Saint of the Week

Saint Elizabeth of Hungary

Feast Day: November 17

Elizabeth's short life was nonetheless full; she had a happy marriage and children, was a secular Franciscan, and was so devoted to the poor and sick that she gave away royal robes and founded hospitals. The daughter of a Hungarian king, Elizabeth married a nobleman of Thuringia, Louis, at age 14. He complained about the expense of her many charities until he witnessed a miracle involving Elizabeth, bread and roses. After he died during a Crusade, she became a Third Order Franciscan at Marburg, Germany, where she founded a hospital to care for the sick. Elizabeth, who was declared a saint in 1235, is the patron of bakers, young brides, widows, those falsely accused, countesses and secular Franciscans.

What it does mean is that we need to change our lives, living like children of the light and illuminating the world around us with the light of the Gospel. Then, on that day, when the details of our daily living become unimportant, we will be ready to find our peace and security in Christ Jesus.

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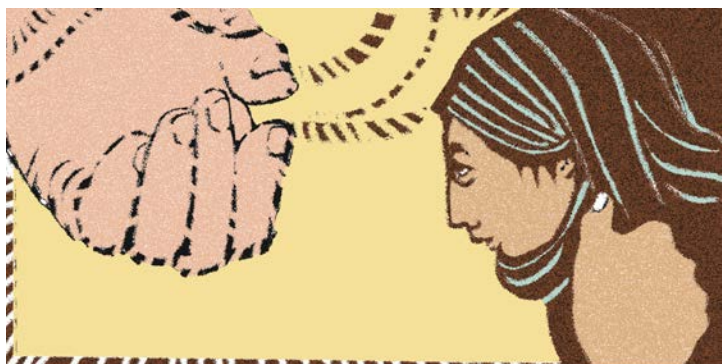

The Holiness of God in Daily Life

When God appeared to Moses on Mount Horeb, he said, “The place where you stand is holy ground” (Ex 3:5). The sixth chapter of Isaiah describes the prophet’s vision of God and hearing the angels sing, “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord” (Is 6:3). Moses reacts to God’s holiness with awe, a deep reverence for the all-embracing majesty of God. Isaiah responds to God’s holiness with an awareness of the profound and infinite purity of God. Both men undergo a spiritual transformation that they attribute to their experience of God’s holiness.

The First Commandment is more than a reference to an abstract idea of God. It is an announcement of the presence of the most holy God, both in outward creation and within the human soul. His existence does call for our faith. Our surrounding culture is filled with many distractions that shut out the majestic voice of our holy and glorious God. St. Augustine, commenting on his troubled youth, speaks of this experience with these words, “You were with me, but I was not with you. Created things kept me from you; yet if they had not been in you they would not have been at all.” But God was not simply a passive presence to Augustine, a diffident lover wondering what to do. Augustine tells us that God spoke with a vigorous voice. “You called, you shouted, and you broke through my deafness. You breathed your fragrance on me. . . . I have tasted you, now I hunger and thirst for more” (The Confessions, bk. 10, no. 27). This is the best context for appreciating the importance of the First Commandment. As God did with Augustine, he does for us again — calling, shouting, trying to break through our deafness, breathing his fragrance upon us.

Many, indeed, are listening. Numerous Catholics are seeking a deeper relationship with God through daily Mass, frequent reception of the Sacraments, the prayerful reading of Scripture, retreats, spiritual direction, diverse forms of prayer and devotional practices. With Augustine, they can say, “You touched me, and I burned for your peace.”

For Discussion

1. Most people in our culture say they believe in the existence of God. What causes the disconnection between that belief and the behavior of many?
2. How do you find that acts of faith, hope and love bring you closer to God and make your behavior an act of praise to the Lord?
3. How can we discover the presence of God in our lives? How can we share an awareness of this reality with others?

Fact of Faith

What Makes a Martyr?

Many Catholic saints are revered as martyrs: from St. Stephen, honored as our first martyr, to St. Maximilian Kolbe who gave up his life to save a young Jewish father in a concentration camp.

In recent times, the term “martyr” has been erroneously applied to people like suicide bombers and terrorists. But for Christians, a martyr isn’t a suicide.

A martyr is someone who holds on to their faith, even in the face of overwhelming, mortal force. During the Roman persecutions, Christians were ordered to renounce their faith, or be put to death. And many lost their lives rather than abandon their faith. But what made them martyrs, and worthy of veneration, was their unwavering refusal to recant. They didn’t desire to die, but if death

was a consequence of their steadfastness, they were willing to accept that consequence. From the earliest days of the Church, the martyrs were revered, and their tombs became places of worship. As an expression of the community’s faith in God’s ultimate justice, the martyrs were venerated as people who were most certainly with God in heaven. The catacombs in Rome have not only the graves of the martyrs, but also gathering places and altars where the church would celebrate the Eucharist. For centuries this tradition lived on in practice of placing a relic of a saint beneath a stone within the altars of all Catholic Churches.

