WE ENTER THIS HOLIEST OF WEEKS

With this Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, we enter into the most solemn week of the entire liturgical year! There's something special in the heart of anyone who makes a sincere effort to try to be present for the Sacred Triduum, or as much of it as possible (either in-person [reservations required] or virtually on-line). The "three days" of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday are considered not 3 separate liturgies, but one solemn liturgy spread over 3 days. Please see the insert in today's bulletin which gives a simple explanation of how we spend these holy days journeying with Christ through his suffering, death and resurrection.

From the time I became an altar server in the 3rd grade, I remember being so excited to participate in the special Masses and services of the Sacred Triduum (pronounced: TRID-oo-um). So, for the past 51 years of my life I have been able to participate in these special days. Fast forward to 22 years ago when I was ordained a priest, and the Sacred Triduum took on a whole different

meaning. The next best thing will be enjoying the eternal life Christ won for ALL of us when he calls us home.

So, I invite you all to take some time this week to remember the Holy Weeks of your past. What made them so special? How have they changed from place to place or from time to time? Which was your favorite day and/or service of the Sacred Triduum?

If there are no memories from the past because there was not a desire or maybe no opportunity to participate in the Sacred Triduum, why not make this year the beginning of some new memories? These upcoming days give each of us an opportunity to journey so intimately with the Christ who suffered and died for us to save us and bring us home. He did it all for us! What are we going to do this coming week for him?

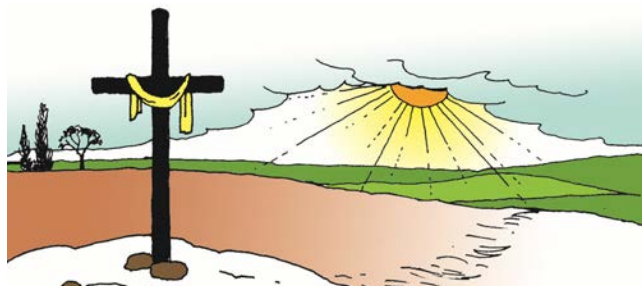

Feast of Faith

The Liturgies of Holy Week

Holy Week is the culmination of the liturgical year. During these holy days, the liturgy will lead us, with Jesus, to the depths and to the heights.

It begins with a harsh juxtaposition, as we carry palms in remembrance of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem and then listen to the Passion according to Matthew, as the King is handed over for crucifixion. Then, on Holy Thursday, we remember the night Jesus was handed over—the night he gave himself for us and to us, to live in our midst forever in the sacrament of his Body and Blood. On Good Friday, we touch with our hands the mystery of the Lord's cross, the instrument of torture that has become the tree of life. Then, at the great Easter Vigil, the lighting of the paschal candle speaks to us of the triumph of light over darkness, of life over death. The resurrection of the Lord becomes a living reality in our midst as the catechumens for whom the Church has prayed throughout Lent are plunged into the mystery of Christ's death and share in the glory of his resurrection. These are indeed holy days, the culmination of the Church's liturgy, and an invitation to participate in the very life of Christ. Come, let us worship.

Holy Week

For the Palm Sunday Gospel, we return to the Gospel according to Mark. The account of the Passion takes up nearly one-third of Mark's entire Gospel and, of all the evangelists, he is the one who presents the details most graphically. He depicts the humanity of Jesus most intensely, describing his sufferings thoroughly. Mark portrays Jesus as a complete fulfillment of the "Suffering Servant" of Isaiah, the obedient, humble slave dying on a cross of whom Paul speaks in Philippians. But it is important to remember that we call this "Holy Week" and not "sad week" or "suffering week," for each of the readings today, even the lamentations of the psalm, end in the promise of the strength and hope that is granted by God to those who faithfully give of themselves in love. As we enter into this week through these readings, we must reflect deeply on the sufferings of Jesus, but still be confident in the joy of risen, eternal life that awaits all of us who faithfully walk with him through these days.

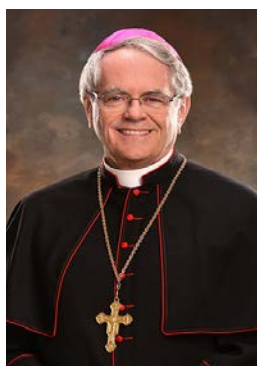

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On Good Friday, April 2, 2021, our Diocese will take up the national collection for the Holy Land.

