"The Bible cannot be just the heritage of some, much less a collection of books for the benefit of a privileged few. It belongs above all to those called to hear its message and to recognize themselves in its words. At times, there can be a tendency to monopolize the sacred text by restricting it to certain circles or to select groups. It cannot be that way. The Bible is the book of the Lord's people, who, in listening to it, move from dispersion and division towards unity. The Word of God unites believers and makes them one people."


May we see in this Sunday, **The Sunday of the Word of God**, an opportunity and challenge to delve more deeply into God's living Word. Our own Bible Study opportunities presented by Marcie Wilske, help us respond to this challenge by embracing the Sacred Scriptures as a way to know Christ more deeply. Pope Francis says it this way:

"The relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers and Sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. Without the Lord who opens our minds to them, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in depth. Yet the contrary is equally true: without the Scriptures, the events of the mission of Jesus and of his Church in this world would remain incomprehensible. Hence, Saint Jerome could rightly claim: "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ" (*Commentary on the Book of Isaiah*, Prologue: PL 24,17B)."

And so I conclude using the words of Pope Francis at the end of his letter:

"May the Sunday of the Word of God help his people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. For as the sacred author taught of old: "This word is very near to you: it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance" (Dt 30:14)."

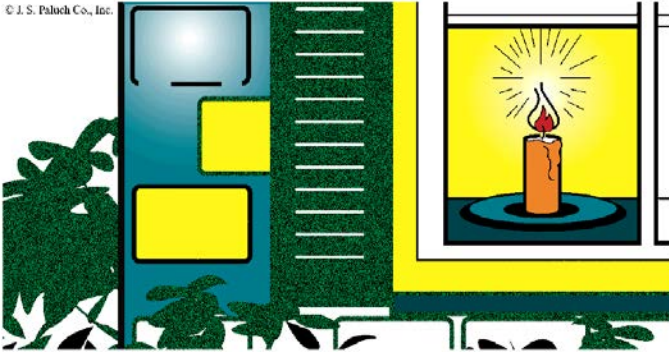

Saint of the Week

Saint Thomas Aquinas
1225 - 1274

Feast Day - January 28

Thomas so shocked his noble Italian family when he entered the Dominicans about 1244 that his brothers imprisoned him for a year. But he would not

yield, and studied under St. Albert the Great, becoming a master of theology in 1256. For the rest of his brief life, the "dumb ox," as he was dubbed, taught, preached and wrote, producing the monumental "Summa Theologica." His thinking became enormously influential in later centuries and he was named a Doctor of the Church in 1567.

"St Thomas Aquinas, with farsighted wisdom, succeeded in establishing a fruitful confrontation with the Arab and Hebrew thought of his time, to the point that he was considered an ever up-to-date teacher of dialogue with other cultures and religions. He knew how to present that wonderful Christian synthesis of reason and faith which today too, for the Western civilization, is a precious patrimony to draw from for an effective dialogue with the great cultural and religious traditions of the East and South of the world." —Pope Benedict XVI, *Angelus*, January 28, 2007

