A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Pentecost is a very special day for all Christians. Today we celebrate the feast of the third person of the Most Holy Trinity-The Feast of the Holy Spirit. Today we remember the event of giving and receiving the Holy Spirit in the early Church. The Spirit lives on in the Church in each of us who are members of the Body of Christ, given different gifts from the same Spirit. Only after Pentecost could the apostles look back and understand what Jesus meant when he said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." We call it the birthday of the Church.

Today is also a very special day because we welcome four adults into full communion with the Church: Sheila Hanna, Darin Hess, Pam O'Halloran, and William Rain. These individuals, who were baptized in another Christian denomination, will profess their faith in the Catholic Church, be confirmed, and receive the Eucharist. We congratulate them for their courage and willingness to embrace Catholicism. We also congratulate Kayla Yabut who was unable to be confirmed with the rest of her class last month. Today she will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. I want to thank Pastoral Associate Marcie Wilske, Deacon Steve Doucet, and the entire RCIA team for sharing their faith, gifts, and time with the newest members of the Church. We are grateful to them and to the entire Faith Formation Department for all they do to build up the Body of Christ.

Pentecost usually marks the beginning of summer for most of our Faith Formation programs. Most sessions have concluded for the year and registrations are now being accepted for 2019-2020. Our summer adult Bible Study programs are in full swing, and our Youth Ministry Department is gearing up for two Vacation Bible School programs, youth trips, and a five-day mission retreat for junior high youth. Although it may seem like things are winding down, it will be a very busy summer with a lot of time spent planning for the year ahead.

Whether it is through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults/Children (RCIA or RCIC) or Children's Faith Formation, through Bible Study or Young Adult Ministry, all of these opportunities are provided to our parishioners to deepen their faith in

Christ and to go out in the world glorifying God by their lives.

Being formed in our faith is a life-long process and journey. It is not something to "take a vacation from." As you make plans for your summer travel, think about where you will celebrate the Sacraments. Plan ahead to include time for celebrating the Sacraments and spending time in the presence of Christ. How much time will you spend reading and reflecting on the Word of God? Will you spend time in prayer? How will you increase your knowledge of Christ? Just talking about our faith makes it grow. As we come to realize how much God has done for us and how close he is to us, we will want to share that with others.

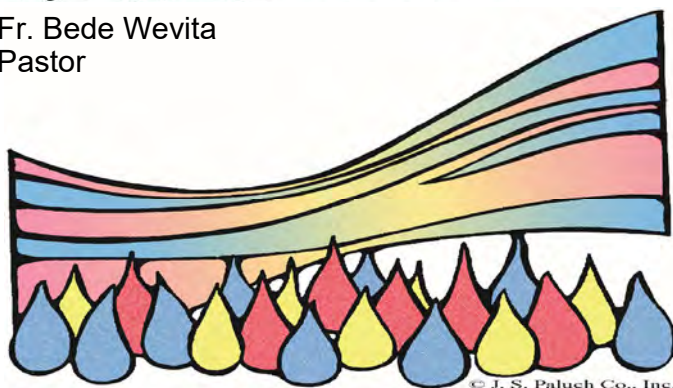

Reconciled Diversity

A few years ago, during Rome's quiet summer, Pope Francis took a day off to visit privately with some old friends, whose identity took Catholic Italy by surprise: Evangelical Protestants. They welcomed Francis to their Pentecostal Church of Reconciliation, where Francis asked pardon for Catholic persecutions and celebrated the Holy Spirit's "Pentecostal work." Unlike Satan, declared Francis, who creates division among God's children, the Holy Spirit creates a diversity rich and beautiful. And unity; not uniformity, Francis specified, but unity in diversity. Francis named the Spirit's gift "reconciled diversity." Pentecost's rich treasury of scriptural readings, for Saturday's vigil and Sunday's morning liturgy, traces the Holy Spirit's work from creation's beginning, through Jesus' resurrection, into the Church's earliest days, now into our days. Kindled in our hearts, the Spirit's gentle fire is ours to share generously, even with those most strikingly different from us. All hearts are Spirit-warmed by reconciled diversity.

