





Lifelong Service

"I am going fishing." What an announcement! If asked who made it, and not told it was a Bible quote, we might guess "Grandpa" or "Uncle Fred," or admit, "I said that last summer!" But it is a Bible quote, from today's Gospel. The person who said it also once declared, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Yes, it's Peter! So today's announcement seems quite the comedown. Last Sunday Jesus said, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." But Peter seems determined to return to his pre-apostolic occupation, until Jesus intervenes, making Peter's later announcement deeper, "Lord, you know that I love you," and Peter's apostolic calling clearer, "Tend my sheep." Peter does so. Acts presents the consequences: Peter declares, "We must obey God rather than men." As Revelation proclaims, "Worthy is the Lamb"—to receive Peter's lifelong service, and ours.

Saint of the Week

Damien of Molokai 1840 - 1889 Feast Day - May 10

Born in Tremelo, Belgium, Joseph de Veuster left school at 13 to work on the family farm. Six years later he joined the

Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, taking the name Damien. He volunteered for a mission to the Hawaiian Islands and was ordained in Honolulu in 1864. He served on the island of Hawaii for eight years, then volunteered in 1873 to work at the leprosy colony on Molokai (leprosy is now called Hansen's disease). Father Damien was priest, doctor and counselor to 800 patients before he contracted the disease in 1884. He stayed on Molokai, ministering until a month before his death. Considered a model and martyr of charity, he was canonized in 2009.

"His missionary activity, which gave him such joy, reached its peak in charity. Not without fear and repugnance, he chose to go to the Island of Molokai to serve the lepers who lived there, abandoned by all. Thus, he was exposed to the disease from which they suffered. . . He invites us to open our eyes to the forms of leprosy that disfigure the humanity of our brethren and still today call for the charity of our presence as servants, beyond that of our generosity." —Pope Benedict XVI, October 11, 2009



Living Our Faith

Jesus Didn't Back Down from Proclaiming the Gospel

Jesus died because he was faithful to the mission of proclaiming the kingdom. That threatened the establishment—religious and political. Those who were threatened by the Gospel values decided to get rid of him.

We have to keep in mind that Jesus fulfilled his mission. This brings us consolation and joy in this Easter season. His example served as a model, not just for Catholics, but for all humanity. God willed his son's faithfulness but not the evil that was done to him. And Jesus was faithful and successful in his mission. We find parallels of his example in figures such as the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. and in the prophetic voices of our martyrs and saints, who also carried out a mission that extends past death.

In his Angelus talk of Nov. 10, 2013, Pope Francis pointed to the "God of the living in front of us." If we follow this God, if we follow the Gospel faithfully, like the martyrs and the saints, we also receive God's faithfulness in return, Pope Francis said. "He is faithful forever and he is waiting for us, each one of us, he accompanies each one of us with his eternal faithfulness."

The Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed are summary statements of what Christians believe. Although the wording in these two creeds is some-

what different—the Nicene Creed is longer—they express the same essential beliefs of the faith. Both proclaim that Jesus became incarnate-became flesh and blood-and was crucified, resurrected and returned to the father.

What is a surprise is that neither creed says anything about Jesus' mission here on earth. While the creedal statements are at the core of our faith, what Jesus did and preached comes mostly from what the four Gospel accounts tell us. Unfortunately, we do not have a complete record of Jesus' earthly ministry. If anything was written during his lifetime it did not survive in its original form. Scripture scholars suggest that such a document, called the "Q source"—from the German word for "source," "quelle"—was used by the writers of the synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark and Luke -- and explains why they share so much in common.

Though they share common stories, the synoptic Gospels use these common stories in different ways. In addition, each of the Gospel writers also had unique sources about Jesus' life. This is especially true for the Gospel according to John.

Even given the differences in the Gospels, there are certain things about Jesus' mission that come through clearly. For one, all of the Gospel accounts note that Jesus was driven. After John baptized him, Jesus went into the desert. He chose the men he wanted for disciples and called them with such passion that they stopped what they were doing and followed him immediately. He spoke with such force and persuasion that people followed him with abandon, and those who didn't decided to kill him because he was too threatening.

Following his baptism and desert experience, Luke 4:16 tells us that Jesus began his mission in Galilee, in the town of Nazareth where he was raised. There, he read aloud in the synagogue the passage from Isaiah 61:1-2 announcing that his mission would be to bring glad tidings to the poor, to set captives free, to give sight to the blind and to free the oppressed. Putting down the scroll, he announced that he was the fulfillment of that passage. The people were amazed at his words, since

they had known him from infancy, but then after he spoke some words they didn't agree with, they decided to throw him off the cliff.

Jesus did not back down even from the toughest audiences. A key focus of Jesus' mission was to proclaim the kingdom of heaven. He told stories and used analogies to help people gain an idea of what the kingdom would be. In the parable of the good Samaritan (Lk 10:25-37), Jesus teaches that in the kingdom even our enemies are to be treated with love and respect. In the parable of the prodigal son, Jesus teaches that God gives us all that we need, even if we waste it, and that God will be waiting for us when we return. In the parable of the sower, Jesus reveals to us God's great generosity. And in the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 5:3-12) and the Sermon on the Plain (Lk 6:20-36), Jesus offers us the new commandments of the kingdom.

