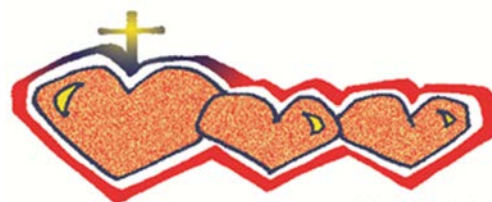

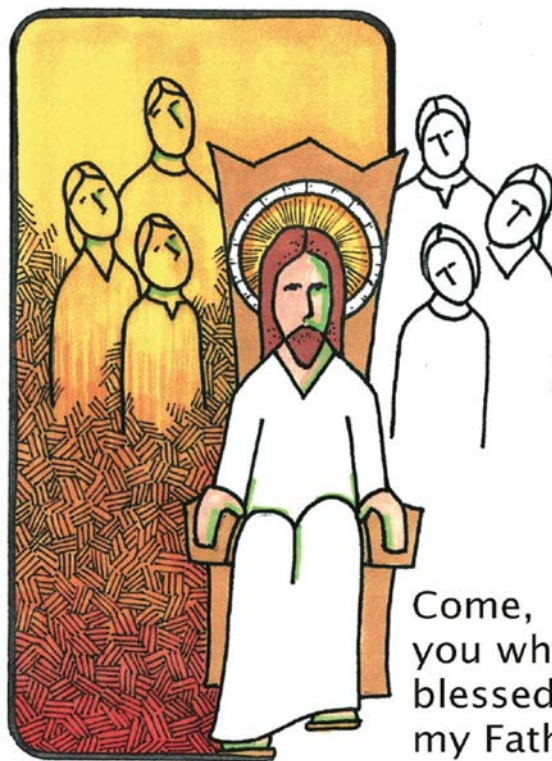

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King. The feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI with the encyclical *Quas primas*. The Holy Father speaks directly to the problem of “anti-clericalism,” which seeks to extirpate Christian influence from political life. We see a version of anti-clericalism today, for example, when it is suggested that belief in Catholic teachings renders a person unfit for a judicial appointment.

When our nation is beset by civic unrest, racial tension and a pandemic, we do well to turn to our Lord, who reigns over every people and nation.

Jesus is the Word of God made flesh, the Incarnate Lord.

“The foundation of this power and dignity of Our Lord is rightly indicated by Cyril of Alexandria. ‘Christ,’ he says, ‘has dominion over all creatures, a dominion not seized by violence nor usurped, but his by essence and by nature.’ His kingship is founded upon the ineffable hypostatic union. From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures.” —*Quas primas*, 13

Jesus shares a law of charity to show the way to communion with God.

“Not only do the gospels tell us that he made laws, but they present him to us in the act of making them. Those who keep them show their love for their Divine Master, and he promises that they shall remain in his love.” —*Quas primas*, 14

“At the end of our life we will be judged on love, that is, on our concrete commitment to love and serve Jesus in our littlest and neediest brothers and sisters. That mendicant, that needy person who reaches out his hand is Jesus; that sick person whom I must visit is Jesus; that inmate is Jesus, that hungry person is Jesus. Let us consider this.” —Pope Francis

The Church acknowledges the reign of Christ, not only privately, but publicly.

“Thus by sermons preached at meetings and in churches, by public adoration of the Blessed Sacrament exposed and by solemn processions, men unite in paying homage to Christ, whom God has given them for their King. It is by a divine inspiration that the people of Christ bring forth Jesus from his silent hiding-place in the church, and carry him in triumph through the streets of the city, so that he whom men refused to receive when he came unto his own, may now receive in full his kingly rights.” —*Quas primas*, 26

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Saint of the Week

Saint Clement of Rome

Feast Day: Nov. 23

In the revised New American Bible, Clement is listed as the fourth pope, serving 88-97. He is an important witness to the first century of the Catholic Church. Early Christian writers called him a disciple of the apostles, and he may be the Clement mentioned in St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians (4:3). As bishop of Rome, Clement wrote an Epistle to the Corinthians that is believed to be the earliest surviving record of an intervention by Rome in the affairs of a local church. Whatever problems prompted the letter, Clement gently urges the Corinthians to reconcile and accept apostolic tradition. Some legends suggesting his martyrdom are discounted. He is the patron saint of marble-workers and stonecutters.

