Jubilee of Stewardship**. This year marks the 25th Anniversary of the establishment of the Diocese of Las Vegas, and gives us all an opportunity to actively show our gratitude and support through our generous participation in this annual appeal.

As a parish community we're given several opportunities throughout the year to support many important and necessary ministries — not only for our parish, but for the diocese and universal Church as well. These “second collections” give us an opportunity to go beyond ourselves and support the work of Christ so active throughout the universal Church and our local Church.

In the CSA, then, we make a substantial and sacrificial pledge in support of the vital ministries and apostolates not otherwise covered by the other “second collections” throughout the year.

This coming week, you will receive a special mailing from me asking ALL of our registered households to make a sacrificial pledge in support of the 2020 CSA. I hope you'll read my letter along with the pamphlet which explains the many areas that benefit from this annual appeal.

Our 2020 parish goal this year is \$311,758, which is certainly within our reach and beyond. As always, whatever we contribute beyond our goal is rebated back to our parish. Whatever rebate we receive will be directed, once again, toward the eventual worship space enhancements in our future, especially since we didn't meet our goal for our own **HONORING our PAST, EMBRACING our FUTURE Capital Campaign**.

Here's the recap of this past year's CSA success:

2019 CSA contributions received	\$354,999.35
2019 CSA goal for SEAS	\$287,580.00
2019 Parish rebate	\$ 67,419.35

Last year, only 604 (just 12%) of our 5000 registered households participated in the 2019 CSA. Our rebate would have been much, much higher if the remaining 88% of our registered households had participated. If you fulfilled a pledge last year, please accept my sincere thanks for your participation! If you haven't participated in the annual CSA, can I ask you to join the rest of us who did? Will you help me raise that number of participants this year? Remember: **no gift is too large and no gift is too small. As a matter of fact, even the smallest gift, sincerely given with great love, is precious, greatly appreciated and better than no gift at all!**

As I ask you to participate, I need to lead by example and will personally pledge \$1,000 to the 2020 CSA. I hope you will join me and prayerfully consider your own pledge. Together, let's make this year a new beginning as we show our support for the 2020 CSA **Silver Jubilee of Stewardship!**



God's Call

The person who has been "saved," who has "heard the good news of salvation," still lives in an unsaved world, a world sadly oblivious to the presence of God. Today's readings outline

how the disciple is present in the world.

The outline begins with Isaiah: "Share your bread . . . shelter the oppressed . . . clothe the naked" (Isaiah 58:7). Those who hear the word of salvation are not insensitive to the urgent needs of others. Then Paul reminds his flock that he brought Christ to them not in eloquence or wisdom, but by being with them in the "weakness and fear" of their daily lives (1 Corinthians 2:3). Finally, Jesus tells his disciples to go out into the gloom and darkness of the streets of the world and let God's light shine through their good deeds.

We disciples don't save the world. To the extent, however, that we have heard the word of God and been awakened to God's presence, we may spread that word and bring that presence to others.

Saint of the Week

Saint Scholastica
Dates: 480 - 547
Feast Day: Feb. 10

Scholastica and her brother, St. Benedict, were born to a wealthy Christian family in Nursia, Italy. Details of their lives come from the Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great. After Benedict established his monastery at Monte Cassino, she founded a convent at Plombariola, and was its abbess for many years. The siblings met once a year outside Monte Cassino. At their final meeting, Scholastica begged Benedict to stay the night and, when he wouldn't, she asked God for help. A violent storm ensued and Benedict had to stay. They spent the night discussing the joys of heaven, and she died three days later. Scholastica is the patron saint of Benedictine nuns and convulsive children.

Fact of Faith

Marriage: What Does Proper Form Mean?

According to canon law of the Catholic Church, there are essentially two things that are necessary for marriage to be considered a valid sacramental bond. First and foremost, is the free consent of the two people being married. But Catholics are also bound to make sure that their marriage follows the proper form. So, the question is, what do we mean by form?

For Catholics, the proper form of marriage means that the consent of the parties must be exchanged in the presence of a Catholic priest, bishop or deacon who has the necessary jurisdiction, and in the presence of two witnesses. If any of those elements is missing, then the form is not correct and that marriage is not valid. So, for example, if a Catholic person is married by a minister of another Christian Church, the marriage would be considered invalid for lack of form. Or, if there was only one witness to the marriage, that also means that the form of the marriage was deficient.

