


#### Saint of the Week


BI. Stanley Rother March 27, 1935 - July 28, 1981 Feast Day - July 28

An Oklahoma farm boy, Father Stanley Francis Rother was born in Okarche, Oklahoma. Ordained a priest for the Diocese of Oklahoma City and Tulsa in 1963, he served in the diocese's Guatemala mission for fourteen years,

ministering to the native Tzutuhil tribe. Fr. Stan (or Padre Francisco, as he was affectionately known), learned the Tzutuhil language and became one with his poverty-stricken flock, ministering to his parishioners in their homes, eating with them, visiting the sick, aiding with medical problems and helping on their farms. While he served in Guatemala, a civil war raged between the militarist government forces and the guerillas and hundreds of thousands of Catholics were killed due to the Church's insistence on helping people. Eventually, Fr. Stan was targeted. For his safety, he returned to Oklahoma, but was not able to hold himself back from his people. After a short period that was akin to his own "Garden of Gethsemane" moment, he returned to his people, famously saying that "the shepherd cannot run." Within days of his return to Santiago Atitlan, three men entered the rectory and killed him. A true imitation of the Good Shepherd who laid down his life for his flock. Fr. Stan was declared a martyr and beatified in 2017.

#### The Role of the Commandments

God helps us in many different ways to live a moral life. He gives us grace, which awakens in us the desire to say no to temptation and sin and to choose only that which is good. He gives us the Theological and Cardinal Virtues and the grace to practice human virtues so that we can grow stronger in them. God gives us help and grace through the Church and through our reception of the Sacraments. He also teaches us how we should live. One way he does this is by giving us laws to guide our actions. The Ten Commandments are laws that God has revealed to us. Heeding the guidance God gives us in the Commandments will help us know how to serve God and how we should live with each other. It also helps us to be open to the grace of the Holy Spirit and what God can accomplish in us and through us by that grace.

#### Living the Faith

#### The Holiness of God in Daily Life

When God appeared to Moses on Mount Horeb, he said, "The place where you stand is holy ground" (Ex 3:5). The sixth chapter of Isaiah describes the prophet's vision of God and hearing the angels sing, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord" (Is 6:3). Moses reacts to God's holiness with awe, a deep reverence for the all-embracing majesty of God. Isaiah responds to God's holiness with an awareness of the profound and infinite purity of God. Both men undergo a spiritual transformation that they attribute to their experience of God's holiness.

The First Commandment is more than a reference to an abstract idea of God. It is an announcement of the presence of the most holy God, both in outward creation and within the human soul. His existence does call for our faith.

Our surrounding culture is filled with many distractions that shut out the majestic voice of our holy and glorious God. St. Augustine, commenting on his troubled youth, speaks of this experience with these words, "You were with me, but I was not with you. Created things kept me from you; yet if they had not been in you they would not have been at all." But God was not simply a passive presence to Augustine, a diffident lover wondering what to do. Augustine tells us that God spoke with a vigorous voice. "You called, you shouted, and you broke through my deafness. You breathed your fragrance on me. . . I have tasted you, now I hunger and thirst for more (The Confessions , bk. 10, no. 27).

This is the best context for appreciating the importance of the First Commandment. As God did with Augustine, he does for us again—calling, shouting, trying to break through our deafness, breathing his fragrance upon us. Many, indeed, are listening. Numerous Catholics are seeking a deeper relationship with God through daily Mass, frequent reception of the sacraments, the prayerful reading of Scripture, retreats, spiritual direction, diverse forms of prayer, and devotional practices. With Augustine, they can say, "You touched me, and I burned for your peace."

#### **Treasures From Our Tradition**

The pilgrim experience of going by foot to Santiago de Compostella, the shrine of St. James, reached its high point this week at the feast of the Apostle, with tens of thousands of pilgrims on the road. Typically, they cover twelve to twenty miles a day through rough territory. The difficult journey and the often primitive lodging facilities are made bearable by the joy of the pilgrims, their songs and prayers. When their journey is documented properly, they receive the scallop shell, a reminder not only of James the fisherman, but also his call to fish for human beings and to baptize the nations. In the Middle Ages, those who wore this badge on their hats were granted lodging and hospitality wherever they went. Next to the palm, the sign of a Jerusalem pilgrim, the scallop shell was most highly prized.