Living the Faith

For I Was Hungry and You Gave Me Food

Every November, as we celebrate Thanksgiving, we are grateful for food, the ability to feed our own families, and the need to ensure our entire human family has enough to eat.

Our holiday table reminds us of many other important tables: tables where families come together to share a special meal; tables where our nation's decision makers negotiate trade, aid and public policies that affect us all; and, the most sacred of tables — the altar where the church gathers to be nourished by communion. Let us enter this month remembering that each table calls us to act with faith and hope.

November is the anniversary month of the pastoral letter "For I Was Hungry & You Gave Me Food: Catholic Reflections on Food, Farmers and Farmworkers," first issued in 2003. The letter seeks to highlight the issues of food and agriculture and their connection to our faith. The letter states, "We focus on how food and fiber are produced, how land is protected and how agriculture is structured, compensated and regulated to serve the 'common good.'"

The purpose of the bishop's letter was to address the concern that food and agriculture are "little seen and less understood" by a post-industrial society living increasingly technological lives. It is true we are further removed from food and agriculture than ever before. Yet what we eat, who grows and harvests that food, and the state of the earth that produces these goods are the very things we need to consider as Christian disciples. It's a valuable consideration this harvest month, and every month. More than a decade since it was first published, the bishop's pastoral letter still

serves as a poignant reminder that food and agriculture must be viewed from a deeply faith perspective.

November is also Native America Heritage month. Native Americans were once the most agriculturally prosperous group of people in the United States. Yet a snapshot of hunger and poverty today on reservations is nothing short of a banquet of scarcity. Sixty percent of the counties with majority Native Americans face dangerously high food insecurity rates, according to Feeding America. These statistics are a sobering reminder that many marginalized brothers and sisters are missing from our tables of plenty.

A broader overview of the state of hunger in our country reveals that 48 million Americans live in households that struggle to put food on the table, and that 1 in 5 kids live at risk of hunger.

Unfortunately, Thanksgiving won't be a feast for everyone.

The bishop's pastoral letter addresses the complexities of our food system but it is also a profoundly hopeful document. "We know these are not easy times, but as believers we have hope for the days ahead: We have the capacity to overcome hunger in our nation and around the world," the letter said.

Through Bread for the World's Offering of Letters campaigns, churches across the country advocate to end hunger by putting food and agriculture into focus. These annual policy advocacy campaigns remind us that God intended for all to be fed.

This Thanksgiving, let us remember that ending hunger in our lifetime will only be a reality if we act with faith and hope at all the sacred tables in our lives.

SEAS is Now Accepting 330 Mass Reservations for Combined Seating in the Church and Parish Hall

Due to the growth in attendance at our weekend Masses and in fairness to all attending, we are now taking a total of 330 Mass reservations for combined seating in the church and hall.

Please note, the obligation to attend Mass in the Diocese of Las Vegas has been lifted through December 31, 2020.

Church doors will continue to open 30 minutes before each Mass, and reserved seating will be first come, first seated. Once capacity in the church reaches 250 people, or social distanced seating is full, whichever comes first, attendees will then be seated in the parish hall where they can view the live-streamed Mass from the church and receive Communion. All safety guidelines will remain in place for both the church and hall.

At 9:00 a.m. on Monday, November 23, the reservation link at www.seaslv.org will be activated to enable reservations to be made online, and the parish office will begin accepting phone reservations at 702-228-8311 for the 9am Thanksgiving Day Mass on November 26, the 4pm Vigil on Saturday, November 28 and the Sunday Masses on November 29 (The First Sunday of Advent).

