

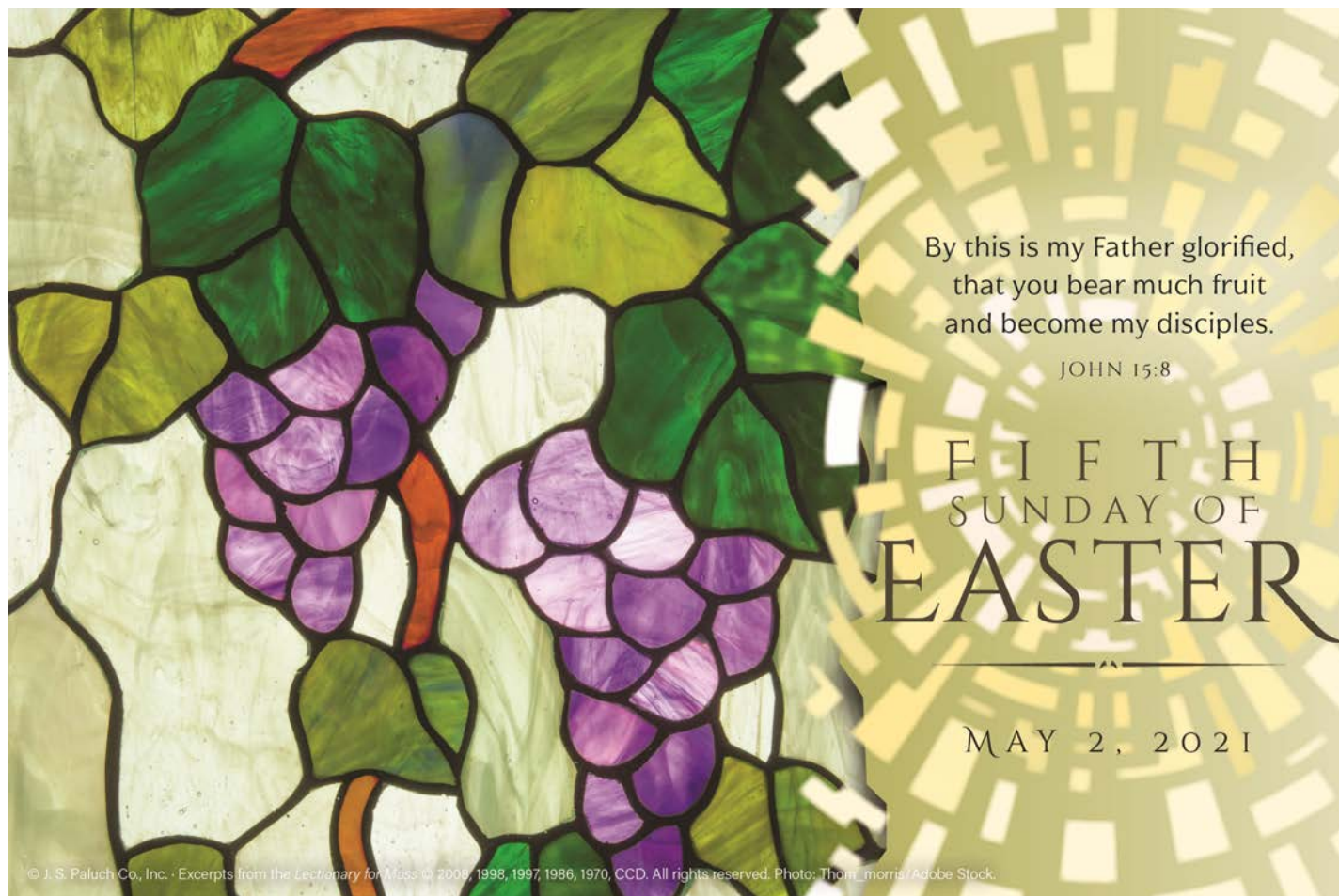

Mercy flows... Love redeems

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

STAYING CONNECTED

This Sunday's Gospel is about the importance of staying connected. To illustrate that, Jesus uses the image of himself being the vine and we are the branches. The branches can only bear fruit if they stay connected to the vine. Once disconnected from the vine, no fruit is possible.

The same is true of us: if we want to bear the fruit of God's love in our lives, we need to stay connected to God. As members of the body of Christ, we the Church, stay connected to God and one another primarily through the celebration of the Mass (the highest form of prayer Christ gave us!). Everything else we do stems from that connection in the Eucharist.

The Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*, refers to the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist as the "source and summit of the Christian life." It is the "source" because that's where we encounter the real presence of Christ to help lead us to the "summit" which is our becoming Christ for others. St. Augustine put it beautifully: "we must become what we receive!" That's our goal: we experience Christ as our "source" at Mass as we strive for the "summit," to be Christ for others.

Staying connected to the "vine" (Christ) at Mass, we "branches" then bear the fruit of his real presence in our lives as we live God's unconditional love to every soul created in the image and likeness of God.

"IN ALL THINGS – CHARITY"

Those four words encapsulate the life and spirit of +Mother Collette Hilbert, FSSJ, (1865-1938) foundress of the Franciscan Sisters of St. Joseph centered in Hamburg, New York. The sisters, sometimes affectionately known as the "hamburger helpers," were founded with the assistance of the Conventual Franciscan Friars, the community to which I formerly belonged. I've en-

countered many wonderful and dedicated sisters of that community, especially in my years at the Basilica of St. Josaphat in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where the sisters staffed our parish school for the vast majority of its existence.

But those simple four words of +Mother Collette, "In all things – Charity," remind me of the challenge of Christ, the challenge of the Gospel, the challenge of our Baptism. To do everything with charity is the goal of every Christian. Those Christian "branches" who sincerely remain connected to Christ the "vine" will show forth charity in every aspect of their lives.

DO WE LIVE CHARITABLY IN ALL THINGS?

If we're completely honest, I think many of us would probably admit that there are times when we struggle to live charitably in all things. Let me be the first to raise my hand and admit my own struggles.

I believe the new temptation to live uncharitably has been fueled by the almost complacent acceptance of negativity by too many people these past many months. The most recent hateful political season made it acceptable to demonize those on "the other side." The frequent unnecessary deaths by shooting have made the mortal sin of racism a mere right to my own opinion. The COVID-19 pandemic has turned into a platform for defending personal rights rather than selfless acts of care for the common good.

And these same negative attitudes have even begun to trickle into our church. Uncharitable words and actions, self-righteous attitudes, and a lack of respect for necessary safety protocols have no place among anyone daring to call him or herself a follower of Christ!

Some of our generous volunteers who greet and guide the faithful coming to Mass have been met with some very uncharitable resistance and in some cases, even blatant and mean disrespect for

The Homily

The ambo, or pulpit, is a special place — it is the place for God's word. That is why it is not used for all the spoken words of the Mass, even important words like the collects and the blessing. The ambo is only used for the scripture readings, and for the homily and the prayer of the faithful.

The homily is part of the Liturgy of the Word. It flows from the readings we have just heard, and helps us to understand the way in which God is speaking to us today. The homily is not a lecture, a catechism lesson, or a speech. It is more like an exhortation; it has an urgency about it, for it calls us to find ourselves in the scripture, to live the faith we profess, to see our world by the light of the Gospel. The homily, in itself a response to God's word, demands a response from us. There are many styles of preaching and many ways to respond to the scriptures. But whether the homily is weak or strong, an open ear and an open heart can find in it an abundance of spiritual nourishment.

New Safety Protocols at SEAS Beginning May 1

Beginning Saturday, May 1, reservations will no longer be needed to attend Mass at SEAS. Although safety protocols are starting to relax, the obligation to attend Mass in the Diocese of Las Vegas is still lifted through Sunday, May 30. While the obligation to attend Mass is lifted, we will continue to live-stream all of our Masses and services through our website, www.seaslv.org.

In addition, please note our newest safety guidelines effective May 1st:

- Social distancing has been reduced to 3 feet.
- Seating will be first come, first seated, and households should distance themselves 3 feet apart in the pews. Once the church is filled, guests will be seated in the parish hall where they can view the live-streamed Mass from the church and receive Holy Communion. Due to social distancing, seating may be limited and is not guaranteed.
- Face masks are still required to be worn by all individuals age 2 and older.
- Hands must be sanitized upon entering the church.
- Everyone will still be required to follow the guidance of the Hospitality Ministers at the end of Mass as they assist guests with the proper way to exit the church.
- Contributions to the weekly offertory and other collections will be accepted in the collection baskets in the gathering space.
- During Mass, a verbal sign of peace may be offered without physical contact.
- For everyone's safety, we continue to ask that the Eucharist be received reverently in the hand.

