New Year: Go Forth with the Power of the Epiphany

"Let us imitate the Magi: looking upwards, setting out, and freely offering our gifts." —Pope Francis, Homily for the Solemnity of the Epiphany, 2018

Epiphany! The Magi left their bubble, their comfort zone, to follow a new star. They "went forth," together, pursuing a beckoning light that promised a new reality, new priorities, a new relationship — one worthy of a challenging journey and the offering of their greatest treasures.

The New Year begins with the Christmas season and an incrementally increasing amount of daylight in both our hemisphere and our lives. We may stop during this season to consider the gift of God-With-Us, born into our comfortable but sometimes stagnant understanding of our place in the world, into our continuing search for meaning and relationship. Unwrapping this gift of Emmanuel is a risky, but rewarding, process.

What might be some of the beckoning lights promising new realities and relationships that can change the world — and our own lives? How can we seek more clearly the presence of God in those near and far? We start with those around us and go beyond to encounter the impatient people in line at the grocery store, the harried bus driver, the bewildered parent, the exhausted server at the restaurant, the person on the sidewalk hidden under a blanket, the commuter whose wheelchair is stuck on the curb, the family speaking in another

language than ours. Stars for such encounters may also be found in the January calendar.

- National Migration Week is from September 20 - 26, 2021 (www.justiceforimmigrants.org). Where did your ancestors come from? What did they find in their new country? How can we seek and encounter those on the move today who are part of our "one family under God?"
- Support World Day of Migrants and Refugees. We are a Church without borders, valuing the life, gifts and thriving of every person. How do we seek and encounter those who have left so much behind and who look for a new start and new opportunities to offer their culture and skills?
- January 18, 2021 is the national holiday in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. How do we seek and encounter the lessons and sacrifices of the civil rights movement, and non-violent resistance, in the issues of racism and injustice that continue to fracture our one family under God?
- January 28-29, 2021 is the National Prayer Vigil for Life. How do we seek and encounter those who are most vulnerable from the beginning of life until its final stages? How do we understand each life as precious?
- January is Poverty Awareness Month (www.povertyusa.org). How do we seek and encounter people living in poverty, including the 2.8 million impoverished people who work full-time, year-round?

The star that called the Magi to "Go Forth" was visible to all, but not all responded to the beacon in the gloom of night. May we be Magi, seeking and encountering our vulnerable brothers and sisters, experiencing a new reality and relationships through the gift God-With-Us. Every. Day.

Our Patron Saint



Feast Day of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

Monday, January 4

A patron saint is chosen as a special protector or guardian over areas of life. These areas can include occupations, illnesses, churches, countries, causes; anything that is important to us. Elizabeth Ann Seton is the patron saint of our church. We celebrate her feast day every January 4th.

Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton's Story

Mother Seton is one of the keystones of the American Catholic Church. She founded the first American religious community for women, the Sisters of Charity. She opened the first American parish school and established the first American Catholic orphanage. All this she did in the span of 46 years while raising her five children.

Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton is a true daughter of the American Revolution, born August 28, 1774, just two years before the Declaration of Independence. By birth and marriage, she was linked to the first families of New York and enjoyed the fruits of high society. Reared a staunch Episcopalian, she learned the value of prayer, Scripture and a nightly examination of conscience. Her father, Dr. Richard Bayley, did not have much use for churches but was a great humanitarian, teaching his daughter to love and serve others.

The early deaths of her mother in 1777 and her baby sister in 1778 gave Elizabeth a feel for eternity and

the temporariness of the pilgrim life on earth. Far from being brooding and sullen, she faced each new "holocaust," as she put it, with hopeful cheerfulness. At 19, Elizabeth was the belle of New York and married a handsome, wealthy businessman, William Magee Seton. They had five children before his business failed and he died of tuberculosis. At 30, Elizabeth was widowed, penniless, with five small children to support.

While in Italy with her dying husband, Elizabeth witnessed Catholicity in action through family friends. Three basic points led her to become a Catholic: belief in the Real Presence, devotion to the Blessed Mother and conviction that the Catholic Church led back to the apostles and to Christ. Many of her family and friends rejected her when she became a Catholic in March 1805.