Ultimately, the martyrs are beacons of hope for us. By their willingness to sacrifice themselves rather than surrender their faith, they show God’s grace shining through our human weakness.” A martyr isn’t someone who seeks their own death, but someone who holds on to their faith, even in the face of a mortal threat, trusting in God’s ultimate justice.

OTHER NOVEMBER OBSERVANCES

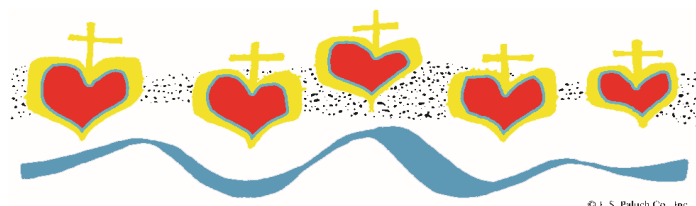
National Native American Heritage Month | Long before North America was populated by those from across the Atlantic, indigenous Americans flourished with vibrant cultures and were the original stewards of the land. From generation to generation, they handed down invaluable cultural knowledge and rich traditions which continue to thrive in Native American communities across our country. During National Native American Heritage Month, we can celebrate the lives of Native Americans and learn about their traditions and virtues that honored the sacredness of family, community and respect for the environment.

SEAS is Now Accepting 330 Mass Reservations for Combined Seating in the Church and Parish Hall

Due to the growth in attendance at our weekend Masses and in fairness to all attending, we are now taking a total of 330 Mass reservations for combined seating in the church and hall.

Please note, the obligation to attend Mass in the Diocese of Las Vegas has been lifted through Sunday, November 29.

Church doors will continue to open 30 minutes before each Mass, and reserved seating will be first come, first seated. Once capacity in the church reaches 250 people, or social distanced seating is full, whichever comes first, attendees will then be seated in the parish hall where they can view the live-streamed Mass from the church and receive Communion. All safety guidelines will remain in place for both the church and hall.

At 9:00 a.m. on Monday, November 16, the reservation link at www.seaslv.org will be activated to enable reservations to be made online, and the parish office will begin accepting phone reservations at 702-228-8311 for the 4pm Vigil on Saturday, November 21 and the Sunday Masses on November 22.

Reservations are no longer needed for the 8:00 a.m. daily Mass Monday through Saturday. Maximum capacity will still be limited to 250. Daily Mass on Wednesdays is reserved for the SEAS School children, faculty and staff and will NOT be open to the public except when school is not in session.

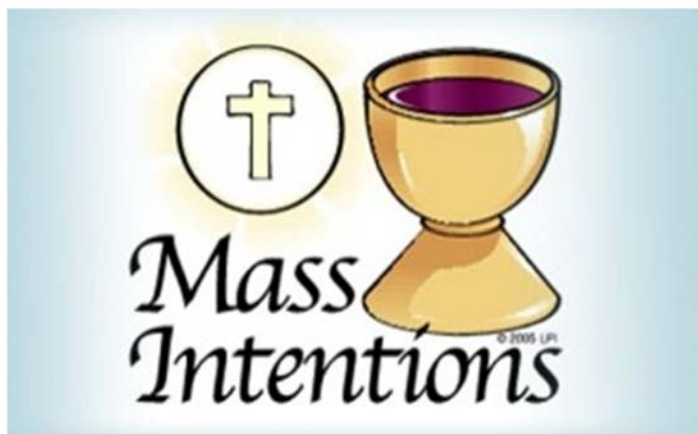

Presider's Mass Intentions

As announced in Fr. Jim's bulletin letter and pre-Mass video announcement the weekend of October 18, Presider Mass Intentions are being accepted for 2021. Mass Intentions can be scheduled by calling the church office at 702-228-8311 and pressing "0" for the receptionist or can be made in person in the gift shop during our limited hours of Tuesday through Thursday 10:00 a.m. to Noon & 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Along with our parish Mass Intention guidelines, here are some Q&As to help everyone understand the nature and practice of Mass Offerings and Mass Intentions.

When did Mass Offerings and Mass Intentions begin?

In the middle ages when people went to Mass they became more and more isolated from what the priest was doing in the sanctuary and eventually became passive spectators of what was happening on the other side of the communion rail. Consequently, the Eucharist was received less frequently; the Precious Blood from the chalice was no longer offered (no pandemic to blame back then!); and only the altar servers were allowed to respond to the prayers of the priest as the Latin language was not understood by the average person.

A simple way in which the people could take a more active role was to make a monetary Mass Offering for a Mass Intention the presiding priest would offer at a particular Mass. This was and still is a laudable practice.

