A Letter from the Pastor



Dear parishioners and friends of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (SEAS):

DIFFERENT GIFTS, BUT THE SAME SPIRIT

SEAS is now blessed to have the presence of the Canons Regular of Jesus the Lord as part of our pastoral team, specifically in our parochial vicar,

Fr. José Unlayao, CJD. Soon, we will also welcome and share Fr. Luis Van Dam, CJD, as a hospital minister between our parish and St. Anthony of Padua as well.

St. Paul says in his first letter to the Corinthians: "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings by the same God who produces all of them in everyone." (1 Corinthians 12:4-6). Therefore there are many different ways to serve the Lord in the Church. Of the many different religious orders and communities developed throughout the history of the Church, they each have their own charisms and ways of living out their religious commitments. No one way is better than another, just different.

So, here at SEAS we have not only myself as a diocesan priest, but Fr. José and eventually Fr. Luis who are members of a religious community. The charisms and practices of the Canons Regular of Jesus the Lord are different from a diocesan priest. When I was a Conventual Franciscan Friar, the charisms and practices of that religious order, to which I was previously bound, are not the same for me now that I am a fully incardinated priest of the Diocese of Las Vegas.

I speak about this so that we, as a parish community, understand that you will see some differences between how Fr. José and Fr. Luis live out the charisms of their religious community, and how I live out my diocesan priesthood. Remember, they are different and one is not better than the other...simply different.

For example, you will see Fr. José and Fr. Luis present, when able, at the celebration of Morning Prayer prayed in our parish community before daily Mass. Part of their Constitutions states: "It is the special privilege of canons to celebrate the praise of God in the Liturgy of the Hours in the midst of the Church. Therefore we carry out this service in the church building with the people and in the language of the people and using the Church's official texts."

For myself, I find great value in praying the Liturgy of the Hours privately. After having prayed the Liturgy of the Hours in a religious community for 31 years of my life, I now enjoy praying the "official prayer of the church" at my own pace and in the privacy of my own chapel in the rectory.

Likewise, you will see, when able, Fr. José and Fr. Luis, at daily Mass even when they might not be on the schedule to preside. Again, from their Constitutions it reads: "The daily Mass and the sacraments are also celebrated by the community in the midst of and with the people."

For myself, on those days I am not scheduled to preside at daily Mass, I prefer to offer Mass privately in my rectory chapel.

I hope this answers some of the questions that have been floating around. It's good that everyone understand the differences between the charisms of those in religious life and those who belong to the diocesan priesthood. I have the unique privilege of having experienced both in the past 40 years of my life. From my own experience, I know that one is not better than the other, just different because, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit."

Catechetical Corner

The Purpose of Marriage

The Catechism teaches that Christ's grace in the Sacrament of Marriage protects the essential purposes of marriage: the good of the couple and the generation and education of children. These purposes are protected and fostered by the permanence of the marriage bond and the mutual fidelity of the spouses.

"What God has joined together, no human being must separate" (Mk 10:9). We have already noted that God's plan for marriage involves a permanent covenant embraced by the couple. The Church declares every valid sacramental consummated marriage to be indissoluble, that is, no one can dissolve the marriage bond.

The Sacrament obliges marital fidelity between the spouses. Love has a definitive quality about it. It is more than a practical arrangement or a temporary contract. Marital intimacy and the good of the children require total fidelity to conjugal love. This flows from Christ's own fidelity to the Church, which he loved so much that he died for her. By

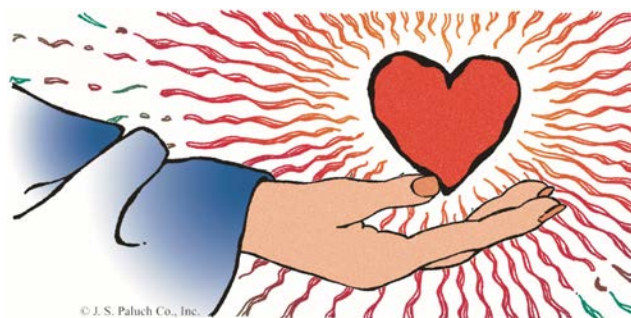
their mutual fidelity, the spouses continue to make present to each other the love of Christ and lead each other to greater holiness through the grace they receive from the sacrament.

Married love is ordered to the good of the spouses and to the pro-creation and education of children. These are the unitive and procreative purposes of marriage. "By its very nature the institution of marriage and married love is ordered to the procreation and education of the offspring and it is in them that it finds its crowning glory" (CCC, no. 1652; GS, no. 48). The fruitfulness of married love includes the moral, spiritual, and faith life the parents hand on to their children. Parents, as principal educators of their children, are at the service of life.

