

A Letter from Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

THANKS FOR YOUR UNDERSTANDING AND COOPERATION

I was so very humbled by the vast majority of you who complied so humbly with the precautions we are trying to take to help keep us safe from the coronavirus. Nothing is ever full-proof, but I think the steps we have taken as requested by the Diocese of Las Vegas is the best we can do now. Other dioceses throughout the United States have taken similar measures, some more and some less depending on their local situations. So, I just want to thank you for making my life easier through your understanding and cooperation. This past weekend showed that we, as a parish community, have real concern not only for our own well-being, but for that of others as well.

I have to say, in reference to the request of receiving Communion in the hand, that in my nearly 21 years of priesthood, I have never experienced a whole congregation receiving Communion in the hand so properly and so reverently. It's difficult in the city of Las Vegas to have such unity at our time of Holy Communion all the time because we have so many people from all over the world, bringing their local customs with them. But last weekend showed a beautiful unity in how the greater good of care for others was foremost on everyone's mind. Even one of our Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist said to me, "Father, this was the first time that giving Holy Communion was so easy!" Let's remember that the request of receiving the Eucharist in the hand will remain in effect until we hear otherwise from our Bishop.

TIMING IS EVERYTHING

This weekend we are publishing the schedule of all the events that comprise our celebrations of Holy Week, the Sacred Paschal Triduum and Easter Sunday. From my childhood to this very day, those three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday are the best days of the year. The liturgies of the Sacred Paschal Triduum are one continuous liturgy spread over three days: The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper begins on Holy Thursday evening; Good Friday Celebrations of the Lord's Passion usually take place at Noon (the traditional time of the crucifixion of Christ) or at 3PM (the traditional time of the death of Christ); the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night always takes place after sunset on Holy Saturday.

Therefore, the timing of the liturgies coincides with the timing of the events in the passion of Christ.

I was always taught from my earliest days how important it was for us to try to attend ALL the services of the Sacred Paschal Triduum. It was drilled into us that, as Christ suffered so much for us, we should make whatever sacrifices are necessary to accompany him on his journey. None of our sacrifices could ever compare with the ultimate sacrifice of Christ for us! The timing of the services coincided with the traditional times of the events of Christ's sacrifice for us. It was never even thought of that they would be celebrated at times that were merely convenient for us. Some even made the great sacrifice to take a vacation day on Good Friday so that they could attend the services usually at Noon or 3PM. If you were lucky enough, you might have an employer that would give you Good Friday afternoon off so you could attend the various religious services of your tradition. I'd like to know if any of your employers gives time off on Good Friday for you to attend religious services. If there are any, could you please let me know their name and address so I can send them a Thank You note for their consideration? You can leave that information in the Parish Office to my attention.

This year we are returning to offering the official liturgies of the Sacred Paschal Triduum at the traditional times to coincide with the events of Christ's suffering, passion and death. These times will not be convenient for all. For example, many of our seniors will not be able to attend the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday or the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night because they fear to leave home or return home when it is dark. Some will not be able to attend the Celebrations of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday because they cannot get off from work. We will, however, offer an abbreviated version of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday at Noon (the traditional time of the crucifixion of Christ) for the benefit of those who can come during their lunch hour. The full version will be celebrated at 3PM (the traditional time of the death of Christ).

For those who would like to commemorate the time that Christ was in the tomb and evil seemed to have been victorious, we will offer a special Tenebrae Service (Latin for "darkness") at 7PM on Good Friday. While not an official part of the Sacred Paschal Triduum and no Communion is given, this



Thirst

Each time today's Gospel story is read, I can't help but think of the many television commercials I've seen depicting perspiring athletes lifting a beverage to their lips while the scorching sun beats down on them. Our culture has definite ideas about how to guench thirst. Today, those ideas are turned upside down. The Samaritan woman operates, initially, on the TV commercial level. She asks Jesus for the flowing water so that she will not have to keep coming to the well. Jesus then talks about what real thirst is, and how he, and he alone, can guench that thirst. Lent calls us to find those places deep within ourselves where we thirst. In our thirst, as did the Israelites, we cry out to God asking for springs of living water. Deep down we know that only the Lord can satisfy these thirsts.



Saint of the Week

St. Joseph,
Spouse of the Blessed
Virgin Mary
First Century
Solemnity - March 19

The spouse of Mary the mother of Jesus and the legal father of Jesus according to Jewish law, Joseph is a model of humility and obedience to God's will. He followed God's instructions, given by angels in dreams, and took the pregnant Mary into his home as his wife, protected her and Jesus at the

child's birth in Bethlehem through the family's sojourn in Egypt and provided for them as a carpenter in Nazareth. This feast, which was celebrated locally as early as the ninth century, became a universal feast in the fifteenth century, when it was placed on the liturgical calendar. Pope Pius IX named St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church in 1870; he is also the patron saint of carpenters, the dying and workers.

"Being a guardian is the distinctive trait of Joseph: Being the guardian is his great mission . . . We look to Joseph as the model educator, who watches over and accompanies Jesus as he grows 'in wisdom, age and grace,' as the Gospel says. He was not Jesus' father: the father of Jesus was God, but he was a father to Jesus, he was a father to Jesus in order to help him grow. And how did he help him grow? In wisdom, age and grace."


