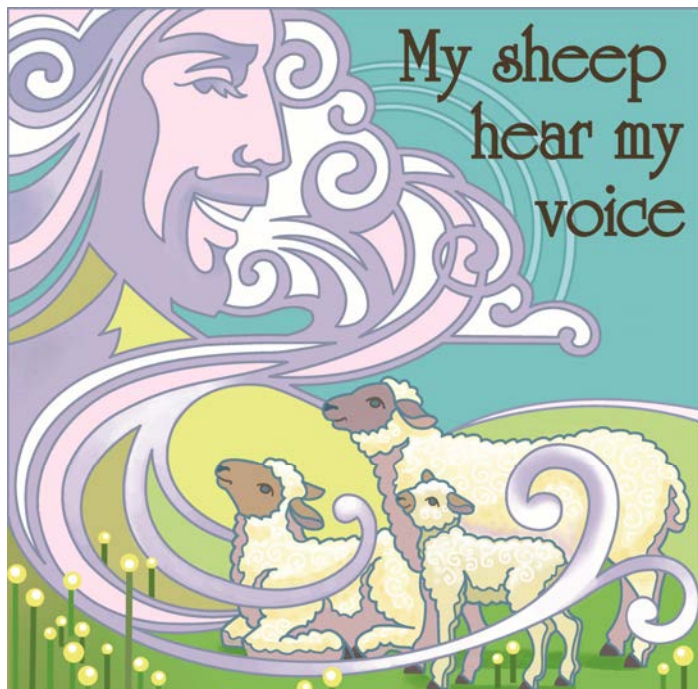

Shepherds Like Jesus

Each year this Fourth Sunday of Easter celebrates Jesus the Good Shepherd. Today's Gospel seems especially timely, for as Christians worldwide suffer persecution like Paul and Barnabas, Jesus promises his sheep enduring, invincible safety: "They shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand." But we who are free to live our faith peacefully sometimes take our membership in Jesus' flock for granted, wandering astray to seek our own pleasure and prosperity. The simple cross that Pope Francis always wears seems to show us how Jesus responds to that. Francis' cross features an image of Jesus, who has sought and found a lost sheep, then joyfully set it on his shoulders to carry it gently home. May Good Shepherd Sunday inspire us, so often lost and found ourselves, to assist Jesus in seeking, finding, and gently carrying home our fellow precious lambs.

Treasures From Our Tradition

The reception of Holy Communion at Sunday Mass is such an expected feature of the Mass these days that it is surprising to realize that for many centuries, receiving Communion was a relatively rare event in the life of a faithful Christian. "Easter duty" means that Catholics must celebrate reconciliation if aware of serious sin, and receive Holy Communion during the Easter season. For a while, this was a requirement of Easter week, and later extended to the whole season of fifty days, and even beyond that by a few weeks. For the majority of people long ago, this meant Communion was a once-a-year moment. A rather complex bureaucracy grew up around this rule in the Middle Ages. Amazingly, people received a kind of token at confession admitting them to Communion in their home parish, which then kept careful records and reported them to the bishop.

Surviving records can tell us a great deal about our ancestors. In fact, people were encouraged to journey to the church of their baptism in order to fulfill their duty, and therefore the Easter duty includes in its origins a grateful pilgrimage to the font in which you were first embraced by Christ. If your "Holy Mother Church" is within a drive, why not make a pilgrimage to that font a feature of your Easter celebration of these fifty days?

Isidore the Farmer
1070 - 1130

Feast Day - May 15

A humble peasant born near Madrid, Spain, Isidore married and worked the same fields all his life. The couple was said to have lived celibately after their young son died. Always devout, Isidore visited church on his way to work, prayed while ploughing and made local pilgrimages. Legends associate him with miraculous feedings of birds and a crowd of poor men. He was canonized in the August company of Ignatius Loyola, Francis Xavier, Teresa of Avila and Philip Neri.

Living Our Faith

The Humanity of Mary

A few years ago, a survey was conducted around the world of parents of young children. The survey asked these parents what qualities they would like their children to have when they grew up.

The researchers were surprised to learn that in every country and culture, parents wanted their children to grow up having the same types of positive qualities: honesty, integrity, courage, religiosity and the like.

As the researchers reported, no parent said they wanted their children to be liars or cheats. The researchers did find wide divergence over what methods parents would use to raise their children to have the qualities they named.

What this research illustrates is that people everywhere have an archetype or an ideal for what makes a perfect human being.

Similarly, if you asked people what qualities they loved about their mothers or fathers, you would probably generate answers suggesting the archetypal mother or father: kind, generous, encouraging, strict, etc. We have an ideal in mind when we speak of a good mother or father, and all parents are judged against that ideal.

Mary, the mother of Jesus, has been recognized and honored from the earliest days of the church for her role in salvation history. She is honored with an almost unlimited number of titles by church

communities around the world because of her many appearances and also because of her role as the first disciple of Jesus, for which she is rightly known as the Mother of the Church.

Because little is actually known about Mary from the Scriptures, most of the attributes that have been given her over the years reflect archetypal thinking. This means that Mary has been given all of the qualities that we would expect to find in the ideal mother.