The Gospel of John recognizes Jesus' miracles as signs that the kingdom is at hand. Jesus did not back down from proclaiming the kingdom of God even when he was told to stop. Even then, he kept proclaiming the good news of salvation, regardless of the consequences. Jesus was faithful to his mission even though it led to his death.

As Pope Francis repeatedly reminds us today, each and every one of us is called to join in Jesus' mission to proclaim the good news of the kingdom, and we are to proclaim that message with enthusiasm and joy. We are to be beacons of hope, radiant in the joy of the Gospel, not "sourpusses" who are put off by the Gospel's challenges.

Matthew 25 presents Jesus' teaching on what being a disciple entails: The scene is the final judgment, and those who are saved have cared for those in need by feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, giving drink to those who thirst, welcoming the stranger and caring for those who are ill or in prison. We are to show mercy and compassion to others as God shows mercy and compassion for us. We are to forgive others repeatedly and willingly—"not seven times but seventy-seven times," as Jesus tells Peter in Matthew 18:22.

As followers of Jesus, we are called to be witnesses to his life and to his mission. While we may not be called to die for our faith as some witnesses do

-the word "martyr" means "witness"-we are all called to be living examples of what it means to live the Gospel to its fullness and to proclaim the kingdom of God as Jesus did.

Messengers of God's Love

Since the news about numerous abuse scandals broke last summer, it has been a very difficult time for Catholics in the United States. In response, efforts for increased dialogue have been organized at many different levels: diocesan-wide events, parish meetings, and personal gatherings to talk, pray, share, and—especially important—to listen.

These efforts to listen and be attentive to others who are hurting have reminded me how each one of us can express respect for those we encounter in our daily routines. These events have also led me to reflect on my personal wounds, leading me to realize anew that even in our brokenness we can place ourselves at the service of others. It is an encouraging and beautiful experience to be a messenger of God's love to one another, especially during difficult times.

Inspired by Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego, these sentiments are reflected in the 2018-2019 Respect Life theme, "Every Life: Cherished, Chosen, Sent." No matter how unprepared or inadequate we may feel, God's grace can work through us to positively impact the lives around us in ways we may never fully realize. That is why it is helpful to remember that each of us is cherished in God's eyes, and we are created with a great capacity to love and be loved. We must never forget that each of us is chosen by God. Each life has profound

purpose and meaning, and each of us has a unique mission in this world. So that we may fulfill this mission, we are sent. Each of us is called to reflect God's love in how we treat others, use our God-given gifts, and help others understand their own dignity and worth.

At a time when there is heightened awareness of the great evils of sexual abuse and abuse of power, God can work through each of us to be messengers of his love as we aid in others' healing. How do we respond to those around us who are hurting? How do we show—in our actions, words, and behavior—that each life is precious, that each life is sacred? Whether or not we personally know someone who has experienced abuse, we can educate ourselves on how to respond in compassionate ways and learn what resources are available in our local area.

During this turbulent time in the Church, let us renew our efforts to respect and cherish the life of each and every person, to listen attentively, and to remind one another of our God-given dignity—including family members, friends, coworkers, and others we may encounter. Let us remember all victims and survivors of abuse and pray for their protection and healing. In the face of such pain and suffering, some may be tempted to doubt their worthiness of being loved, or even the value of their life. Let us always seek, in whatever circumstances people cross our paths, to be messengers of God's love. May we always be ready to offer a life-affirming response to those who may be reaching out or struggling in these difficult times.

From Holy Week to Pentecost

A Stewardship Lesson from the Upper Room


The Upper Room in Scripture has always held a very sacred place in my heart. I imagine this candlelit dwelling in Jerusalem as providing a home for weary travelers and an address for those who needed to find them. I step into the room with all four Gospel writers and they give me a glimpse into the humanness of the first disciples, the patience and love of Jesus and the power of the love between the Son and His Father.

Truthfully, as I sat among and observed the Upper Room inhabitants. I learned and continue to learn so much about Jesus and myself through the humanity and divinity found there. This place in Jerusalem is where I came to know the true meaning of friendship as Jesus shared his last supper, the Passover meal, with his followers. It is where the saying "it's not about you" was fully demonstrated and authentic servant leadership was modeled as he washed the feet of his friends. It is in the Upper Room where the New Covenant in Jesus became a reality and I saw that even those who profess the ultimate love could become a betraver, a denier or a doubter. The question, "Is it me?" continues to ring throughout the ages. The Upper Room is where I witnessed our soon to be Savior wish his friends peace and place them in the care of his Father. Here I perceive Jesus' sadness as he leaves this place courageously to take on the sinfulness of his friends, humankind and me.

As dawn breaks on Easter morning, the messages in the Upper Room are magnified. I discovered the importance of being a good steward of community as a follower of Jesus and the power of huddling with fellow disciples. I understood what it might be like to experience grief, fear, surprise and joy at the same time and the importance of sharing our Jesus encounters with other followers. The crucial lesson of believing without seeing was made real in this space through Jesus' conversation with Thomas. In the Upper Room I came to know that even with all my human failings, I can be an agent

for building Christ's Church because there is no stronger force on this earth than the power of the Holy Spirit if we pray for its guidance and gifts. I want to be that missionary disciple and steward of the Church so I shall return to this sacred place often for inspiration and encouragement. Alleluia! He is Risen!
