A Letter from Our Associate Pastor



Dear Friends,

I am Fr. José D. Unlayao, CJD, your new associate pastor. I was born on May 4, 1977, the youngest of seven children, to Mr. and Mrs. Sesinando Unlayao, a family of farmers in the humble town of Lucban, Quezon in the Philippines.

St. John Paul II was instrumental to my vocation. It was during World Youth Day in Manila in 1995 when he addressed the crowd of more than 5 million youth and asked the young men to heed the call to the priesthood. I said, "Yes."

In 1996, I entered St. Francis de Sales Major Seminary in Lipa City, Batangas in the Philippines, where I earned an AB in Philosophy in 2001. Afterward, I spent a year of spiritual formation under the Focolare Movement at Priest School for Asia in Tagaytay City, then continued my theological formation and studies at St. Alphonsus Regional Seminary in Lucena City. I completed my AB in Theology in 2008 and was invited once again by the Focolare Movement to continue my spiritual formation through the course, *Spirituality of Unity* in Florence, Italy.

I was so inspired by this experience that I postponed my plans of becoming a priest to teach in schools in Manila and Laguna until 2013. After further discernment, I joined the Order of Canons Regular of Jesus the Lord. Together with my fellow brothers Luis and Ferdinandus, we underwent the Canonical Novitiate in Vladivostok, Russia. Upon completion, Brother Luis and I were assigned to start a new community in the Diocese of Las Vegas.

In May 2016, my pastoral ministry in Las Vegas began under the guidance of Msgr. Gregory W. Gordon at St. Anne Catholic Church. On January 25, 2017, Brother Luis and I received the Holy Order of Deacons and the following May we were ordained to the Sacred Order of Priesthood by Bishop Joseph A. Pepe, DD, JCD. I was then assigned as one of the associate pastors at

St. Joseph, Husband of Mary parish. I will always be grateful for my time there.

Knowing that obedience to the will of God unlocks valuable blessings, teachings, and surprises, I gladly obeyed when I was informed of my new assignment at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish. It has been a week since my arrival, and I have already encountered (especially last Sunday) many wonderful people from this faith-filled community—a friendly staff, cheerful volunteers, and joy-filled parishioners.


I have only been a priest for two years, so I ask you, my dear parishioners, to please pray for me as I journey with you so that I may deepen my knowledge and excel in all the talents and abilities God has blessed me with for this service and ministry. From the support you have already shown me, I am sure my time here will be a tremendous opportunity to grow and learn.

I have no other desire but to bring God's message of hope, compassion, and truth as I try my best to grow in holiness and love through my ministry and service. May we help each other to advance in the grace and favor of God each day of our lives.





Treasures From Our Tradition

On a summer day, with the windows open, we may hear the sound of church bells. Bells seem to have come into church life in Irish monasteries around the seventh century, and spread around the Christian world by Irish monks on missionary journeys. By the eighth century, bells were standard equipment in even small parish churches. An ancient ceremony, once called the "baptism of the bells," recognizes that the church bell has a voice to call people to awareness and summon them to worship, and even bestows a name on the bell.

In a world without clocks or watches, the bell had an indispensable role. For calling monks in from the fields for prayer, or alerting far-flung visitors, the bell's voice was enhanced by hoisting it high into a tower. Soon it was learned that the sound of several bells clanging together in harmony imparted a sense of joy to great celebrations, and bell towers prospered, some chock full of bells. Different combinations of rings could indicate a death, a Mass, a wedding, a fast day, the curfew at the end of day, and the Angelus. Before electricity, bellringing was hard work indeed: the biggest bell in the Catholic world, in Cologne, Germany, weighs twenty-seven tons! There's no substitute for the resonant roar of a mighty bell; electric chimes are not eligible for blessing!

St. Bonaventure 1221 - 1274 Feast Day - July 15

Franciscan doctor of the church, Bonaventure is best known for writing on spirituality and theology. He stressed the importance of emotion in the search for God without denying human reason in examining divine revelation. He became minister general of the Franciscans and demonstrated that simplicity, poverty and imitation of Christ could be balanced with intellectual pursuits. In 1273 he was made cardinal. It is said he refused the traditional red hat and asked papal legates to leave it hanging from a tree.

Living the Faith

Creating and Maintaining Balance in Your Marriage

As a family, one of our favorite summer activities is swimming in our pool. Having an in-ground pool within a few steps of our backdoor has been a sweet blessing. We splash, play, relax, and bond. My husband, Troy, works hard to maintain the pool and preserve the appropriate chemical balance, often referring to it as one big chemistry experiment! Now and then, the chemical balance is lost due to external factors such as a large amount of rain in a short time.

