



### The Gift of Peace

"There arose no little dissension and debate." Did that happen at work this week? Most of us can recall run-ins with coworkers, even with the boss. Did it happen while socializing with friends? Go easy on politics, religion . . . even sports. At home? Even the most peaceful household experiences a little "give and take" now and then. So where was it that "there arose no little dissension and debate"? That tumultuous conflict occurred among our first Christian ancestors, disrupting the community life of the early Church. But today's Acts of the Apostles shows how beautifully the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus in today's Gospel, helped the Church achieve a grace-filled resolution. What evolved was that "reconciled diversity," often encouraged by Pope Francis and even envisioned in today's Revelation passage; and a wondrous experience of Jesus' promised Gospel gift: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

### Treasures From Our Tradition

Why is it still Easter? The lilies have long since faded. The roots of our tradition of fifty days of rejoicing from Easter to Pentecost lie in the sevenday rhythm of the Jewish week, drawn from the six days of creation plus a Sabbath day. A favorite name for the Lord's Day among our ancestors in the faith was "The Eighth Day," meaning that in Christ a breakthrough to a new humanity was achieved. With that inner architecture, it makes sense to see Pentecost as a week of weeks, fortynine days plus one, again signaling that a new age has begun in Christ and the outpouring of his Spirit. The Jewish appreciation for Pentecost gave rise to the Jubilee year, the fiftieth year, when debts were released and prisoners set free. Today, the character of our Easter Sundays is conveyed by joyful Alleluias and the rite of sprinkling at Mass. Long ago, people expressed this joy by suspending all rules of fasting and by never kneeling at liturgy.

These customs all point to our conviction that time is holy. There is an elegant balance to the Christian year: forty days of Lenten fast and discipline give way to fifty days of unrestrained rejoicing. That's why it is still Easter!

### Saint of the Week

Augustine of Canterbury Died c. 604 Feast Day—May 27

This monk was prior of a monastery in Rome until 596, when Pope St. Gregory the Great sent him and 30 other monks to evangelize England. They landed in Kent where they got permission to preach because the king's wife had been a Christian before her marriage. Augustine's preaching won over King Ethelbert, who became a Christian and gave the monks a house and church in Canterbury. Augustine built England's first cathedral there; from this see missionaries and bishops were sent around England. He is known as "the apostle of England."

"No pilgrim knows in advance all the steps along the path. Saint Augustine of Canterbury set out from Rome with his band of monks for what was then a distant corner of the world. . . While we ourselves do not see a solution to this obstacle, we are confident that through our engagement with this matter our conversations will in fact help to deepen and enlarge our understanding. We have this confidence because Christ promised that the Holy Spirit, who is the Spirit of Truth, will remain with us forever (Cfr. Io. 14, 16-17)." —St. John Paul II, Common Declaration, October 1989

### Living The Faith

Quo Vadis: Where Are You Going?

Why are you getting married? Why are you choosing to get married in the Church?

Let's face it, when you are twenty-something, in love, planning your wedding and honeymoon, etc...these may not be the first thoughts going through your mind. (But, note well: they could be the first questions the priest or marriage preparation couple asks you, though!) However, at some point before your wedding day, there will be a moment when you ask yourself, "why am I marrying this person?" You might even pause to think about those vows you will take: I promise to be true to you in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health. I will love you and honor you all the days of my life. That's pretty serious...in today's society, it borders on the incredible.

Thinking back to those days when we were young, how we fell in love and wanted to spend every day of our lives together, we quickly came to realize that although these desires may have drawn us together, we didn't really know just how much we would grow to love each other over time. And, as is the reality of being a military family, we wouldn't spend every day together; actually, there would be many separations. To quote a classic Boston song, love and marriage is "More Than a Feeling." To love in marriage often takes effort, energy, and self-giving. It means that when marriage may not feel euphoric, we still need to make the choice to love. We have promised to help our beloved to heaven. That is our primary goal.

There are many ways of doing this: some are positive actions such as praying for your spouse; performing small acts of love —a note, flowers, a hug; sacrificing for each other in dozens of small and large ways; holding back that sharp comment when you are angry and instead keeping quiet or providing charitable feedback; doing what the other wants to do rather than what you want; letting go of selfishness and resentment.

