



A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends,

We are now a month into the Catholic Stewardship Appeal (CSA) and I would like to thank everyone who has made a pledge so far. As you know, this vear our parish assessment is \$287.580. As of March 13, 392 families have pledged a total of \$188,406. We are well on our way to reaching our goal, and through your abundant generosity I believe we can exceed it! CSA is unique in the sense that it offers us innumerable ways to reach out to those in need in our community through diocesan ministries and programs, but it also gives us the opportunity to give back to our parish once our diocesan assessment is met. If you have yet to make a pledge, I ask you to prayerfully consider what your family can afford. Please know, whatever size gift you give will be greatly appreciated! If you find you are unable to financially support CSA this year, please pray for it to flourish

I also ask you to pray for members of our parish, youth ministry, staff and Religious Education Department as they attend this week's Los Angeles Religious Education Conference (RECONGRESS) in Anaheim, Calif. This annual event is sponsored by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles Office of Religious Education and is the nation's largest annual gathering of Roman Catholics, with nearly 40,000 in attendance last year. This year, RECONGRESS will begin with Youth Day on March 21 when young people will gather for a rally, keynote, liturgy, workshops, and music geared especially for them. The following three days will offer the same, but on a much larger scale, for all ages, with workshop topics ranging from personal growth, to music, to spirituality. Please prav for the safety of all who will be traveling to participate in this uplifting and educational event.

As we continue through the season of Lent, please take advantage of the Lenten activities offered at our parish. As you may have heard, the Knights of Columbus Fish Fry the first Friday of Lent was so successful they had to run out in the middle of dinner service to buy more fish. Nearly 300 meals were served! Thank you to all who came out, and a special thank you to those who patiently waited for more fish to arrive! The Knights assure us they will have more than enough fish as they continue sponsoring the Fish Fry at 5:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall all Fridays of Lent. After your fish dinner, please come over to the church at 6:30 p.m. for Taize Prayer Service followed by Stations of the Cross. This is a great way to finish our busy weeks during the season of Lent.



Stand Firm in the Lord

It is not hard to imagine, in this age of wars, evil groups bent on the destruction of humanity, and political follies, that the words of Saint Paul were so accurate, even for his time. It seems that the world never changes. Paul says, "Many . . . conduct themselves as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is their destruction ... Their minds are occupied with earthly things" (Philippians 3:18, 19). The result is the destruction of innocent people and of the Earth itself. But Paul says to the Philippians, "our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (3:20). He will "change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body" (3:21). Note that he says "body" rather than "bodies." He is talking about the whole community of believers, who, following the example of Jesus and of Paul, will come into the glory of God. So "stand firm in the Lord" (4:1).

Treasures From Our Tradition

Often, when a family keeps vigil around a person who is preparing for death, they may notice three interwoven activities. First, the dying person may become more prayerful and reflective than ever before, reviewing life's journey in gratitude to God, or seeking forgiveness and making amends for wrongs. Second, as death approaches, the need to eat and drink is lessened until even an ice cube brushed against the lips is satisfying. Third, persons who are dying often make plans to give their possessions away, making bequests, handing treasures down, providing for favorite charities.

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving: with these three "pillars" of Lent, we rehearse our death every year in this season, and anticipate the final work we will do in this life. And every year, at the end of our journey, is the joy of Easter and the experience of the victory of Christ over death's darkness and power. Annually, we remind ourselves that the Christian experiences the same power and presence at the end of life's journey: Christ to the rescue and the lasting joy of heaven.

God's Gift of Forgiveness

A Pastoral Exhortation on the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

"Peace be with you!" With these words, the Risen Lord greeted his frightened Apostles in the Upper Room on the day of his Resurrection. They were troubled, anxious, and fearful—much like each one of us at some point in our lives. Christ repeated the words, "Peace be with you." But then he added, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them" (Jn 20:19-23). What an extraordinary gift! The Risen Lord was proclaiming that all the suffering he had just endured was in order to make available the gifts of salvation and forgiveness. He wanted the Apostles to receive these gifts. He wanted them to become apostles of this forgiveness to others.