To support her children, she opened a school in Baltimore. From the beginning, her group followed the lines of a religious community, which was officially founded in 1809.

The thousand or more letters of Mother Seton reveal the development of her spiritual life from ordinary goodness to heroic sanctity. She suffered great trials of sickness, misunderstanding, the death of loved ones (her husband and two young daughters) and the heartache of a wayward son. She died January 4, 1821, and became the first American-born citizen to be beatified (1963) and then canonized (1975). She is buried in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton is the Patron Saint of Catholic Schools and the Loss of Parents.

Reflection

Elizabeth Seton had no extraordinary gifts. She was not a mystic or stigmatic. She did not prophesy or speak in tongues. She had two great devotions: abandonment to the will of God and an ardent love for the Blessed Sacrament. She wrote to a friend, Julia Scott, that she would prefer to exchange the world for a "cave or a desert." "But God has given me a great deal to do, and I have always and hope always to prefer his will to every wish of my own." Her brand of sanctity is open to everyone if we love God and do his will.

A Stewardship Resolution for the New Year: Living with Compassion

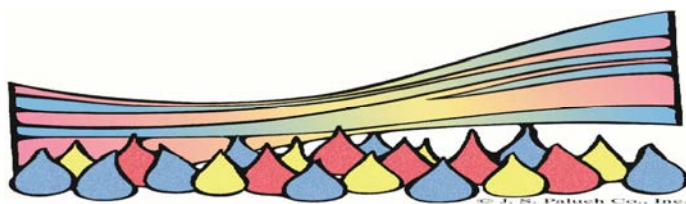
January is traditionally the time for new beginnings, fresh starts. For the Christian steward, the grace of being given another day, or God willing, a whole new year, stirs our deep gratitude. But it also calls us to ask what a “resolution” should really be. Our first resolve should always be to involve ourselves more intimately in the life of Christ, and how better to do that than by embracing Christ's call to be compassionate?

After all, Jesus himself instructed us, “Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate” (Luke 6:36). Clearly, we strive now to live and give compassionately, as we generally understand the term. We try to be kind, considerate and understanding individuals. We share with others. But Jesus' words challenge us to embrace a compassion that is much deeper, much more radical than our general understanding.

The word compassion, at its root, means “to suffer with.” This goes beyond merely writing a check, offering a prayer or sending a note. Suffering is not a popular notion in our society and we strive to avoid it. But now we hear Christ instructing us to “suffer with” the poor, the vulnerable, the powerless, the neglected, the weak.

How can we possibly choose such a journey, this challenge to be truly present to those who suffer?

All things are possible with God, and it is through a commitment to a life of discipline, discipline in

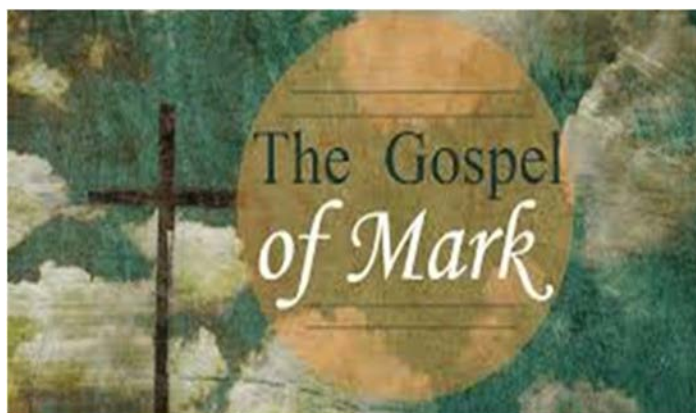

New Bible Study Begins January 11

The shortest of the four gospels, Mark is the earliest account of Jesus' life and the primary source for the other synoptic Gospels: Matthew and Luke. Mark asks everyone to answer Jesus' question, **'Who do you say that I am?'** and challenges believers in every generation to accept the harsh reality of the cross. Beginning in December, 2020, most of the readings we will hear at Mass during the coming year come from the Gospel of Mark ... so what a perfect time to join this 10-session study as we explore Mark's theological portrait of the person and mission of Jesus Christ.

