A Letter from the Pastor



Dear Friends,

Three years ago, I celebrated my 25th anniversary to the priesthood. The anniversary Mass was celebrated here at SEAS with my good friend, Fr. Bob Stoeckig as the homilist. The First Reading of the Mass told the story of Naaman, the Leper. In Fr. Bob's homily, he

talked about God's command to Naaman to, "Get up and go."

That day, Fr. Bob reminded me of the many times God has called on me to do the same—to "Get up and go." During my time in the priesthood, I got up and went five times when I received a new parish assignment.

God and our professional superiors sometimes work in surprising ways. Although I have been graced to remain at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish for the past seven years, I have been called to once again, "Get up and go," to pastor in a different parish community, St. Thomas More in Henderson beginning July 1. I will indeed need your continued prayers. You will certainly always remain in mine.

It has been a wonderful and fulfilling privilege to be your pastor and shepherd. We have worked together to build up the kingdom of God here at SEAS, and I have given you the best of my abilities and gifts to that end. From the time of my arrival, I promised to prioritize these important aspects of parish life:

- Effective and meaningful liturgy and sacraments
- Faith formation from baptism to God's final call
- Charity, not only to each other but also to those less fortunate through a vibrant outreach program with advocacy to many social issues in our community
- Community building with an emphasis on becoming a stewardship parish
- Lay leadership building
- Bringing our parish into the spirit of Vatican II
- Helping to make SEAS the friendliest parish

I believe that we have accomplished these goals, and I am very proud of the outstanding ministries we have been able to provide to one another, to our wider community, and to the diocese. Thanks to God and all of you, we have created a vibrant and lively faith community. I want to personally thank you for your contributions of time, talent, and treasure. May you never lose that spirit of love and collaboration that so characterizes this parish!

You may have noticed that I never tried to "entertain" you in my homilies. Rather than sooth you with clever stories, my goal was to challenge you and make you think. I believe it is the task of a preacher to do so and in this way encourage you to do better in some aspect of your life. Only you will know if this has been personally successful. If you remember anything, it should be this: **God Loves Us!** If you have grasped this alone, I consider my time here a success because this is the central mystery of faith that we celebrate every Sunday: God's tremendous love.

Whenever decisions had to be made, I took into consideration the parish as a whole, not any one individual's needs. As a result, there were times when I responded, "No," to specific requests or desires. That may have been hurtful to some. It was often difficult for me, as well. I apologize to anyone who felt slighted.

And as we all know, opinions sometimes differ. The parish consists of many individuals. It would be rare for everyone to agree on any one thing. But for the most part, I think we have come a long way together. I have listened to and respected opposing positions, which at times have been a welcome influence. Ultimately though, the proverbial buck stopped with me, and I proceeded with what I thought was best for the good of the larger parish. If I have made any decisions that you felt were rash or if my words or actions offended anyone, I ask your pardon.

I especially want to thank those who were critical and challenged me. You helped keep me in line and true to my responsibilities as your pastor. You also deepened my relationship with God. If not for those challenging times, I would not have prayed

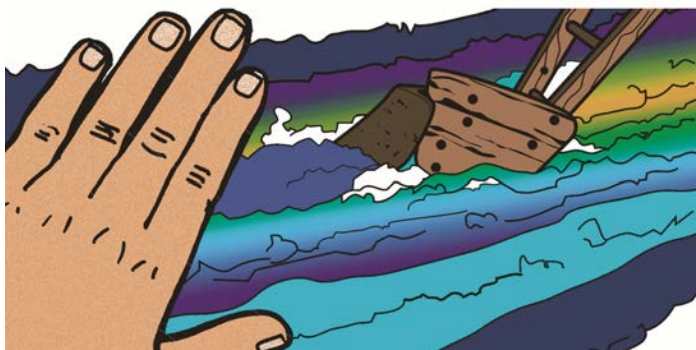

Treasures From Our Tradition

Processions are life's journey distilled. We move with companions, aware that Christ accompanies us, as we move to the altar for Communion or to the font for baptism, or carry a loved one to a place of rest. In Europe, the season of pilgrimage is beginning now, and tens of thousands of people are moving by foot on well-worn paths. Some take as long as six weeks to walk the last few hundred miles of the medieval pilgrimage route to the Shrine of St. James the Apostle in Compostella, in northern Spain.