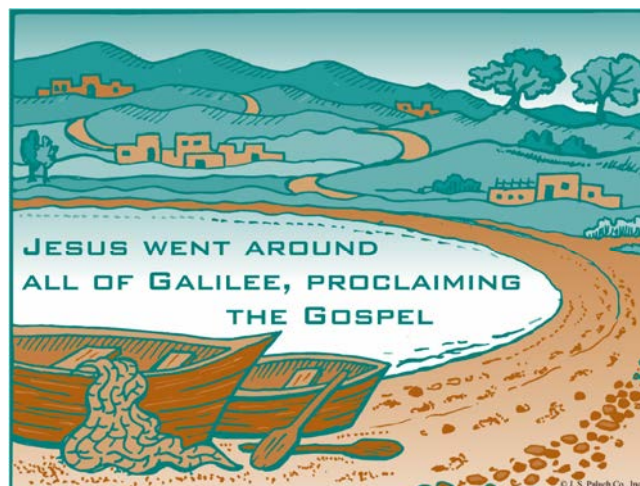

Seeking the Light

In today's readings we find ourselves being drawn more deeply into relationship with Jesus. We are getting to know more about him as we see how he struggles with the news of his cousin John's arrest. His first response is to withdraw, to leave Nazareth and go to Capernaum. There he is perhaps both consoled and challenged by the words of Isaiah that Matthew quotes: "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, / on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death / light has arisen" (Matthew 4:16). Jesus contemplates his cousin's death, perhaps his own death, and he seeks the light. Maybe it is these words of Isaiah that move Jesus out of his withdrawal and into action. He begins to preach, teach, cure disease and illness, and proclaim the gospel of the kingdom.

Living the Faith

Don't Let Culture Raise Your Kids

This book review was originally published on USCCB's For Your Marriage website.

On the cover of *Don't Let the Culture Raise Your Kids* by Marcia Segelstein, we see a child looking out a window with both hands pressed against the glass. Is this book about isolating your child from the world? Not at all. It is a book about what Christian parents can do to maintain their beliefs and values in a world that continually bombards children and their families with harmful influences.

Before becoming a mother herself, Marcia Segelstein covered family issues for CBS News. She took up writing from home about family concerns, eventually becoming a columnist and a senior editor for *Salvo* magazine. She has written for FoxNews.com, *First Things*, *WORLD Magazine*, and *Touchstone*. Edelstein says that from the time she grew up to the time of raising her own children (both of whom are now in their twenties), the culture shifted from one that might not have been explicitly Christian to one that actively works against Christian morals and values. She wants to share what she has learned about the pervasive influence of the culture on the family and to show adults how to be the parents their children need.

The book first explains the critical role of parents. Children need parents to be authority figures, yet modern parents have been abdicating that role. Permissive parenting, in the name of fostering children's happiness, self-esteem and creativity, has produced entitled, disrespectful and demanding children. *Authoritative* parenting is not authoritarian or mean; it is a loving, nurturing, consistent standard-setting style of parenting. Saying "no" does not stifle a child's creativity but rather fosters problem-solving. Confident, authoritative parents inspire children to follow their lead.

Subsequent chapters address prominent examples of how the culture introduces concepts that contradict Christian values, especially regarding schools, media, sex, pornography and consumerism. For every issue, the author

gives multiple real-life examples of the incursion of unwanted ideologies and morals on our children. Some instances might have gone unnoticed or unconsidered by readers and will provoke further thinking. Some could elicit astonishment and chagrin. Readers might be all too familiar with other examples and feel at a loss for how to respond. But Segelstein never leaves readers stranded.

Through this book, Segelstein offers parents ways to counteract bad cultural influences in healthy, constructive ways. A sizable part of every chapter is "Solutions, Tips & Tools" that are practical, specific ways for parents to exercise responsibility. Already in the first chapter, on parenting, the author quotes a founding member of the American College of Pediatricians that "it's never too late to start," and goes on to tell how to begin anew with even a school-age child. Tips and tools range from setting reasonable rules and discipline methods through establishing rituals, family meals, vacations and respect, to writing a family mission statement. Tips for issue-oriented chapters are equally down-to-earth and easily manageable. In some cases, specific tools are recommended such as guides to video games and electronic device filters.

Even the author's final thoughts chapter, about living according to one's beliefs, offers tips that begin with where to get help for the parent who feels overwhelmed. Segelstein recommends praying together, going to church together and church involvement, among other suggestions.

Everything in *Don't Let the Culture Raise Your Kids* is amply supported by research and expert opinion, with 268 citations at the back of the book. A resources appendix list recommends books and websites.

“Celebrate Catholic Schools Week”

Stewarding the Church's Educational Mission

“Celebrate Catholic Schools Week” in the U.S. begins this year on Sunday, January 26, and ends February 1, 2020. The theme of this week of celebration and reflection is “Catholic Schools: Learn. Serve. Lead. Succeed.”