Can we do it? With \$722,225 already pledged as of June 5, we are well on our way!

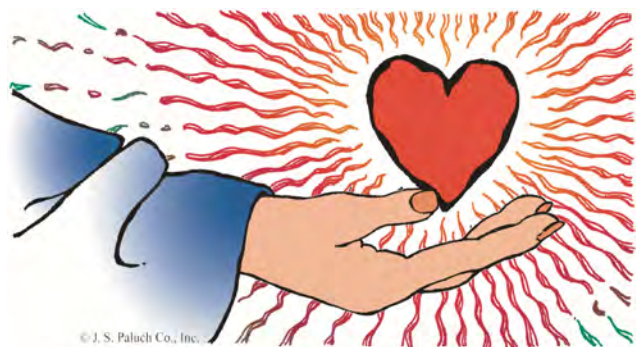

Treasures From Our Tradition

Today we are at the fiftieth day of the Easter celebration: seven weeks of seven days, a week of weeks, now culminating in a festival fiftieth day. While the liturgical color of the Easter season is gold, on this last day we have red. For the first thousand years of the church, there were no firm rules for using colors. Only wealthy churches could afford a full array of colors, and most places used the best vestments, no matter the color, for the greatest feasts. The Church spelled out an exact plan for color, including red for Pentecost, only in 1570, but local differences held on until the 1800s.

Color experts tell us that red is a hot color, best used for fast-paced, upbeat, active experiences. It is hard to be neutral before red, as any matador will tell you. It invites commitment and draws you in. It is a stimulating color, engaging the eye, stirring hunger. It is the most fitting color for this day when we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit into our lives, a dynamic presence overturning neutrality in favor of passion and commitment.

Saint of the Week

St. Barnabas

First Century

Feast Day - June 11

The story of this early missionary, a Cypriot Jew called Joseph, is told in the Acts of the Apostles. He was named Barnabas (son of encouragement) by the Twelve Apostles when he sold property and gave them the money (4:36-37). He introduced the convert Paul to the apostles (9:27), was officially sent by the Jerusalem Church to Antioch (11:22-26), was set apart with Paul by the Spirit for a mission to Cyprus (13:2), attended the Council of Jerusalem (15:12), and returned to Cyprus with Mark (15:36-41). By tradition, he was martyred there.

In those days a great number who believed turned to the Lord. The news about them reached the ears of the Church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to go to Antioch. When he arrived and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced and encouraged them all to remain faithful to the Lord in firmness of heart, for he was a good man, filled with the Holy Spirit and faith (Acts 11: 21-24).

Living The Faith

The Bigger Picture of Pentecost

There are four accounts in Scripture that describe the apostles after Jesus' ascension.

- Matthew 28:19 has the apostles going forth to make disciples of all nations.
- Mark 16:20 says that the apostles "went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs" sending them throughout the world proclaiming "eternal salvation."
- Luke 24:52-53 says the apostles returned to Jerusalem proclaiming Jesus and praising God in the temple.
- And the most detailed presentation is found in Acts 1 and 2, which describes the election of a new apostle to replace Judas Iscariot and the effects of the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

In each of these four passages, the followers of Jesus are seen as strong, courageous and determined messengers. They have no doubt that they have been charged by Jesus to proclaim the Good News to the world.

Nowhere after the ascension is there any indication that they were afraid to appear in public, and we see that the coming of the Holy Spirit gave them the courage to take up Jesus' mission. What Acts tells us is that when the tongues of fire came to rest on them, they became able to speak languages they did not know.

In reading the account in the Bible, it is important to understand the context as well as the words used. Note that Acts 2:5-11 describes a great festival where "devout Jews from every nation under heaven" were gathered in Jerusalem. This festival is Shavuot, which Judaism still celebrates.

The original Pentecost coincided with Shavuot. Devout Jews from many different countries would have gathered to offer the first fruits of their harvest in the temple. What a perfect opportunity to get the message of Jesus' death and resurrection, the Good News of faith, out to a worldwide audience.