Those who make the journey by foot, hiking, or by bicycle, have a kind of passport stamped at villages and monasteries on the road. When they present this document at the cathedral, they are given the emblem of a pilgrim, the scallop shell of St. James. High over their heads at Mass, a huge *botafumero* twirls clouds of sweet incense through the cathedral. Cynics say it is to mask the odor of smelly feet. The pilgrims know better. Seeing through the clouds the happy faces of those they met along the road, they recognize a foretaste of the welcome into heaven, and the joy of meeting loved ones in the Kingdom of God.

Saint of the Week

St. Junipero Serra

1713 - 1784

Feast Day - July 1

A Spanish missionary who is buried in California, Miguel José Serra was born on the Mediterranean island of Majorca. He entered the Franciscans in 1730, taking the name Junipero to honor an original companion of St. Francis of Assisi. He taught after being ordained but in 1749 volunteered for mission work among the Indians of Mexico and Texas. In 1767, the Franciscans under Father Serra took charge of the missions in Baja, California, and in 1769, he accompanied a military expedition into Alta (upper) California, where he founded nine of the 21 missions stretching from San Diego to Sonoma. Canonized by Pope Francis in 2015, he is the inspiration for Serra International, which encourages and affirms vocations.

Capital Campaign Challenge to SEAS Parishioners

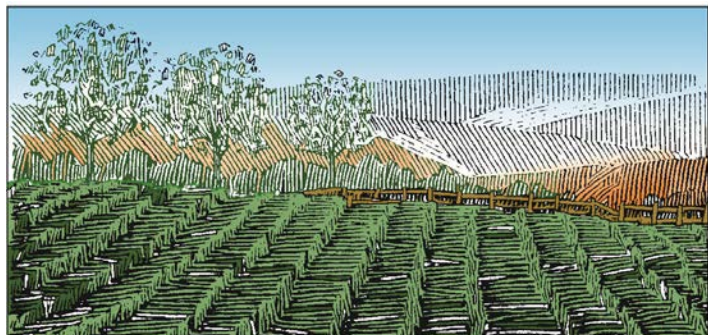

Salt and Light

Our Dual Role as Disciples and Americans: The Call to Participate

As disciples of Christ, and as Americans, the call to participate in public life is an important way of assisting God's work to transform the world around us.

Pope Francis reminds us:

An authentic faith...always involves a deep desire to change the world, to transmit values, to leave this earth somehow better than we found it. We love this magnificent planet on which God has put us, and we love the human family which dwells here, with all its tragedies and struggles, its hopes and aspirations, its strengths and weaknesses. The earth is our common home and all of us are brothers and sisters. If indeed "the just ordering of society and of the state is a central responsibility of politics," the Church, "cannot and must not remain on the sidelines in the fight for justice" (Joy of the Gospel, no. 183).

In their statement on political responsibility, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the U.S. Catholic bishops point to Pope Francis's words to remind us that working to transform the world around us is part of "our baptismal commitment to follow Jesus Christ and to bear Christian witness in all we do" (no. 13).

An important way to do this is through our participation in the public square. The bishops give a number of examples of how we can participate:

- "running for office,"
- "working within political parties,"
- "communicating [our] concerns and positions to elected officials,"
- "joining diocesan social mission or advocacy networks [and] state Catholic conference initiatives,"
- "joining...community organizations," and
- "other efforts to apply authentic moral teaching in the public square" (no. 16).

This Fourth of July, let's celebrate our dual roles as disciples of Christ and as Americans. Then, let's work to change the world.

Religious Freedom

The Right to Religious Freedom

A basic duty every human person owes to God is regular worship. Because of this, and because of the basic longing each person has for God, a fundamental human right is the right to worship freely. No one should be prohibited from a free exercise of their faith, either in public or in private, and no one should ever be forced to worship in a manner that violates their beliefs and convictions. Because freedom of religion and worship is such an important and fundamental right, governments need to enact and enforce laws that respect and protect this right (cf. CCC, nos. 2105-2109).

Talking about Religious Freedom

Religious freedom has recently become one of the major focal points in the conversation on how Americans can promote the common good. Our Catholic tradition has much to offer this conversation. In this time of increasing polarization in our culture, we can contribute to a better understanding of this issue in a way that respects all people. We can speak with friends and neighbors about religious freedom and work to clear up misconceptions about it.

Respect

Many religious freedom skeptics have plausible concerns. For example, they are concerned that all people should be treated with equal dignity. Indeed, the dignity of all people is the foundation for Catholic teaching on religious liberty. It is important that we not dismiss skeptics, but rather, that we listen to their concerns and take them seriously.