*Reservations are no longer needed for the 8:00 a.m. daily Mass Monday through Saturday. Maximum capacity will still be limited to 250. Daily Mass on Wednesdays is reserved for the SEAS School children, faculty and staff and will NOT be open to the public except when school is not in session (**Wednesday, Nov. 25, daily will be open to the public due to the school being closed for Thanksgiving break**).*

Psalms of Praise and Thanksgiving

The Thanksgiving holiday is an excellent time to rediscover the psalms of praise and thanksgiving.

When you find a quiet moment, sit and relax with your Bible. Think of a time when awe and gratitude overwhelmed you. Maybe it was a sunrise, or children playing in a park, an inspirational hymn at Mass, a family gathering or a walk in the woods. Remember how you appreciated that special moment. Then, open your Bible to one of the psalms of thanksgiving and recite it to yourself. Take Psalm 118 for instance:

*Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good;
his love endures forever.*

Listen to the words. Close your eyes. Let the psalm speak to you.

Other psalms of praise and thanksgiving you might consider include Psalms 92, 95, 98, 100, 103, 104, 105, 107, 111, 117, 145, and 147.

Whatever psalm you choose for that quiet moment, thank God for that special time of awe as well as all the good things in your life, and praise God for his glorious deeds.

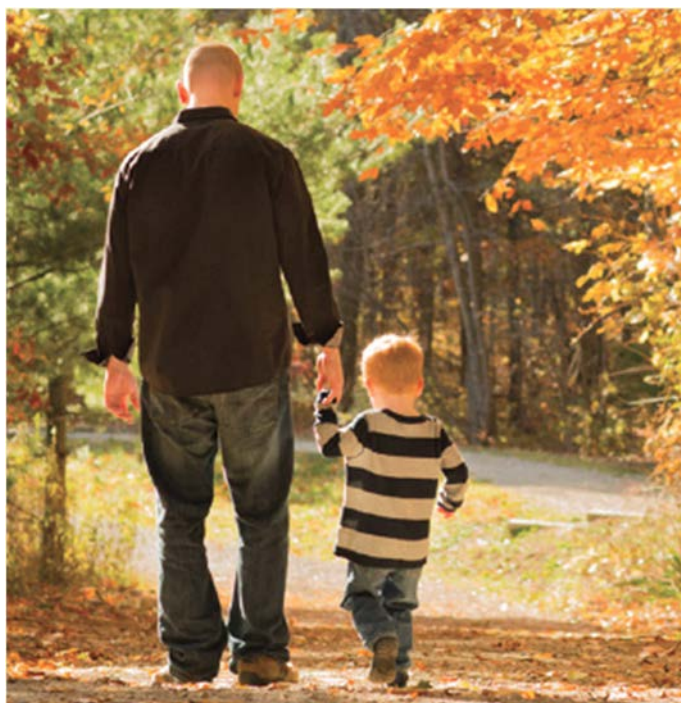

Thanksgiving...More than Just a Day

Very soon Americans will celebrate the Thanksgiving holidays. Even during these uncertain times, we will have the urge to gather for sumptuous meals highlighted by turkey and pumpkin pie, traveling to and from the ancestral home, enjoying family, feasting on leftovers and perhaps even watching football.

For many of us, Thanksgiving Day is so full of activity that there is a tendency to forget what's at the heart of Thanksgiving, offering our thanks to God for the many gifts that have been bestowed upon us. Although sometimes the reason for the holiday is forgotten in our secular culture today, good stewards of their life and faith recognize that Thanksgiving should be directed primarily in God's direction.

Because the "busyness" of Thanksgiving Day can easily distract us from slowing down to a pace more suitable to adequately expressing our gratitude to God, perhaps we might allow Thanksgiving to permeate our lives for more than just a day. Expressing gratitude is at the heart of good stewardship. So, let's dedicate a little time each day to giving thanks for our blessings. Remember all that God has given you and say "Thank you."

Take part of a day and walk or hike down a woodland path. Express your gratitude for the beauty of God's autumn creation.

Take a minute each day to thank the people in your life who matter to you. Tell them you're thankful for them. Drop someone a note, place a short phone call or maybe a video chat is in order. Telling people you're thankful for them will enrich your life as well as theirs.