At the Easter Vigil we will welcome our newest members into the Roman Catholic Church: those who

Fact of Faith

Lenten Almsgiving

In his 2018 Message for Lent, Pope Francis said, "Almsgiving sets us free from greed and helps us to regard our neighbor as a brother or sister. What I possess is never mine alone. . . . When we give alms, we share in God's providential care for each of his children. If through me God helps someone today, will he not tomorrow provide for my own needs? For no one is more generous than God."

During Lent, Catholics prepare for the celebration of Easter by observing a penitential season of repentance, renewal and on-going conversion. Lent calls us back to the basics of our faith, acknowledging that we are all sinners, all in need of God's grace. Traditionally, Lent has been a time of renewed prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Of these three disciplines, almsgiving is probably the least well understood. After all, works of charity and giving to the poor are supposed to be part of how we live in every season. But, just as Lent asks more of our prayer, it also asks more of our generosity.

For many people, fasting and almsgiving are connected disciplines. The point of fasting, after all, isn't merely that we eat less, it could also mean that others can eat more, specifically those who live in poverty and hunger. One very popular Lenten almsgiving program is provided by Catholic Relief Services. It's called Operation Rice Bowl. The core of the program is a cardboard bowl. During Lent, we're encouraged to put our alms in the Rice Bowl. Seventy-five percent of the funds col-

lected go to hunger relief programs around the world, and the remaining twenty-five percent stay in your local Catholic diocese to aid local hunger programs. Learn more about Operation Rice Bowl at the Catholic Relief Services website: orb.crs.org. They have resources for individuals, families, teachers and catechists, and for parishes.

However you choose to give to the poor this Lent, whether you're giving of your time, talent or treasure, this season can be an important time of spiritual renewal. Part of how we're renewed is by acknowledging the many ways that God has blessed us and sharing those blessings with the poor and marginalized.

Scrutinies

Every time we celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism, we ask the questions, "Do you renounce Satan? And all his works? And all his empty promises?" These are serious questions. We should consider them carefully before answering. And that is what the elect, those preparing to be baptized at the Easter Vigil, spend much of Lent doing.


For those who are making their final preparation for Baptism, Lent is a time of purification and enlightenment. They examine their lives in the light of God's word and ask the entire Christian community to pray that whatever is weak and sinful within them may be eliminated and that whatever is good and holy may be affirmed. And we do. After the homily, in a litany of intercession, we proclaim the power of Jesus over all sin. Then we pray over the elect for their deliverance, and strengthening. The presider, catechists, sponsors and other members of the community also may lay their hands on the heads of the elect in an ancient sign of forgiveness, healing and empowerment.

And because the entire community will renew its Baptismal promises at Easter, we too examine our life in light of God's word. Of course, this is something we should be doing throughout the year, but we focus on this self-examination in a special way during Lent. In every community that will baptize adults or older children at the Easter Vigil, special rites known as the "scrutinies" are celebrated at liturgy on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent.

On the Sundays, the Gospel readings are from the Gospel of John; they are the stories of the Samaritan woman whom Jesus meets at Jacob's well, the healing and coming to faith of the man born

blind and the raising of Lazarus from the dead. These readings have been used for centuries to prepare the elect and the Church for baptism. The readings focus on sin and redemption using the images of thirst and water, darkness and light, death and life. By examining ourselves through these readings, we come to know how we have become parched, how we have been blinded, how we have become deadened through sin. When we and the elect are asked at Easter to renounce Satan, evil works and empty promises, our answer can be a thoughtful, strong and heartfelt "I do."

The Coming of Spring: A Time for Hope

This year the spring season begins on Friday, March 20, just three weeks before the great Easter Triduum begins. One of the first readings of the spring season gives us hope, for it reminds us of the Lord's return. Just as the earth shows an early sign of renewal, the prophet Hosea pledges that the Lord will return to heal us, bind our wounds, revive and renew us. "He will come to us like the rain, like the spring rain that waters the earth" (Hosea 6:1-6).


For some people, Lent is a gloomy time. Perhaps a childhood memory of deprivation, with no real understanding of the reason for the sacrifice, clouds their memory of Lent. Perhaps for some Catholics, thoughts of the terrible suffering and death of Jesus overshadows and depresses their Lenten observance. For some, after a purposeful march to the altar to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, the discipline of Lent fades.

Not so for the Christian steward. Good stewards remain faithful to the discipline of the Lenten season, but they also remain hopeful with a deep sense of joy. After all, what is Lent but a reminder of our salvation? What is Lent but the harbinger of the Life that conquered all death? It's not an accident that Lent occurs just as we begin to realize, at least for those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, that once again, the light and color of spring are returning.

In the midst of our Lenten discipline, the prophet means to comfort us. Just as the spring rains begin to fall, the promise of Easter's joy will soon be upon us. It is indeed a time of hope as the prophet encourages us to return to the Lord as well (Hos 6:1).

As Lent begins, we may struggle through cold and ice, in our world and in our hearts. But as Easter nears, the delicate leaves of crocuses and daffodils speak of Resurrection. Lent demands discipline, but it also inspires hope. As faithful stewards of the Gospel message, we know how the story ends!


A Stewardship Moment