Over the centuries, it has been easy to place Mary upon a pedestal and honor her above all other women, making her perfect in the process. But in these efforts to honor her, might we have missed an important lesson by not looking at her as the real woman that she was? Might we have forgotten that she was human, that she struggled as all mothers struggle, that she might have had doubts and fears, that she may not have always felt she lived up to the ideal image of the perfect mother? Pope Francis has recently made a number of comments along this line. He noted that it was important that we remember that Mary was fully and truly human. She was a woman who by her courageous and faithful actions accomplished extraordinary things.

Mary had a husband. She had a child. She cared for the family and made the family home just as any other Jewish woman would have done in her time, and as mothers all over the world still do today. As Pope Francis has also pointed out, Mary was wonderfully humble.

Nowhere in Scripture is there a suggestion that she thought that she was worthy of the honor bestowed upon her or that she had lived a perfect life and so deserved God's favor. Rather, the message Mary sends is the opposite. She is blessed by her husband and blessed by her son and blessed by God's favor. She is an ordinary mother touched by God's grace. Mary's attitude seems very similar to the attitude of so many mothers throughout history and still today.

When the church offers Mary as the first disciple or the image of the perfect disciple, maybe it would

help if we saw those titles through the lens of ordinary women. Mary's life was lived accepting the will of God and also the mystery that God had in mind for her.

As Pope Francis recently said, Mary's faith was special because she lived it out every day. She engaged in conversation continually with her God. She understood the world through the gift of the Holy Spirit. Mary's faith, Pope Francis said, was "nourished by her experience as a mother and by her close relationship with her son."

While emphasizing the special role Mary plays in the Church, Pope Francis continues to speak about the important role that all women have, especially when it comes to the joyful news of the Gospel. "A world where women are marginalized is a sterile world," the pope said.

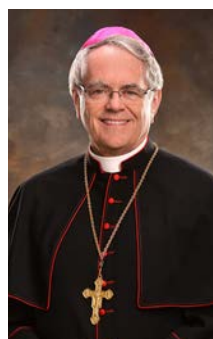
Women not only bring new life into the world; they also "transmit to us the capacity to see otherwise" and to "understand the world with different eyes, to feel the most creative, most patient, most tender things with the heart." It is through our mothers, the pope says, that most people are introduced to the faith.

When we honor Mary throughout May, let's also honor the gifts that all women bring to the church and how we come to know and experience the saving love of God through women.

Let us give thanks for everyone who says "yes" to God's invitation, for those who bring forth new life and especially for those who, like Mary, share the gift of faith with the rest of us.

On the weekend of May 18 and 19, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) and the Catholic University of America (CUA).

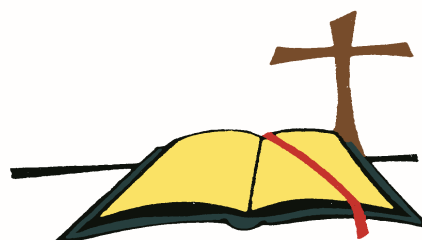

Stewards of the Easter Season

Christ is risen! Indeed, He is risen!

If you're thinking this greeting comes a little late, since Easter Sunday was April 21, think again. As Catholic Christians, we celebrate the Easter season for seven weeks, until the fires of Pentecost once again inflame our hearts on June 9.

Indeed, how could we not continue to celebrate this event that has changed everything for us? It's easy to slip into a cultural way of thinking about our great feasts. Many people have the Christmas tree taken down at the end of New Year's Day, rather than waiting for Epiphany. Likewise, most of us have long ago put the Easter decorations away.

But the Christian steward is aware of the beauty and meaning of the seasons in the liturgical calendar.

The Easter season remains a special time for recommitment to the Lord. One word for this period is "mystagogia," and those who were newly baptized at the Great Easter Vigil are especially familiar with this term. It literally means that we delve more deeply into the mystery of our faith. But exploring this mystery is not just an endeavor for new Christians. As we prepare for Pentecost, we prayerfully examine what the Resurrection means in our own lives.

For Christian stewards, it's a time to reevaluate how faith in the Risen Lord informs every aspect of our lives – how we labor, how we play, the way we pray, how we allocate our resources, where

we spend our time, how we love, how we extend our compassion to others. If Christ is truly risen – an astounding and life-altering belief – then this Easter time brings immense joy and a continuing desire to know the Risen Lord.

The Scripture readings of the season are especially helpful. We hear once again the stories of the appearances of Jesus to his friends; how often they failed, initially, to recognize him in his glory. The Acts of the Apostles tell us of the struggles and the excitement of the new community of believers.

We spent forty days in the penitential season of Lent. Now, we are embarked on fifty days of joyous celebration. Let us experience this joy throughout the Easter season, so that when we celebrate Pentecost, we may truly find our hearts on fire with the Holy Spirit.

- Previous campaign donations
- Amount you might have indicated in the planning study
- A confidential review by Fr. Bede and parish leadership
- Every family being challenged to give sacrificially

I hope you will join us next week as our *Honoring our Past Embracing our Future* campaign begins. It's an exciting time, and we want you to be a part of something that will mean so much to the future of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish! In that spirit, we will have a reception with hors d'oeuvres and other refreshments in the Parish Hall following every Mass.