From this background we can begin to understand and appreciate the bigger picture of Pentecost. The gift of the Holy Spirit, symbolized by the tongues of fire, was the ability to share this message so that others could understand it.

Pentecost, then, was the first true example of "enculturation," which is the word the Church uses to describe its efforts to proclaim the Gospel everywhere in such a way that it can be heard and understood by the listener.

That is the story of Pentecost in Acts: the apostles were compelled to spread the Good News to everyone, everywhere.

For Christians, the coming of the Spirit marks the start of the Church's efforts to proclaim the Gospel to everyone throughout the entire world, no matter what language they speak. For Christians, Pentecost confirms the completion of what once was and the beginning of all things new.

The question for Christians today is this: How do we proclaim the Gospel now so that people today will hear it, understand it, and have their hearts set on fire by it?

Stewards of the Church in the 21st Century

As we approach Pentecost, we anticipate an event so powerful that even after two thousand years it is hard to fully grasp its impact. The transforming nature of the Holy Spirit raised up a small group of courageous disciples to carry the mission and message of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth. Proclaiming their encounter with the risen Lord without church buildings, budgets, a catechism or technology, they were directed to steward the loving, forgiving and hopeful message of Jesus Christ to the world. The life-altering result of their early ministry brought the small early Christian community to a worldwide Church that numbers in the billions.

It is interesting to consider the journey of faith taken by these early disciples in light of the words of the United States bishops in their pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, in describing what Christian stewards do. To say that these disciples received God's gift of the Good News of Jesus gratefully, nurtured it together with passion and faithfulness responsibly, shared it generously at the risk of losing their lives and returned to God

in abundance is truly an understatement. How did they spread the Gospel in dangerous times with so little at their disposal?

Imagining what it might be like to sit with Mary of Magdala, Peter, Paul, Priscilla and Aquila and a few other brave and faithful disciples around a table, I cannot help but believe that they might encourage us to go back to our roots and announce the Good News to our neighbors with courage, passion and trust.

Our Church has been blessed with longevity and a rich deposit of faith. Pope Francis, however, reminds us that our first responsibility is to share the kerygma, that foundational proclamation of our faith, with everyone we encounter. Jesus loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side every day to enlighten, strengthen and free you. This "Good News" should be imbedded deeply in the hearts and expressed passionately on the lips of every Christian steward of the 21st century Church. For many of us, the pontiff's constant reminder has been an incredible shift in the way we understand what it means to be a disciple. If we reflect, however, on our efforts to speak the Good News aloud, it is always accompanied by the presence and blessing of the Holy Spirit. What might the early disciples say? Perhaps it would be: "Brothers and sisters in Christ, be brave and speak up! It is your turn!"

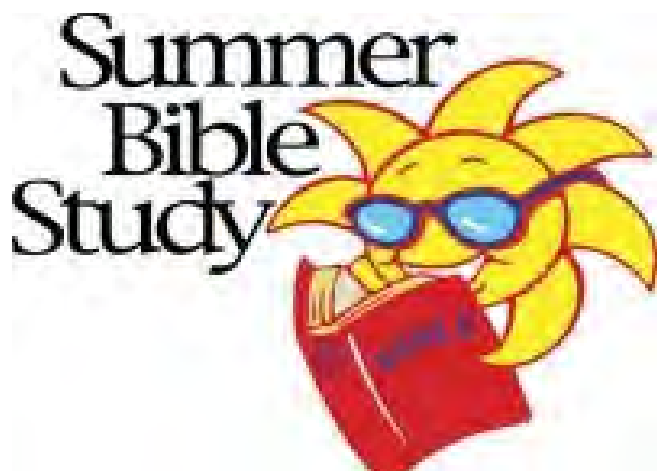

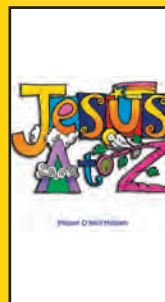

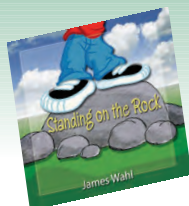