Are Mass Offerings and Mass Intentions any different today?

Not really. When we give a monetary Mass Offering for a particular Presider's Mass Intention, it is still an offering **only for the presider to offer that particular intention for that Mass**, just as it was in the middle ages. We now understand, however, that just as the sacrifice of Christ on the cross was for EVERYONE, so too, the Mass (the re-presentation of Christ's sacrifice for ALL) is also for EVERYONE. Therefore, each one of us can bring our own personal Mass Intentions to every Mass in which we participate. ALL of our personal Mass Intentions are just as important and valid in the eyes of God as the Mass Intention of the presider! You see, the Mass (like Christ's sacrifice on the cross) never belongs to any one individual or any one Mass Intention.

Why don't we mention the Presider's Mass Intention at Mass?

Because the Presider's Mass Intention is just as important as everyone else's personal Mass Intentions, we don't single out or announce the Presider's Mass Intention at Mass. The Presider's Mass Intention is listed in the bulletin and on the message monitors as a simple courtesy. It is during the Universal Prayers when we pray for the Church's leadership, the world's leadership and the needs of the community along with "the personal Mass Intentions we each bring in the quiet of our hearts." God knows ALL the Mass Intentions offered at any particular Mass and hears each of them equally.

What is the requested offering for a Mass Intention?

The bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of San Francisco (of which the Diocese of Las Vegas is a part) decided many years ago that the requested offering for a single Mass Intention is ten dollars (\$10.00). This offering is given to the presider once he actually offers that particular Mass Intention.

It is important to note that no one ever BUYS a Mass! The person simply gives a Mass Offering for a Presider's Mass Intention in memory of some person (living or deceased) or special intention, and nothing more. The Mass Offering should be seen as an offering for the priest who actually of-

fers that particular intention and is never to be seen as a contract in which the person pays to have something done on their behalf. With the reservation of a Presider's Mass Intention, there is no entitlement or ownership of a particular Mass on anyone's part. That would be considered the sin of "simony" which is the buying or selling of something spiritual or closely connected to the spiritual!

Since the Mass always belongs to everyone, and never to a single person or a particular intention, we must guard against saying things like, "This is MY Mass." or "I bought this Mass." or "This Mass is for Aunt Sally." **The Mass never belongs to any one individual.** The person who provides a Mass Offering and Presider's Mass Intention is doing so only to give the presiding priest an intention for which to pray. Please remember that in the eyes of God the Presider's Mass Intention is no more important than each Mass Intention anyone offers personally.

What are the guidelines for Mass Intentions here at SEAS?

We celebrate approximately 700 Sunday, Holy Day and Weekday Masses in a liturgical year. The Code of Canon Law does not permit us to accept more offerings for Presider's Mass Intentions than can be celebrated in a year. So, to abide by canonical guidelines and in justice and fairness to as many as possible, here are the following guidelines in place for SEAS:

- Individual households are allowed to request up to two (2) Sunday or Holy Day Presider's Mass Intentions and up to two (2) regular weekday Presider's Mass Intentions within a year based on availability.
- SEAS does not accept multiple Presider's Mass Intentions for a single Mass. However, a single Presider's Mass Intention can be offered for more than one person. For example, someone can offer a single Presider's Mass Intention for +Joseph & +Mary Jones, or for the living and deceased members of the Jones Family. A maximum of three (3) individual names is allowed per intention.
- Additional Mass Intentions can be accepted by the parish and offered when the priests might

offer Mass privately, or they may be forwarded to the Diocese of Las Vegas to be offered by our retired priests. These additional Mass Intentions will not be published nor can any specific dates be requested.

- Please do not leave several Mass Intentions to the church in your will, because the parish can only accept those it can reserve/offer in a year. Any additional others would have to be sent elsewhere to be offered. Remember, Mass Intention offerings do not financially benefit the parish because those monetary offerings belong, by right, to the priest who offers the Mass Intention.

What about enrollment in the Monthly Novena Mass for the Deceased?

Those enrolled in the Monthly Novena Mass for the Deceased (the last Friday of the month), are remembered in a series of nine (9) Masses. This is an honorable way to remember someone who is deceased, especially when the Presider's Mass Intentions are filled. The requested offering for this Monthly Novena Mass for the Deceased is twenty dollars (\$20). Please check with the church office at 702-228-8311 for details and reservations.

In conclusion...

Since all of the Personal Mass Intentions we each bring to Mass AND the Presider's Mass Intention are equal in the eyes of God, there should be no disappointment if we can't "get a certain date" for a Presider's Mass Intention. All we have to do is "show up" or "tune in" [to the livestream] and offer our own Personal Mass Intention. God honors every intention offered at any Mass with the same unconditional love! You can't get any better than that!
