Mercy flows... Love redeems

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

THE HOLY EUCHARIST

This weekend we celebrate the great gift God has given us in the Holy Eucharist, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The Holy Eucharist is the Sacrament of UNITY! One of my favorite hymns from my childhood is *At That First Eucharist*. The refrain goes like this: *Thus may we all one bread, one body be, through this blest Sacrament of Unity.*

Every time we gather for Mass, we celebrate our unity with Christ **and** with one another. The Eucharistic celebration is not a “me and Jesus” moment, but an “us and Jesus” moment. When we come together united as brothers and sisters in the Lord, we give great testimony to our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist and our desire for unity with one another. Likewise, if we come together and harbor hatred against someone else we are divided and cannot witness any faith in the Real Presence nor even attain any sense of unity.

But, let's face the truth: we're all imperfect. At the beginning of Mass we ask God to have mercy on us because we humbly admit we're imperfect. Unfortunately, there are those members of the Body of Christ who want to condemn objective public sinners and keep them away from an encounter with Christ. When Christ was confronted with the woman caught in the act of adultery (an objective, public sinner), he said to her persecutors, “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.” (John 8:7) No one was able to throw a stone. So, none of us should be throwing stones either.

Let's think a little about the words the priest says at Mass before we receive the Holy Eucharist: “Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, **look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church,** and **graciously grant her peace and unity** in accordance with your will.”

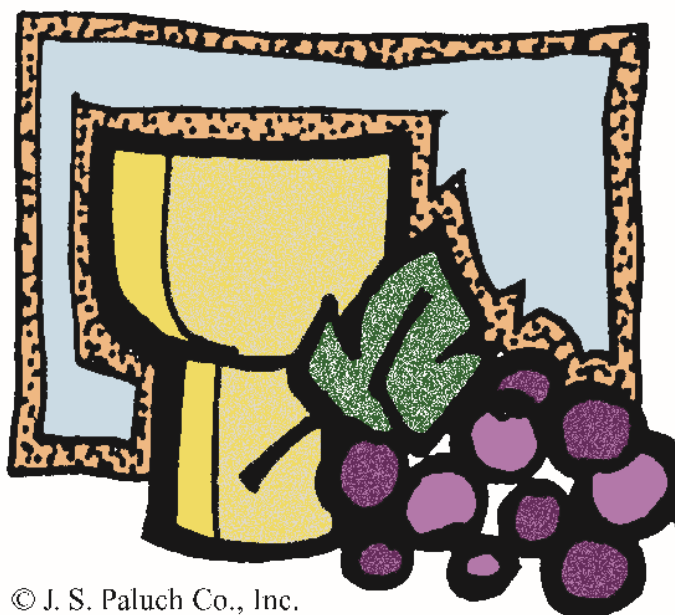
As we ask Jesus to **look not on our sins, but on our faith**, so **we should not look on anyone else's sins, but try to see their faith as well, however weak or strong it may be.** This humble attitude before Christ will help us attain **peace and unity**, which is the will of God for those gathered in God's name.

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, may we let the peace and unity of the Eucharist lead us to have hearts like Christ, not condemning, but showing love and mercy for everyone, without condition, without exception. *Thus may we all one bread, one body be, through this blest Sacrament of Unity.*

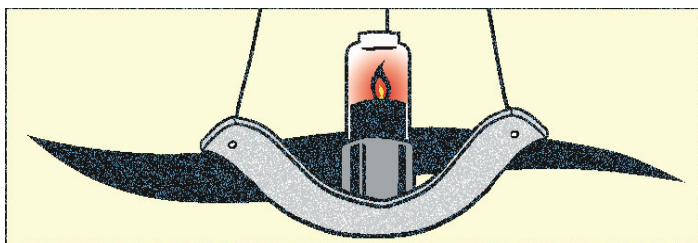

Feast of Faith

The *Corpus Christi* Procession

In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of *Corpus Christi*—the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—grew from Juliana's vision.

On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional *Corpus Christi* procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The *Corpus Christi* procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated—and to be lived.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Sacrifice

Today the Church focuses on the Eucharist. Today's readings remind us how connected to ancient blood sacrifices we are when offering our un-bloody sacrifice. The reading from Exodus describes a solemn ritual designed so the Israelites would never forget their covenant with God.

The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews turns us from those ancient animal sacrifices, the first efforts to worship the living God. Our sacrifice is the body and blood of the Son of God. Because of Christ we have a new covenant.

The Gospel from Mark retells the establishment of that covenant, the familiar story of the Last Supper. Juxtaposed with the story of animal sacrifice as it is here, we are challenged to listen with new attention, to remember the great price paid for our salvation. Jesus gave his body and every drop of his blood for us.

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Saint of the Week

Blessed Jolenta of Poland

1235 - 1298

Feast Day: June 12

The daughter of King Bela IV of Hungary and granddaughter of the emperor of Constantinople, this medieval princess was raised by her elder sister, St. Kunigunde, queen of Poland. Their family tree included other saints: Hedwig, Elizabeth of Hungary and Margaret of Hungary. Jolenta married a Polish duke whose charitable works earned him the popular name "Boleslaus the Pious." After his death in 1279 and the marriage of two daughters, Jolenta, Kunigunde, also now widowed, and Jolenta's youngest daughter entered a Poor Clares convent. Jolenta later became abbess of a convent she had founded with her husband. Also known as Helen of Poland and Yolanda of Poland, Jolenta was beatified in 1827.