In the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, also called confession, we meet the Lord, who wants to grant forgiveness and the grace to live a renewed life in him. In this sacrament, he prepares us to receive him free from serious sin, with a lively faith, earnest hope, and sacrificial love in the Eucharist. The Church sees confession as so important that she requires that every Catholic go at least once a year.¹ The Church also encourages frequent confession in order to grow closer to Christ Jesus and his Body, the Church. By the grace of the Holy Spirit, we seek forgiveness and repentance, let go of patterns of sin, grow in the life of virtue, and witness to a joyful conversion. Since the graces of the sacrament are so similar to the purpose of the New Evangelization, Pope Benedict XVI has said, "The New Evangelization . . . begins in the confessional!"²

We bishops and priests are eager to help you if you experience difficulty, hesitation, or uncertainty about approaching the Lord in this sacrament. If you have not received this healing sacrament in a long time, we are ready to welcome you. We, whom Christ has ordained to minister this forgiveness in his name, are also approaching this sacrament, as both penitents and ministers, throughout our lives and at this special moment of grace during Lent. We want to offer ourselves to you as forgiven sinners seeking to serve in the Lord's name.

During Lent—in addition to the various penitential services during which individual confession takes place—we bishops and priests will be making ourselves available often for the individual celebration of this sacrament. We pray that through the work of the Holy Spirit, all Catholics—clergy and laity will respond to the call of the New Evangelization to encounter Christ in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Come to the Lord and experience the extraordinary grace of his forgiveness!

Saint of the Week

St. Joseph, Spouse of the **Blessed Virgin Mary First Century** Solemnity - March 19

The spouse of Mary the mother of Jesus and the legal father of Jesus according to Jewish law, Joseph is a model of humility and obedience to God's will. He followed God's instructions, giv-

en by angels in dreams, and took the pregnant Mary into his home as his wife, protected her and Jesus at the child's birth in Bethlehem through the family's sojourn in Egypt, and provided for them as a carpenter in Nazareth. This feast, which was celebrated locally as early as the ninth century, became a universal feast in the fifteenth century, when it was placed on the liturgical calendar. Pope Pius IX named St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church in 1870; he is also the patron saint of carpenters, the dying, and workers.

"Being a guardian is the distinctive trait of Joseph: Being the guardian is his great mission . . . We look to Joseph as the model educator, who watches over and accompanies Jesus as he grows 'in wisdom, age and grace,' as the Gospel says. He was not Jesus' father: the father of Jesus was God, but he was a father to Jesus, he was a father to Jesus in order to help him grow. And how did he help him grow? In wisdom, age and grace. " -Pope Francis, March 19, 2014

Forty Days, Forty Ways

Exercise Good Stewardship of Lent and Easter

Are you looking for ideas to help you with your Lenten experience? Here are 40 ideas to fill the 40 days of Lent and the beginning of the Easter season.

- 1. Attempt a more intentional prayer life—start a habit in the morning and before bedtime.
- 2. Attend Taize Prayer Service to meditate on your relationship with God.
- 3. Make a prayer basket at home—slips of paper or construction paper hearts (invite kids to participate) writing names or intentions that each person around the table picks out before each meal.
- 4. Attend a weekday Mass.
- 5. Pray the rosary.
- 6. Make a point of experiencing the sacrament of reconciliation at the beginning and end of Lent. Consider inviting someone who's been away from the sacrament to join you.
- 7. Pray for someone with whom you are out of touch.
- 8. Give up meat on Fridays but don't substitute lobster—make fasting something that is truly sacrificial.
- 9. Resolve to stop engaging in rumors, gossip, and negative chatter that devalues others.
- 10. Begin and end each week with an email thanking someone for all that they do.

- 11. Be sure to say grace at any restaurant you frequent (don't dodge making the Sign of the Cross either).
- 12. Buy a cup of coffee for someone living on the street but not until you learn their name and exchange in some conversation.
- 13. Pray before the Blessed Sacrament.
- 14. Reconcile with someone you've hurt or aren't speaking to.
- 15. Invite someone who's been away from the Church to attend Mass with you.
- 16. Make a gift to a charitable cause—make it a sacrificial gift.
- 17. Attend a parish or diocesan event centered on faith issues.
- 18. Thank a bishop, priest or member of a religious congregation for their public witness—invite them out for coffee or a meal.
- 19. Learn about the life of a saint, perhaps your parish saint.
- 20. Visit someone who's alone.
- 21. Reflect on the most pressing challenges confronting our Church and pray for a Spirit-filled response.
- 22. Pray for our Holy Father, Pope Francis.
- 23. Attend the Stations of the Cross.
- 24. Send a note of encouragement to a person participating in your parish's RCIA program.
- 25. Find out how your diocese is involved in refugee resettlement and see how you can help.
- 26. Attend your parish's Good Friday liturgy,



- 27. Make time for family activities that are faithrelated such as reading the Bible as a family.