Together with their children, parents form what the Second Vatican Council called the domestic church. The Church lives in the daily life of families, in their faith and love, in their prayers and mutual care. The Catechism notes that "All the members of the family exercise the priesthood of the baptized in a privileged way" (CCC, no. 1657). Not all married couples are able to have children. "Spouses to whom God has not granted children can nevertheless have a conjugal life full of meaning. . . . [and] can radiate a fruitfulness of charity, of hospitality and of sacrifice" (CCC, no. 1654).

Living the Faith

How Natural Family Planning Changed My Life

As a child I was baptized Catholic, but essentially grew up with no religious practice. As a married adult, I reentered the Church, and soon after felt a tugging at my heart to stop practicing contraception. At that time, I did not know about Natural Family Planning (NFP). More basic, I did not know about Church teachings on the moral practice of family planning. What I would learn about God's design for my married life and through the practice of NFP would change my life.

True Freedom and Openness to Life

When my husband, Ariel and I took an NFP class, I have to admit that I was scared. Giving up control, was frightening! It was one thing to be committed to an ideal, but something quite different to follow through on it. It definitely involved a leap of faith! Over time and with some experience, I began to appreciate the gift and beauty of NFP.

In practicing NFP, my husband and I must decide if we, as a couple, are ready to embrace the possibility of a new life in each menstrual cycle. When we had used contraception, we ignored this reality. With NFP we could not ignore how God made us— as a man and a woman. NFP helped us understand the relationship that God designed between the marital act and procreation. It has made us “open to life.” It even brought our last two children into the family!

The Gift of Self

In using NFP over the years, both my husband and I now see that we give ourselves to each other fully in the marital act. For us, the idea of contraception has become almost vulgar. It cheapens the marital act. Contraception seems to say: “I love you, honey, but I don't love you THAT much.”

NFP also guards against the objectification of the woman in the relationship. Contraception often keeps the woman in a defensive position because it allows “intimacy on demand.” NFP does not allow this because of the practice of periodic abstinence when not seeking a pregnancy. A deeper equality between husband and wife can be nurtured with NFP.

Growing Together in Holiness

The sacrifices that NFP entails have only served to make me a better person and more devoted to the Lord. Without knowing it, using contraception promotes the idea that children are a burden. Children do require lots of work, and pregnancy demands its own set of sacrifices, but NFP has helped me meet these challenges by leading me to the realization that children are God's blessings. I am constantly forced to pray, change, make concessions and find solutions to the selfishness and laziness that come up often when meeting the needs of others.

Today, I am confident that had I not been open to life in the practice of NFP, I would not have needed to depend on God, and not have grown as a person. This growth benefits my family and the people I meet in everyday life. Jesus calls us to serve others. Marriage and parenthood are ways we can immediately apply this call in our lives. NFP has led me to be more open to life, more aware of God's design for intimacy in marriage, more dependent on Him to fulfill these plans. It has strengthened my relationship with my husband, given me personal insight and it has given our children life!

Saint of the Week and Stewardship Saint for July

Mary Magdalene
1221—1274

Feast Date—July 22
Steward of Christ's Ministry

Saint Mary Magdalene is one of the most revered saints in the history of the Church and her discipleship emphasizes the complementary roles of women, Saint Peter and the other disciples as witnesses to the Risen Christ.

From the New Testament, one can conclude that Mary came from Magdala, a village on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. She was a friend of Jesus of Nazareth and a leading figure among those who were his disciples. She was one of the women who accompanied and financially supported Jesus and the twelve apostles which suggests that the women were respectable, well-to-do members of the community.

At the time Jesus was executed on Golgotha, when the men in his company had already run away and abandoned him, Mary Magdalene is specifically identified in the Gospels as one of the women who refused to leave him. She was present at the Crucifixion and burial.

What is by far the most important affirmation about Mary Magdalene, however, is that she is mentioned in all five of the Resurrection narratives of the Gospel tradition (Mark 16:1-8, Matthew 28:1-10, Luke 23:55-24:12, John 20:1-18, and Mark 16:9-20). In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and John, she is the primary witness to Christ's Resurrection. All four Gospels explicitly name her as being present at the tomb and she was the first person to preach the "Good News" of that miracle.

From other texts of the early Christian era, Mary Magdalene's status as a disciple in the years after Jesus' death is as prominent as the twelve apos-

ties. For many centuries Mary Magdalene was the symbol of Christian devotion, especially that of repentance. However, Christian traditions that came after the New Testament era erroneously equated Mary Magdalene with both the sinful woman in Luke 7 who anointed Jesus and with Mary of Bethany in John 11 and Luke 10 who also anointed Jesus. The tradition that Mary Magdalene was a repentant prostitute has been dismissed by modern biblical scholarship as almost certainly untrue.