The Collection for the Holy Land, in the words of Paul VI, is "not only for the Holy Places but above all for those pastoral, charitable, educational, and social works which the Church supports in the Holy Land for the welfare of their Christian brethren and of the local communities."

This Collection brings an indispensable support to the Christian minority of the Holy Land. The State of Israel and Palestine have a population of some 10 million people. The 180,000 Christian inhabitants represent less than 2% of this population. To check the exodus from the Holy Land of Christians whose lives are rendered difficult, the Franciscan Custody implements numerous initiatives. In addition to ensuring the guard of the shrines, the Good Friday Annual Collection allows these living stones to inhabit the Holy Places and in so doing bear witness to the Resurrection of Christ.

Shrines in Bethlehem, Nazareth, Jerusalem and many other locations welcome Christian pilgrims regularly throughout the year with Christian generosity and hospitality. Likewise, the Church in the Holy Land provides housing and food for the poor.

Please be generous, and prayerfully consider how you can support this collection. Holy Land Christians, along with all the clergy and religious working there greatly appreciate your generosity.

Saint of the Week

Saint Berthold

Died Circa 1195

Feast Day: March 29

Not much is known about this hermit who is considered by some historians to be the

founder of the order of Carmelite friars. Various legends had him born in Limoges, France, educated at the University of Paris, and participating in the Crusades in Turkey. What is known is that he directed a group of Frankish hermits living on Mount Carmel in Palestine in the second half of the 12th century. The existence on Mount Carmel of a church and hermitage in the spiritual tradition of the prophet Elijah is documented from 1163 on. After Berthold's death, the hermits were led by another Frenchman, St. Brocard; Carmelite houses became well-established throughout Europe by 1300.

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A Stewardship Moment

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

This weekend we participate in the proclamation of the passion and death of Jesus according to the Gospel of Mark. In the extended version of this weekend's Gospel reading, Jesus is at Gethsemane, praying to his Father, in much emotional distress. He knows he can save himself. He can escape over the Mount of Olives in the dead of night and make his way safely into the Judean desert. Instead, Jesus chooses obedience to his Father and waits for his persecutors. As Saint Paul puts it in the second reading, Jesus is "obedient to the point of death." Jesus' obedience is a lesson for those who are good stewards of their life in Christ. Let us reflect on how we might be more obedient to the will of God instead of our own will.

Lenten Observances

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been extended through Easter Sunday, of the Resurrection of the Lord, April 4, 2021.

Fasting

In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both Ash Wednesday (February 17) and Good Friday (April 2). To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller

quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (excepting water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

Abstinence from Meat

Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

Upcoming Confession Times



Monday, March 29, will be your last opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Easter. Confessions are heard on Mondays from 8:45

a.m. to 9:30 a.m. or until those confessions are finished. But please note, although daily Mass will still be celebrated at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, April 5, confessions **will not be heard that Monday because the parish offices will be closed for Easter break from Noon on Holy Thursday, April 1, through Tuesday, April 6.** Confessions are also heard by appointment. To make an appointment, call the church office at 702-228-8311 and press (0) for Sandra, the receptionist.

All should remember, that if one cannot make it to confession, even if mortal sin is present, they still can approach to receive the Eucharist if they make an act of perfect contrition with the intention to go to Confession the next time that it is possible. Canon 916 states: *"A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible."*

THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM OR "THREE DAYS"

What we do at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday

Holy Thursday brings Lent to an end with the celebration of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, which is actually the vigil of Good Friday. That night we begin the "Triduum" (pronounced "TRID-oo-um") or "Three Days" that are the center of our entire year. Why are these Three Days so important? What do they mean for you? You are invited to make the Sacred Paschal Triduum different from all the rest of the days of the year, whether in-person (space permitting) or virtually on-line. Remember, Bishop Thomas has continued to lift the obligation to attend Sunday Mass through and including Easter Sunday!

Whether you are young or old, currently active in our parish or not, please set these days aside. All of us should know that our presence (in-person or virtually) for the liturgies of the Sacred Paschal Triduum is not just by invitation. These days are a privilege to come together in thanksgiving for all Christ has done for us.