Making Reservations

Reservations for the 4pm Vigil on Saturday, January 9, the Sunday Masses on January 10 and the 8am daily Masses from Monday, January 11 through Saturday, January 16 can be made beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, January 4 either at www.seaslv.org or at 702-228-8311.

Seating is limited to 4 seats per reservation. Reservations will fill the church first, then when capacity in the church is reached, attendees will be seated in the parish hall to view the live-streamed Mass from the church and receive Communion. Church doors will open 30 minutes before each Mass. Those who come to the church without a reservation will be asked to wait outside until 5 minutes prior to the start of that Mass. If, at 5 minutes till, those with reservations have not yet arrived, their reserved seats will be offered to those who are waiting in line until capacity of 250 is reached or the maximum of what 6 feet social distancing will allow.

Daily Mass on Wednesdays is reserved for the SEAS School children, faculty and staff and is not open to the public unless school is not in session. School will NOT be in session on Wednesday, January 6.

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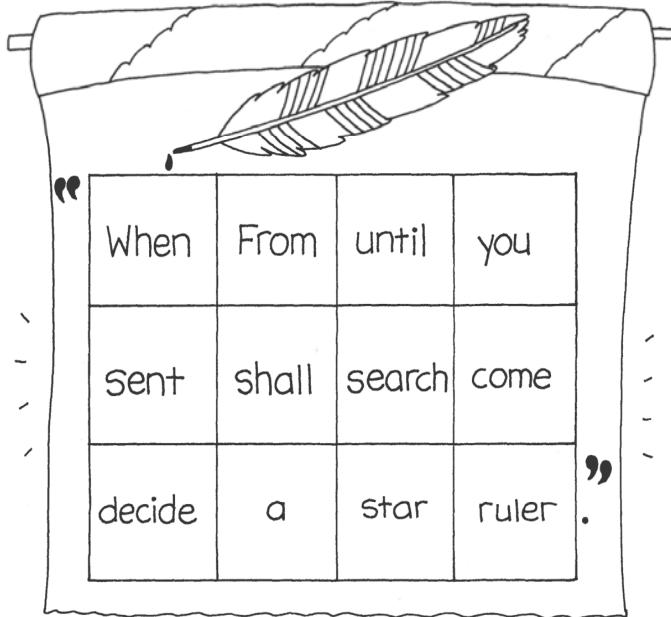
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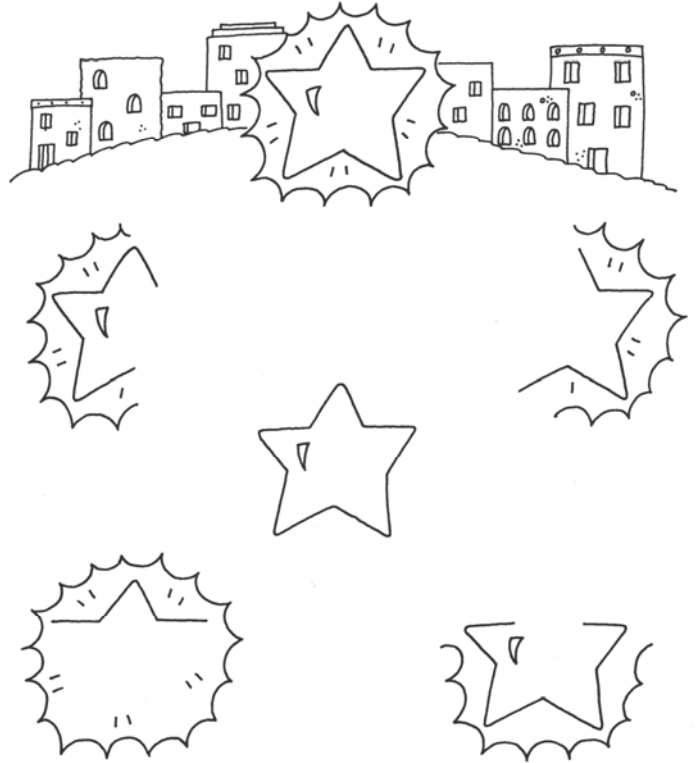