So, if the skeptics have a point, what do we say?

A Fundamental Right

Religious freedom is a fundamental right. It means that the government cannot coerce people into acting against their consciences. This is important for all people, not just people of faith. A

government that makes one group choose obedience to the state over obedience to faith and conscience can force any group to submit to the state's demands. Religious freedom underlies all other freedoms for everyone.

Space to do Good

People of faith need religious freedom to have the space to serve others. Oftentimes, religious liberty disputes arise when religious organizations are expected to sacrifice aspects of their faith in order to continue to serve the surrounding community. But it is our faith that inspires us to serve. Take the Little Sisters of the Poor, who live out their Christian faith by serving the elderly poor.

These women have had to seek protection from a regulation requiring them to facilitate access to contraceptives, including abortion-inducing drugs and devices. Or, consider adoption services run by Catholic Charities, which simply seek to place children in homes with a married mother and father. Due to the redefinition of marriage in civil law, many Catholic Charities and other faith-based adoption agencies around the country have been forced to end their adoption and foster care services.

Challenges to religious freedom often come from a mistaken view of religion, a view that sees religion as good only if it conforms to every value that happens to prevail today.

However, the good that religious institutions do is inseparable from the parts that challenge prevailing norms. Religious convictions hang together, in and out of season. When faith groups violate their consciences, they undermine the whole mission of their ministry. People of faith and faith-based organizations need space to make their unique contributions to the common good.

Authentic Pluralism

Skeptics are often concerned about the effects that religious organizations have on people who do not share those religious beliefs. Skeptics tend to see a conflict between religious freedom and their vi-

sion of equality and choose a mistaken concept of equality over freedom. These are certainly difficult issues. Here are points to consider:

- A pluralistic society makes space for people who hold views that run counter to the mainstream. Religious groups, and groups formed around a particular set of principles, need to be able to express their views with integrity. Should an animal rights organization be required by law to hire a member of a hunting association? Of course not. Then, for example, neither should a religious organization be required to hire people who oppose the teachings of that religion. It is crucial that our society not adopt the view that all groups – least of all religious groups – must conform to one view. True freedom results in a diversity that strengthens, rather than weakens, society.
- Some skeptics say that religious people impose their faith on others. However, when religious groups are accused of causing harm to others, the “harm” is often that they do not facilitate an action. The craft store chain Hobby Lobby refused to cover abortifacients for its employees. But Hobby Lobby is not preventing its employees from obtaining these devices. The Christian family that runs Hobby Lobby refuses to participate in an activity it believes is immoral.
- It is similar when family-owned businesses choose not to participate in same-sex weddings. For example, florist Barronelle Stutzman had served a customer she knew was in a same-sex relationship for almost a decade. However, she could not in good conscience create custom floral arrangements for the customer’s same-sex ceremony. She was happy to provide flowers for any other occasion but did not want to be forced to participate in a particular event that went against her Christian beliefs. The State of Washington sued Barronelle for declining to participate in an activity that went against her faith.
- Above all, the Church seeks to offer a better way. Catholic teaching is holistic, rooted in the dignity of the person, a dignity that is visible to reason yet made more clear by the light of the



gospel of Jesus Christ. We are not simply asking for freedom from coercion so that we can be left alone. We believe that what we teach – about marriage, sex, family life, care for refugees, care for the poor, care for the sick, care for all vulnerable – is good for society. When we see a culture that is often unloving and hostile to life, we work to bear witness to a healthier culture, a “civilization of love,” in which all people can flourish.

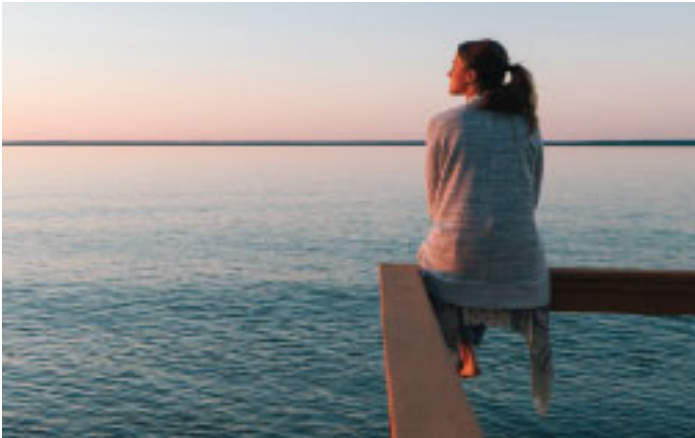
Own It

Three Steps to Vocational Discernment (Part two of a three part series)