Saint Mary Magdalene has been celebrated throughout Christian history in art and literature. There are many famous depictions of her in art such as Rembrandt's Christ and St. Mary Magdalene at the Tomb and Titian's Noli Me Tangere (Latin: "Do not touch me"). Her feast day is July 22.

Children's Faith Formation (age 3 – grade 8)

We offer formation classes for children preparing for First Eucharist, Baptism (older than age 7), Continuing Formation (after receiving the sacraments), and the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program for children ages 3 to 5 (entering kindergarten).

The 2019-2020 season starts the week of September 17.

Classes: Tuesdays and Thursdays

Times: 4:30 p.m. to 5:40 p.m.
and 6:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m.

Requirements:

- Parents or guardians are registered members of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish or a Catholic Parish in the Las Vegas Diocese. Regular attendance at Sunday Liturgy is part of the formation process.
- Registration fee is \$150.00 per child. No child will be turned away due to financial difficulty.
- Families must provide a Birth and Baptism Certificate and deposit at the time of registration. Sacrament preparation at SEAS is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and the parent throughout the formation years.

Sacraments:

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a two-year process for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason (7 years), are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil in their second year of preparation.

First Eucharist Initiation:

The two-year preparation process to celebrate First Eucharist teaches children about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The child and the parent will participate in retreats in their second year.

Continuing Formation:

Children in 3rd grade and higher who are baptized and have received First Eucharist will continue their formation in age appropriate classes. It is the practice of our faith that formation is ongoing and is a life-long journey.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):

This is a hands-on, interactive working environment where children are guided toward a greater understanding of God's love in their life. They encounter Jesus the Good Shepherd, who loves them, cares for them and knows them by name. Children are most sensitive to a relationship with God between the ages of 3-6. For this reason, we provide formal faith formation for young children.

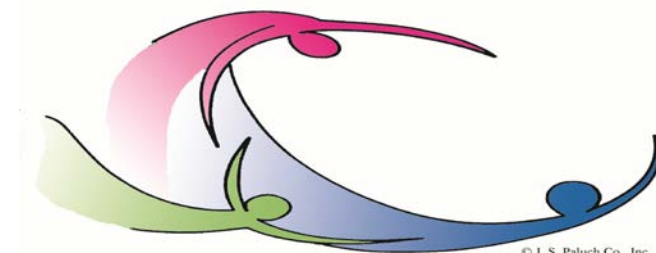

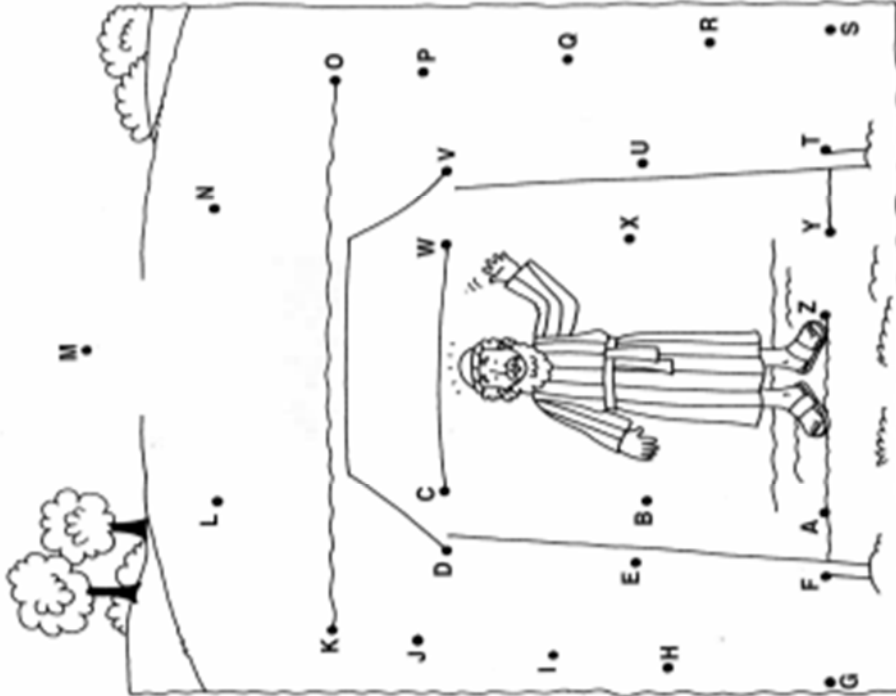