For the first time in 13 years, we have had an issue with nitrates eating our chlorine. It is so serious that after numerous attempts and way too much money spent on chemicals, we must now empty all 23,000 gallons of water and refill it with fresh water to fix the problem.

As I was lamenting our pool situation today, I thought about it in relation to marriage. I reflected on how sometimes outside influences seep into marriages and cause them to get completely off balance. Other times, our own marital neglect shifts the "chemical balance." Maintaining a healthy, holy marriage requires diligence and a daily investment of time.

The first step to creating and maintaining balance in your marriage is ensuring that you have your priorities correctly ordered: God first, marriage second, children third, and work fourth. Rearranging the order causes imbalance, which leads to disorder and then eventually to chaos.

Work is at the service of your family, while children find security in parents who have a strong marriage. A solid prayer life and a deep relationship with God are the foundations of a loving, stable marriage. As God is the source of the grace necessary to live the sacrament of marriage, maintaining this order is vital to the health of both your marriage and family life.

Life circumstances might require a temporary shift in your focus, but not a rearranging of your priorities.

Do you have order in your marriage? Perhaps you need to "readjust the chemicals," to maintain the proper balance. Maybe you need a completely fresh start and must drain the entire "pool" to recalibrate.

To assess the pool water, Troy also uses test strips which tell him precisely where the chemicals are registering. Occasionally, when everything registers perfectly, but the pool water still looks off, he takes a sample to the local pool store to have it evaluated. This extra step usually uncovers the underlying issue that the test strip was not able to pick up. How do you gauge the health of your marriage? You can start by taking a good, clear look at it. Is your spouse happy? Are you happy? What is the tone of your home? Do you need outside intervention to honestly assess where you are? If this is necessary, do not be ashamed or embarrassed. Having the courage to seek help demonstrates strength of character and wisdom. Many couples are not fully equipped with the tools necessary to be in a life-giving marriage. Outside advice can help provide these essential tools.

On the other hand, if your marriage just needs some minor calculated changes to get back on track, then I encourage you to talk about it with your spouse. Come up with a game plan together to readjust your lifestyle to create stability in your marriage and peace in your home.

Even if your entire pool needs to be dumped, do not lose hope. At first, we tried band-aids on our pool problem, thinking we could avoid a costly refill. We didn't want to deal with the underlying issue quite yet; but now we can no longer avoid it. When it comes to marriage, don't do the same thing. Covering up your marital issues with bandaids and avoiding the underlying problems only wastes time. Be bold and brave. Fact of Faith

Our Lady of Mount Carmel Celebrated July 16

Mount Carmel, which juts out into the Mediterranean near Haifa, Israel, has been considered a sacred place since the prophet Elijah built an altar there in his contest with the prophets of Baal. The Carmel headland is traditionally associated with the beginnings of the Carmelite order around 1195, when a

group of lay hermits formed a community there.

Mary had been honored there as early as the fifth century, and by the 12th century Mount Carmel had become a site of Marian devotion. The Carmelites chose Mary as their protectress and dedicated their oratory on Mount Carmel to her. Our Lady of Mount Carmel is the patron of Bolivia and Chile. This Marian feast became an optional memorial in the Revised Roman Calendar of 1969. "The Carmelites have spread among the Christian people devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel, holding her up as a model of prayer, contemplation and dedication to God.

Indeed, Mary was the first, in a way which can never be equaled, to believe and experience that Jesus, the Incarnate Word, is the summit, the peak of man's encounter with God. By fully accepting the Word, she "was blessedly brought to the holy Mountain" (cf. *Opening Prayer of the Memorial*), and lives forever with the Lord in body and soul."

Children's Faith Formation (age 3 – grade 8)

Requirements:

- Parents or guardians are registered members of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish or a Catholic Parish in the Las Vegas Diocese. Regular attendance at Sunday Liturgy is part of the formation process.
- Registration fee is \$150.00 per child. No child will be turned away due to financial difficulty.
- Families must provide a Birth and Baptism
 Certificate and deposit at the time of registration.
 Sacrament preparation at SEAS is a family
 preparation process that requires the
 participation of the child and the parent
 throughout the formation years.

Sacraments:

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a two-year process for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason (7 years), are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil in their second year of preparation.

First Eucharist Initiation:

The two-year preparation process to celebrate First Eucharist teaches children about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The child and the parent will participate in retreats in their second year.

Continuing Formation:

Children in 3rd grade and higher who are baptized and have received First Eucharist will continue their formation in age appropriate classes. It is the practice of our faith that formation is ongoing and is a life-long journey.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):

This is a hands-on, interactive working environment where children are guided toward a greater understanding of God's love in their life. They encounter Jesus the Good Shepherd, who loves them, cares for them and knows them by name. Children are most sensitive to a relationship with God between the ages of 3-6. For this reason, we provide formal faith formation for young children.