- 30. Embrace periods of silence in each day.
- 31. Attend a parish mission or Lenten Retreat; invite others to join you.
- 32. Offer to be part of the church preparation crew or cleanup crew for the Easter Triduum liturgies.
- 33. Commit to a parish ministry or try a different ministry than the one in which you are current-ly engaged.
- 34. Cut your media consumption to open time for prayer or scripture reading. Start and end each day free from the influence of the media.
- 35. Attend a Friday fish fry at your parish with friends or co-workers. It's not the healthiest meal, but a fun Catholic tradition to join others and help you abstain from eating meat on Fridays during Lent.
- 36. Find a form of Lenten fast appropriate for your age and state of health.
- 37. Buy a book of daily spiritual reflections, keep it by your bed and read it upon rising or retiring or both.
- 38. Dedicate a portion of your time during Lent to serve others such as working at a soup kitchen or homeless shelter.

About our Capital Campaign

How can I make a pledge to the campaign? Can I pledge over time?

Our campaign offers a wide range of gift opportunities to participate at all levels. You may choose a plan that provides you with both flexibility and time to complete the payment of your pledge. Because our needs are urgent, we encourage you to complete your pledge within three years.

Is my pledge legally binding? Will it be confidential?

A pledge is a gift—one you consider to be meaningful to you. It is not legally binding. All we ask is that you do your best and advise us of any financial changes that will impact your pledge. All pledges will be kept confidential. Only the people responsible for maintaining the records will have access to your pledge.

Do we have long-term maintenance budgeted? If not, is our parish providing adequate reserves for building maintenance?

At the present time, we have a yearly maintenance budget, but we do not have a long-term maintenance budget, nor do we have a long-term maintenance fund reserve.

There was a general understanding from the former administration that, if needed, we would fund over-budgeted yearly maintenance expenses with money from our savings (which currently holds a balance of \$600,000) and then immediately replenish the savings through weekly offertory donations. However, as a result of the CARA Parish Life Survey, we created a Facilities/Grounds and Maintenance subcommittee to address our maintenance needs. The committee consists of a general contractor, an architect, a UNLV professor and the SEAS maintenance staff. We are all in agreement that a long-term maintenance fund must be implemented.

So far, the committee has addressed the need to resurface the parking lot (which was completed last summer), and has acquired estimates for the repair of—and in some areas replacement of—the parish and school roofs. The committee also advises that money be set aside for impending repairs or replacement of our 49 aging campus air conditioning units. Some parishioners were under the impression we wanted to replace all the units at one time, but we will only repair or replace each unit as needed through deferred (withheld until needed) maintenance.

Although we take up a monthly collection for a maintenance fund, it only brings in about \$60,000 a year. This fund goes toward maintaining both the campus grounds and buildings. Our parish campus covers 13 acres and includes a church, school, chapel and parish hall. In a given year, it costs roughly \$130,000 to maintain just the church and parish hall. This is simple maintenance consisting of day-to-day repairs, pest control, land-scaping, plumbing services and other professional services. A budget of \$50,000 was allocated for school maintenance for the 2018-2019 school year. We have already exceeded it.

What is the financial relationship between the parish and our school?

Our church and school have separate operating budgets and separate accounts, but because the Catholic education we provide through our school is a ministry of our parish (parochial school) we subsidize it.

Why is our school an important ministry that we should support—whether we have a connection to the school or not?

Other than the sacramental liturgies, our 2nd largest ministry is Catholic education. Out of all the titles Jesus could have taken while performing his public ministry, "rabbi" or "teacher" was the one he took. The Church has carried on this ministry of teaching through the Catholic education provided

in parochial, or parish schools. We continue that tradition of offering a Catholic education here at our parish.

In the United States, the first Catholic school was started by our patroness, Elizabeth Ann Seton. It was a free Catholic school for girls in Emmittsburg, Maryland. That first school began our present-day Catholic school system. Education based in the teachings of Jesus Christ help form good, faithbased citizens who not only benefit our parish, but our society as a whole.