It should be noted, however, that there are instances in which Catholic parties to a marriage can be dispensed from the requirements of canonical form. Generally speaking, this requires the permission of the local bishop. For example, if a Catholic man and a Lutheran woman were to be married, and wish to be married by her father, a Lutheran pastor, the couple could apply for a dispensation of form from their bishop, through their local Catholic parish. In instances like this, in which the dispensation from form will help to preserve peace in the family, bishops will generally grant the request.

Focusing on the Victims of Human Trafficking

February 8 is designated World Day of Prayer and Awareness against Human Trafficking. The day is intended to raise awareness and encourage reflection on the violence and injustice that impact victims of human trafficking. February 8 was selected because it is the day commemorating Saint Josephine Bakhita, who herself was sold into slavery as a young girl and whose powerful testimonies raised awareness of human trafficking around the world.

Human trafficking exists in the United States and throughout the world. People are conscripted to work in factories, on farms and as domestic help, and a particularly egregious form of trafficking involves the sex trade. According to Covenant House, the nonprofit agency which serves runaway and homeless youth, sex trafficking in the United States ensnares over 100,000 youth yearly. Traffickers frequent malls, middle schools and high schools, theaters and bus transit centers looking for vulnerable youngsters. Covenant House also maintains that a girl who has taken to the streets is likely to be approached within 45 minutes. Traffickers create a cycle of dependency and coercion from which it is extremely hard to escape.

Millions throughout the world are subjected to modern forms of slavery, and this subjugation can occur in neighborhoods close to us. It happens wherever the homeless, the mentally ill, the runaways, and the poor are neglected. It happens to those who answer ads for employment in faraway places and may not understand what they are getting into. It happens in our cities and small towns.

Pope Francis drew attention to the “plague” of human trafficking, and called on government leaders to confront the causes of the trade of human beings. We are asked to support legislation to strengthen anti-trafficking measures, support the

efforts of those who take care of street kids and to be alert to situations around us. The pontiff has insisted that all our efforts to stop human trafficking should begin with prayer, “Prayer is the force that sustains our common commitment” to ending trafficking. Recalling last year’s World Day of Prayer and Awareness against Human Trafficking, the Holy Father said that February 8 is a day that invites us to join forces to overcome this challenge. “All of us,” he said, “can and must work together to denounce the cases of exploitation and slavery of men, women and children”.

Stewardship Saint for February

Josephine Bakhita

Born in western Sudan in 1869, our February stewardship saint recalled having a loving family and happy childhood. At age seven, however, she was abducted by Arab slave traders; the trauma and sheer anguish of which

caused her to forget her own name. A slaver sarcastically named her Bakhita, Arabic for lucky. For the next eight years, Bakhita would be sold and resold in African slave markets. She experienced the cruelties, humiliations and sufferings of slavery, including severe emotional abuse, beatings and indescribable mutilations.

In 1883, at age 14, Bakhita was sold to an Italian consul, who treated her with much kindness. She was gifted to an Italian couple in 1885 who took her to their villa outside Venice where she would become nanny to their infant daughter.

Needing to leave the country on business for a several weeks in late 1888, the couple entrusted their daughter and Bakhita to the care of a Venetian convent of the Canossian Daughters of Charity. But when time came for the pair to be collected, Bakhita refused to leave. To protect her, the religious superior complained to local authorities.

An Italian court ruled that because Sudan had outlawed slavery even before Bakhita's birth and because in any case Italian law did not recognize slavery, Bakhita had never legally been a slave, could not be considered property, and having reached majority age, could make her own decisions. Bakhita chose to remain with the religious community.

In 1890, Bakhita received the sacraments of Christian initiation, and embraced the name Josephine.

She was eventually admitted into the Canossian community and in 1902, Sister Josephine was assigned to the convent in Schio, a town in the Italian Alps.

For the rest of her life, Sister Josephine happily served the community in Schio as sacristan, cook, and portress, the community member appointed to interact with the public and provide hospitality to guests. Besides her humble and faithful stewardship of daily prayer and service, Sister Josephine helped prepare other members for missionary work in Africa. Her gentleness, calming voice and ever-present smile caught others' attention. She was encouraged by her community to tell her story, and in 1931, its publication made her well known throughout Italy.

Her life in Schio continued uninterrupted through two world wars. When air-raid sirens sent others scurrying for cover during World War II, Sister Josephine, unfazed, would continue her cooking or sweeping. Many believed their town escaped serious damage because of her saintliness and felt protected by her mere presence.

Sister Josephine died on February 8, 1947. Since then, many have sought her prayerful intercession, especially those who experience any form of slavery, and those who need to find peace, forgiveness and reconciliation in their lives. She was canonized a saint in 2000 by Saint John Paul II. Her feast day is February 8.


Shopping Cart


Salt of the Earth