The process of discovering that state in life to which God is calling you is known as vocational discernment. Vocation comes from the word “to call,” and your vocation is where God calls you to be and where you are needed most. This process applies to all life decisions—including everyday tasks, volunteer work, and political and civic responsibilities. However, in a special way, this process applies to one’s state in life, the place where God has called you to be in this world, for the rest of your life: marriage, consecrated life, or ordained ministry.

The Preparatory Document for the 2018 Synod on “Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment” outlined the discernment process in three basic steps: (1) Recognizing, (2) Interpreting, and (3) Choosing. What follows is a reflection on the second step of that process.

STEP 2: INTERPRETING

The second step, interpreting, refers to understanding what the Holy Spirit is calling you to do by acknowledging the stirrings of your heart and mind.

After recognizing what experiences have left an impression on you and reflecting on them, this second step in discernment is the discovery of why. “Why do I feel this way after spending time with my happily-married family member or friend?” “Why do I feel this way after talking with the reli-

gious at the vocations fair?” “Why do other people say that I could make a good priest?” Interpreting requires you to be honest with yourself, to look at your strengths, weaknesses, gifts, and limitations, and ask if they fit with the life you are considering.

Thinking that a certain vocation would be the “good” or “nice” thing to do is not mature discernment. This kind of honesty also takes into account the possibilities that are actually before you, rather than dreaming of something probably unattainable. In this stage of discernment, you may also ask yourself: “What are the demands of the Christian life in the concrete situation before me?”, “How is God calling me to use my gifts and talents for his glory and to bring others to salvation?”, and “What would God want for my life?”

Next Week we look at Step 3: Choosing.

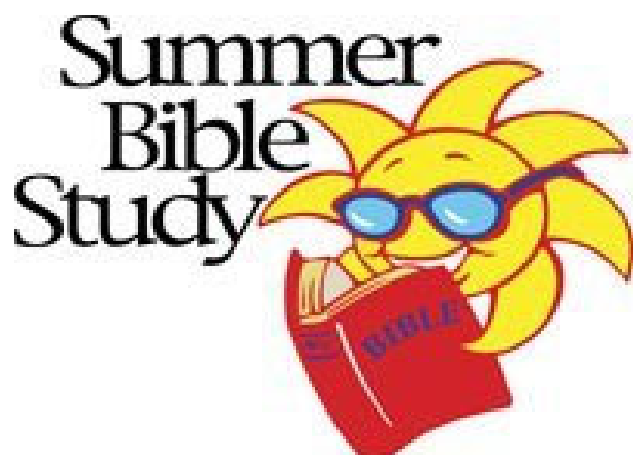

Children's Faith Formation (age 3 – grade 8)

We offer formation classes for children preparing for First Eucharist, Baptism (older than age 7), Continuing Formation (after receiving the sacraments), and the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program for children ages 3 to 5 (entering kindergarten).

The 2019-2020 season starts the week of September 17.

Times: 4:30 p.m. to 5:40 p.m.
and 6:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m.

Requirements:

- Parents or guardians are registered members of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish or a Catholic Parish in the Las Vegas Diocese. Regular attendance at Sunday Liturgy is part of the formation process.
- Registration fee is \$150.00 per child. No child will be turned away due to financial difficulty.
- Families must provide a Birth and Baptism Certificate and deposit at the time of registration. Sacrament preparation at SEAS is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and the parent throughout the formation years.

Sacraments:

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a two-year process for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason (7 years), are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil in their second year of preparation.

First Eucharist Initiation:

The two-year preparation process to celebrate First Eucharist teaches children about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The child and the parent will participate in retreats in their second year.

Continuing Formation:

Children in 3rd grade and higher who are baptized and have received First Eucharist will continue their formation in age appropriate classes. It is the practice of our faith that formation is ongoing and is a life-long journey.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):

This is a hands-on, interactive working environment where children are guided toward a greater understanding of God's love in their life. They encounter Jesus the Good Shepherd, who loves them, cares for them and knows them by name. Children are most sensitive to a relationship with God between the ages of 3-6. For this reason, we provide formal faith formation for young children.