A Day We Celebrate as the Body of Christ

This weekend, June 5 and 6, Catholics in the United States celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We used to call it the Feast of Corpus Christi ("Body of Christ"), a feast that celebrates Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist.

The feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. In much of the world, it is celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. In the United States it is celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday.

There are two major themes to this feast: the Body of Christ that is the Holy Eucharist and the Body of Christ that is our communion of faith, the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with us, his disciples. It is expressed in the New Testament by using the metaphor of a body in which Christ Jesus is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the rich diversity of our family of faith.

When we gather for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we become one with Christ, transformed by his loving gift. We become one with Christ in the person we may not know sitting next to us in the pew; in the crowds walking in Eucharistic processions in the Philippines; in the victims of parish bombings while at Mass in Nigeria; in the young Polish students getting ready for World Youth Day; and in the Peruvian children receiving Holy Communion for the first time, singing "Somos el Cuerpo de Cristo"/"We Are the Body of Christ."

The feast encourages us to embrace the Eucharistic reality that although we may be strangers shar-

ing the one Lord's table wherever we are, we are one, just as the many grains of wheat make up one loaf of bread, and the many grapes make up the shared wine in the Lord's cup of blessing. There should be a genuine connection between what we do in the Eucharistic celebration and the attitudes we embrace and the actions we take in our public and private lives. In the Eucharist, Christ has given us a share of God's mercy and hospitality. Let us pray that God will show us the way to unity through our devotion to Christ in the Eucharist so that we can offer a more genuinely compelling and fruitful witness to a world in need of God's love and compassion.

A Stewardship Moment

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today's Gospel gives St. Mark's account of Jesus gathering his disciples for a last supper, revealing to them a new covenant established through his own blood that would be poured out as a sacrifice for them. Every time we participate in the Eucharist, we make a pledge to renew and deepen our participation in Christ's covenant in practical ways. For those who exercise stewardship of Christ's covenant, that means making daily, personal sacrifices to strengthen this covenant relationship such as deepening our relationship with the Lord in prayer, supporting our parish, and giving comfort to the poor and those who suffer. As we begin to see our way out of the COVID pandemic, it is a good time to reflect on how we might renew and strengthen our covenant with the Lord and our community in practical ways.

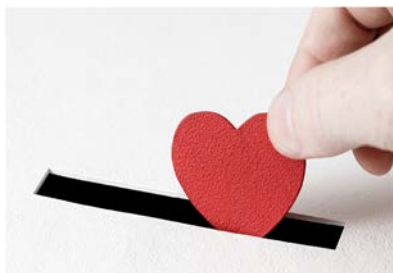

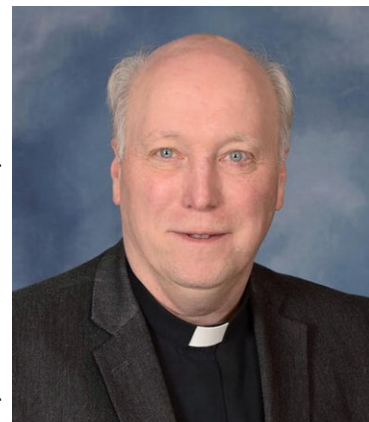

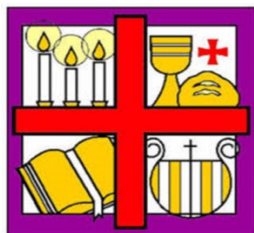
About the Speaker

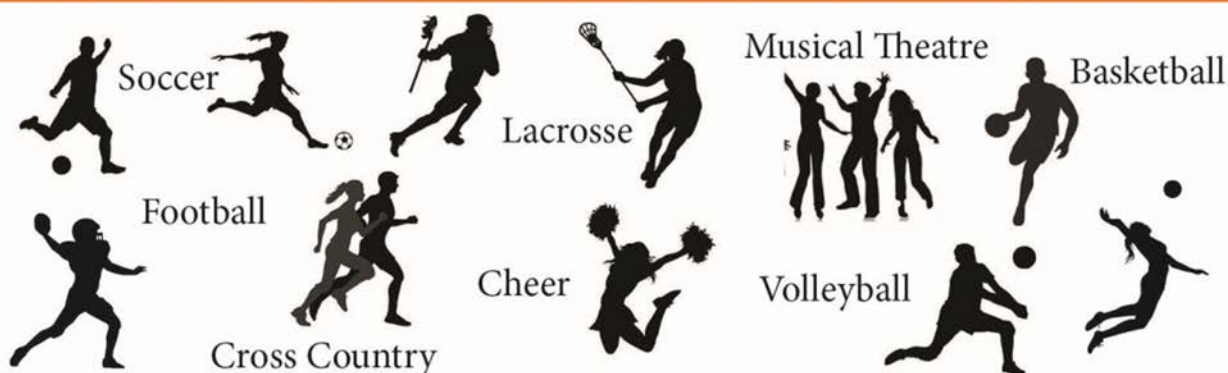