On the other hand, there are fewer desirable ways of achieving the same goal such as being selfish,

chiding your spouse, or harshly criticizing them. Even these actions on your part help the other get to heaven, but in a roundabout way...by providing opportunities of virtue for your spouse! As St Josemaria Escriva notes in The Way [173]: "Don't say, 'That person bothers me.' Think: 'That person sanctifies me.'" That may be one way to help your spouse get to heaven, but not the best or loving way.

The goal of our marriage or its success cannot be measured by the house we live in, the cars we drive, or where we vacation. Our main goal should be to help each other on our path to heaven, to holiness. We've been blessed to hear several inspiring (and challenging!) wedding homilies on this topic over the last few years. They beautifully reminded us that marriage is not just for mutual benefit or comfort; that each spouse has to put the other first, sacrifice for the other, and be a living example for those around us.

After thirty years of helping each other on the way to holiness, there isn't anyone else either of us would want on the journey. No one else with whom to share joy—the celebration of graduations, weddings, births, sacraments; and with whom to share sorrow—the bad health diagnosis, surgery, the late night call from a child in need, or tears when your baby leaves for college.

There are many ways to help each other but the following are just a few things that we have learned to do—and try to keep doing—in order to help each other on the path to holiness:

- Pray together every day and pray for each other. Even when we are apart due to travel or other reasons, we still know we are praying similar prayers and for each other.
- Don't talk bad about each other to other people. It doesn't help your marriage to do so and it doesn't help resolve the issues you are complaining about.
- Laugh a lot at yourselves and with each other at the numerous "inside jokes" you'll live and experience. Laughing at our own faults or

tendencies is a good exercise in humility and a reminder to not always judge the other. There are dozens of phrases or little things that only the two of us know about that we laugh at, and sharing them reminds us of the countless reasons we love each other and are grateful to the Lord for bringing us together.

### Fact of Faith

### The Madonna

One of the most common themes in Western art is that of the Madonna and Child—a serene painting of the Blessed Virgin Mary, holding the child Jesus in her arms. But this image, so familiar that it has appeared on US Postal Service Christmas stamps nearly every year since 1966, was not always a staple of Christian art.

For most of the first three centuries of Christianity, the Blessed Virgin was usually depicted as part of a group of apostles, or as part of a Nativity scene; she was almost never alone or a central figure. But in the fifth century, the Council of Ephesus addressed the Nestorian heresy, which claimed that, when Christ died on the Cross, it was only his human nature that experienced suffering and death. By extension, the Nestorians claimed that Mary was the mother only of Christ's human nature and not the Mother of God. The Council of Ephesus reinforced the Church's long-held belief that Mary was the Mother of God and worthy of the Greek title "Theotokos." Shortly thereafter, the Empress Eudocia sent a painting of the Madonna and Child home from the Holy Land and had it placed in the Church of Constantinople. This is the first historical mention of the Madonna and Child as an artistic subject. That painting was taken to Venice in 1202. to the Cathedral of St. Mark.

In subsequent centuries, the Madonna and Child has become one of the most popular themes in Western art. This popularity reflects the Church's veneration of Mary for her role in our salvation and also for her place as an exemplar of the virtues of purity, humility, and faithful acceptance of God's grace.

- Families must provide a Birth and Baptism

  participation of the child and the parent
  throughout the formation years.

### Sacraments:

### Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a two-year process for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason (7 years), are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil in their second year of preparation.

### **First Eucharist Initiation:**

The two-year preparation process to celebrate First Eucharist teaches children about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The child and the parent will participate in retreats in their second year.

### **Continuing Formation:**

Children in 3rd grade and higher who are baptized and have received First Eucharist will continue their formation in age appropriate classes. It is the practice of our faith that formation is ongoing and is a life-long journey.

### Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):

This is a hands-on, interactive working environment where children are guided toward a greater understanding of God's love in their life. They encounter Jesus the Good Shepherd, who loves them, cares for them and knows them by name. Children are most sensitive to a relationship with God between the ages of 3-6. For this reason, we provide formal faith formation for young children.