In the Middle Ages, some people so enjoyed the pilgrim road, although it was filled with discomfort and danger, that they spent most of their lives on the road. Today, some people take up the route for exercise, but are drawn gradually into the spirituality of the journey. As you make your summer travels, always fold in an element of pilgrimage: a long walk through beautiful countryside, a visit to a church, a prayer of gratitude for your journey through life's hills and valleys.




#### Asking for Help

The Beatitudes praise the poor in spirit. One characteristic of those who are poor in spirit is their ability to ask for help; they know when others can provide what they lack. Today's readings encourage us to practice poverty in spirit by asking God for what we need. What could be more natural than to ask God for good things? God is, after all, the inventor of goodness and the giver of all good things.

Asking God for help puts us in conversation with God. These conversations take many forms. The reading from Genesis shows Abraham bantering with God like a skilled negotiator, while Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians praises God for answering us even when we don't deserve it. In Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus not only gives us words to use in our conversations with God (the Our Father), but also promises that God always listens to our prayers.

- 9. Surprise an old friend with a phone call.
- 10. Buy or pick a flower for someone without a reason.
- 11. Take your family to a farmers' market if in season.
- 12. Stop for a moment during your busy day and enjoy an ice cream cone or other favorite treat.
- 13. If you hear a great homily, tell the homilist.
- 14. Splurge on some produce and buy enough to share with someone in need.
- 15. On occasion, try turning your prayer before meals into a spontaneous prayer of thanks, using your own words.

Dear Parishioners,

I hope you're having a wonderful summer! As you enjoy the rest of the season, please remember that the parish's capital campaign is still underway. Volunteers are still working hard, and generous donors are still pledging.

If you haven't yet offered a gift, I hope I can count on your support. So far, we've received \$1,502,048 in pledges to our **HONORING** *our* **PAST EMBRACING** *our* **FUTURE Capital Campaign.**

- -Replace altar and ambo to comply with liturgical standards
- -Replace our pews with solid wood pews
- -Replace/level the tile floor in the church
- -Repaint/repair damaged walls and ceilings in the church and school

Our parish understands the power of stewardship and we have always responded when called upon for support. I hope that once again the parish can rely on the generosity of our entire faith community in making this capital campaign a success.

## Children's Faith Formation (age 3 – grade 8)

We offer formation classes for children preparing for First Eucharist, Baptism (older than age 7), Continuing Formation (after receiving the sacraments), and the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program for children ages 3 to 5 (entering kindergarten).

## The 2019-2020 season starts the week of September 17.

- Classes: Tuesdays and Thursdays
- **Times:** 4:30 p.m. to 5:40 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m.

#### **Requirements:**

- Parents or guardians are registered members of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish or a Catholic Parish in the Las Vegas Diocese. Regular attendance at Sunday Liturgy is part of the formation process.
- Registration fee is \$150.00 per child. No child will be turned away due to financial difficulty.
- Families must provide a Birth and Baptism Certificate and deposit at the time of registration. Sacrament preparation at SEAS is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and the parent throughout the formation years.

#### Sacraments:

#### Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a two-year process for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason (7 years), are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil in their second year of preparation.

#### First Eucharist Initiation:

The two-year preparation process to celebrate First Eucharist teaches children about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The child and the parent will participate in retreats in their second year.

#### **Continuing Formation:**

Children in 3rd grade and higher who are baptized and have received First Eucharist will continue their formation in age appropriate classes. It is the practice of our faith that formation is ongoing and is a life-long journey.

#### Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):

This is a hands-on, interactive working environment where children are guided toward a greater understanding of God's love in their life. They encounter Jesus the Good Shepherd, who loves them, cares for them and knows them by name. Children are most sensitive to a relationship with God between the ages of 3-6. For this reason, we provide formal faith formation for young children.