Make a point to attend at least one Mass outside the regular weekend Masses. Going to Mass on Thanksgiving morning is an excellent way to enhance that holiday. As a community of faith, we know that giving glory to God in this way is an important aspect of our communal life of faith.

May this Thanksgiving be a time when we not only say "Thank You" to God, family and neighbor, but a time when our hearts draw us much closer to the Lord.

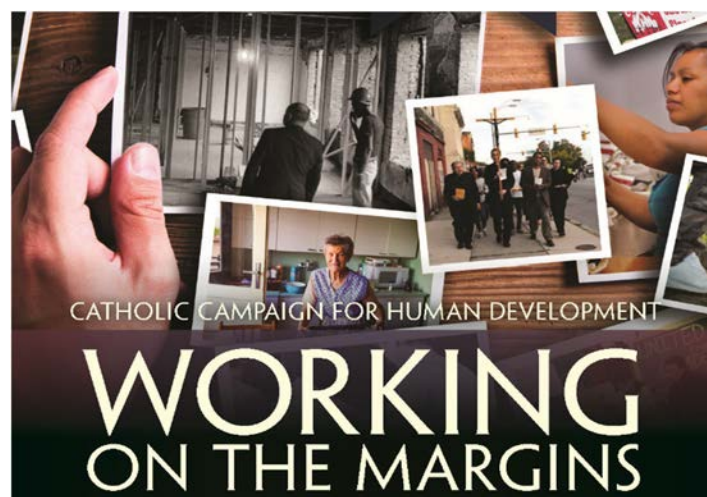

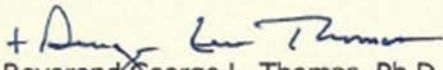
DECREE

Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Mass Extension – November 29, 2020 to December 31, 2020

While I have granted permission to begin the reopening of public Masses, due to the ongoing gravity of the present moment and the restrictions being placed on us during the civil reopening plan, I hereby extend the dispensation for **all Catholic faithful of the Diocese of Las Vegas and those Catholics visiting within the geographic boundaries of our Diocese, from the obligation of attending Sunday Masses up to and including December 31, 2020.**

While we recognize that many are eager to return to Mass in our churches, it remains important for those who are elderly and otherwise at risk to refrain from returning to public Liturgies until it is manifestly safe to do so. For all the faithful, especially those who are sick, at high risk of becoming sick, and their caregivers, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is hereby dispensed.

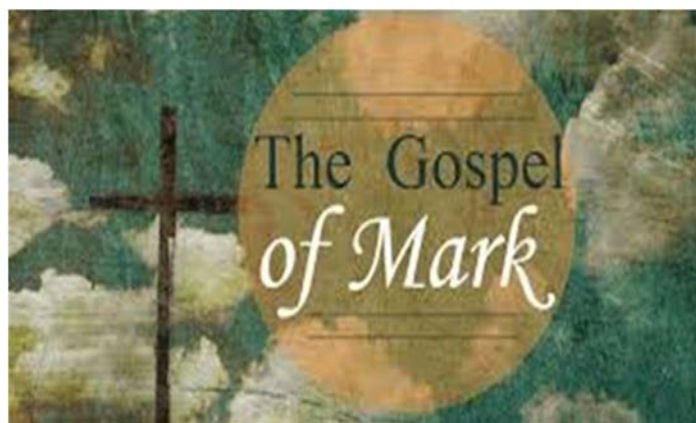

New Bible Study Set to Begin Week of January 4

Mark asks everyone to answer Jesus' question, **'Who do you say that I am?'** and challenges believers in every generation to accept the harsh reality of the cross. Beginning in December, 2020, most of the readings we will hear at Mass during the coming year come from the Gospel of Mark ... so what a perfect time to join this 10-session study as we explore Mark's theological portrait of the person and mission of Jesus Christ.

Beginning on Monday, January 4, 2021, in-person classes will be offered in the church on Monday evenings from 6:30 p.m to 8:00 p.m. and repeated on Wednesdays from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. The Wednesday morning session will also be live-streamed for those who prefer to participate from the comfort of their homes.