It would be impossible to overestimate the influence that Catholic schools have had on the Catholic faith, and indeed on all of civic society, in the U.S. Catholic schools have produced generations of leaders and nurtured the faith in ways incalculable.

When and where was the first U.S. Catholic school established? According to the National Catholic Education Association's website, it's hard to pinpoint, but clear that U.S. Catholic education has deep roots. The Franciscans opened a school in what is now St. Augustine, Florida, in 1606. Not too much later, and farther north, Jesuits were educating Indian children, including our new American saint, Kateri Tekakwitha.

Women like Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, who helped to found the Catholic school system in America, and Saint Katherine Drexel, who labored for the education of Black Americans, were among the thousands of religious women who gave their lives to “raise the standard” in Catholic education.

The influx of immigrants in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, coupled with a decidedly anti-Catholic bias present in some public schools of the time, propelled the enormous growth of Catholic schools in America's great cities and small towns. Entire generations of U.S. Catholics are graduates of the Church's school system.

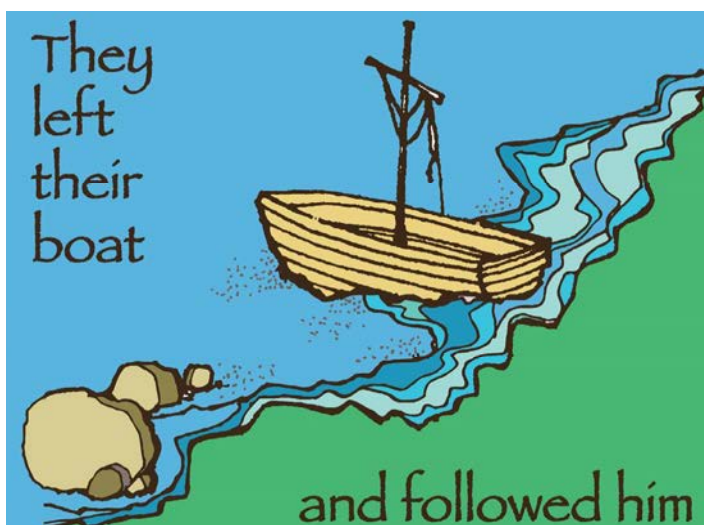
Times have changed. Many dioceses face consolidations and closures of schools; public schools have become inclusive, and the network of religious women who made Catholic schools so affordable has been largely replaced by a dedicated pool of lay men and women.

Yet, Catholic education continues to flourish and continually seeks new ways to enhance our Cath-

olic faith through education. Today, 7,000 Catholic schools continue to serve the Church and nation, and produce America's leaders and faithful Catholics.

As Catholic stewards, we are grateful for the gift to our Church and nation of Catholic schools, and we pledge our continued support and prayer.

In January 2019, our parish conducted a comprehensive survey of our entire parish community that helped church leadership determine support for a major fundraising campaign. This campaign planning study followed an extensive needs assessment which produced a parish-wide master plan.

Based on the positive results of the planning study, in mid May of 2019 our parish moved forward with the **HONORING our PAST, EMBRACING our FUTURE Capital Campaign** to raise funds to pay off existing debt, address deferred maintenance, sustain our parish school and enhance our worship space.

Today, we would like to thank all who participated in the fundraising effort over the past year. Although we did not reach our goal of raising \$4.5 million, we are extremely grateful to the 1160 families who generously pledged \$2,450,892 to the campaign so far. As of January 16, 2020, \$997,103.07 in pledge payments have been received, and payments continue to come in. Thank you for honoring your pledges.

In addition to 2019 tax statements, those who donated to the capital campaign will also receive an end-of-year capital campaign statement. Please contact the parish office if you have any questions regarding your capital campaign contributions.

As we move forward, we will continue to accept donations to the capital campaign. And as always, we ask for everyone to pray that our capital campaign will continue to help us honor our past and embrace our future.