THREE DAYS, BUT ONE CONTINUOUS LITURGY

On these Three Days we gather a number of times during the evening or day to celebrate **one complete liturgy**. We begin with the sign of the cross on Holy Thursday and end with the dismissal at the end of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night or on the Masses of Easter Sunday. Together we hear some of the church's most beautiful prayers and scriptures and we make some of our finest music. Please look closely at our schedule below and make plans to take part in the various liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Above all, on Saturday night, The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night welcomes the new members to our Catholic community! Due to the number of those celebrating the Easter Sacraments at the Easter Vigil, along with their sponsors and families, reservations for the Easter Vigil are limited to attendance in the parish hall where the celebration will be live-streamed and Holy Communion offered.

WE BEGIN ON HOLY THURSDAY...

HOLY THURSDAY • April 1, 2021

The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper 7:00 PM

Adoration for one hour after Mass is completed

Lent officially ends as the Sacred Triduum begins on Holy Thursday with the *Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper*. On this Thursday evening, which is actually the vigil of Good Friday, we enter into this Sacred Triduum together. After listening to the scriptures, we would ordinarily wash feet. Since we are unable to wash feet due to the pandemic, we will view a reflective video on contemporary ways we wash feet in our lives. In washing feet, Jesus gave us an image of what the church is supposed to look like, feel like, act like. This is rehearsal for all of Christian life.

Afterward, we celebrate the Eucharist, which is the ultimate gift of Christ's real presence sustaining us on our earthly journeys. The evening liturgy has no ending. We process with the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose. Whether we stay to pray awhile or leave, we have now entered in the quiet and peace and glory of the Sacred Triduum.

Tenebrae Service (without Communion)..... 7:00 PM

We gather quietly at 12:00 Noon (the traditional time of the crucifixion) or 3:00 PM (the traditional time of the death of Christ) on Good Friday for *The Celebration of the Lord's Passion*. We listen to scripture. We pray at length for all the world's needs. Then there is another once-a-year event: The holy cross is held up in our midst and we adore together as a faith community. Then we receive our Lord in the Eucharist to sustain us until the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night. When the service is ended, individuals may come forward one by one to adore the cross with a solemn bow or genuflection while not touching or embracing the cross. This service is the official continuation of the one Sacred Triduum.

A Tenebrae Service is another additional time of prayer offered in the evening. While not an official part of the Sacred Paschal Triduum liturgies and without Holy Communion, this service symbolizes what appears to be the temporary triumph of the Prince of Darkness over the Light of the World as we pray with various characters of scripture. The service ends in darkness and with a loud noise made by everyone symbolizing the death of Jesus. At the end, a small amount of light appears as we leave in silence and await the glorious resurrection of Christ.

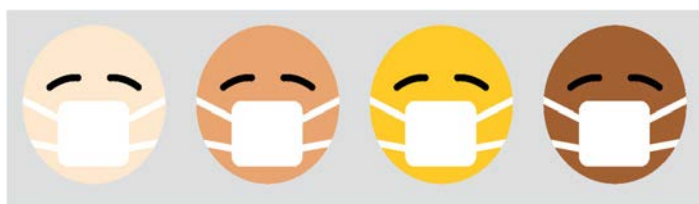

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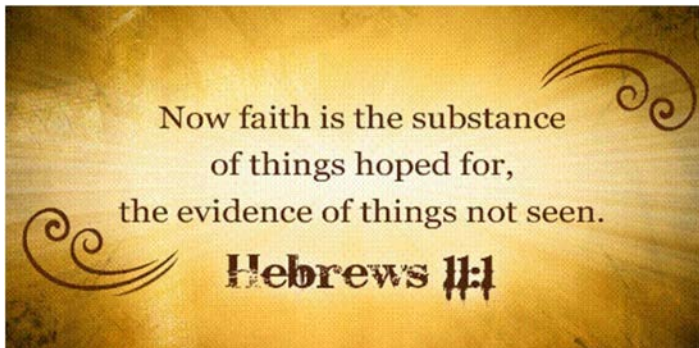

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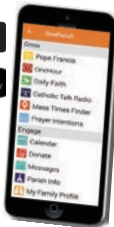