Bearing Fruit

Few of us, even when we meditate on the image of the vine and branches, stop to really think about how God “prunes” us. For some there is the danger of thinking that we are already producing fruit for the kingdom, in deed and truth as John says, perhaps raising a family, being active in our parish, and so on. But even those branches which are bearing fruit, the Gospel tells us, can be pruned to produce still more. Today Saul, freshly “pruned” by his conversion, arrives in Jerusalem and meets resistance. Since he had been persecuting Christians, this was only natural. But even after he is accepted and begins to bear fruit, he meets further adversity, and his letters are filled with many accounts of how his trials “pruned” him to produce greater fruit for the kingdom. Like him, as long as we remain in Christ we will continue to bear fruit and, when the will of the Father determines it is time to prune us, the strength of the true vine must enable us to endure it.

Catechetical Corner

May: The Month of Mary

"As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time; however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved. (*Lumen Gentium*, no. 53)

"Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, 'while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed' (*Lumen Gentium*, no. 66). The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf."¹

"Popular piety dedicates the month of May to the Blessed Virgin Mary."² "Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary deserves special attention because it is such an important part of worship in the United States. The United States of America is under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception."³ "The various forms of devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary reflect the many different cultures, religious convictions and popular sensibilities that make up the Church in the United States. Catholic people of all cultures have a deep love for the Mother of God. They employ many different expressions of

that love to show the one faith that characterizes their particular prayer life and spirituality."⁴

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Saint of the Week

Saint Rose Venerini

Dates: 1656 - 1728

Feast Day: May 7

Born in Viterbo, Italy, Rose entered a convent after her fiancé died, but soon returned home to care for her widowed mother. She chose to be a teacher rather than a contemplative, and opened a free school for girls in 1685. In 1692, the bishop of an Italian diocese asked her to train teachers and administer the schools there. She and St. Lucy Filippini became friends, and Rose began setting up schools around Italy. Despite opposition, including arson and assaults on some of her teachers, the order she founded was officially recognized as a congregation, the Venerini Sisters, after her death.

Stewardship and the Annual Spring Cleaning

When spring rain lets up, and May brings long hours of brilliant sunshine, something stirs within: the desire to tackle that dust we suddenly notice in places we seldom look. And those windows smeared with winter's muck? And that disorganized closet? There's a reason our grandmothers called it "spring housecleaning." The season brings an almost physical desire to get out the mop.

Surprisingly, for the Christian steward, this can actually be a spiritual impulse. There's something intrinsically renewing and revitalizing about cleaning. Everything done with a prayerful heart can lead us closer to God, and cleaning, often a solitary and contemplative task, can definitely include prayer. You might plan to begin your cleaning with prayer, and play music that lifts your spirit as you work.

Start with a closet. Open your heart to what it tells you about how blessed you are materially. But observe the consumerism a closet can reveal. As you examine each item of apparel, remember and thank God for the graces of the occasion: a wedding, a graduation, a vacation. Enjoy "shopping" in your own closet for items you've forgotten about. Pare down what you no longer need or what you feel called to share. Wash, mend, iron and select a place where your items may find a good home. Many cities have refugee closets, and many nonprofits have thrift stores which support them. St. Vincent de Paul shops serve the poor with inexpensive used items. Pray for those with whom you are about to share.

Resolve to put your newly reorganized items to work for you and not rush out to buy more.

And those windows? Does anything lift the spirit like a clean window after a long winter? As you polish those panes of glass, pray about where your own inner life could use a cleaning. Perhaps you don't make it to the Sacrament of Reconciliation as often as you'd like. Use your quiet window cleaning time to examine the graces and challenges of your life. Thank God for the many blessings and be honest about failings.

And that ubiquitous dust? It promises to return, afflicts the rich and the poor. It's a sign of our universal connection to the earth and the environment, a reminder of our own mortality. Even the dust we clean can be lifted up to God with a thank you from a steward's grateful heart.

Be aware, however, that our parish life goes on, and there may be times you might see someone cleaning, or setting up for a service, or whatever. This live-streamed view is just another opportunity to be virtually close to the Eucharistic Presence of Christ in the tabernacle no matter where you are.



Confessions

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered on **Mondays from 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. or until those confessions are finished.** Confessions are also heard by appointment. To make an appointment, call the

church office at 702-228-8311 and press (0).

All should remember, that if one cannot make it to confession, even if mortal sin is present, they still can approach to receive the Eucharist if they make an act of perfect contrition with the intention to go to Confession the next time that it is possible. Canon 916 states: *"A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible."*
