





Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms for infants and children up to 7 years of age are celebrated on Sundays either during Mass or at 1:45pm. Parents and Godparents should attend the baptism class on the first Tuesday of the month at 6:30 pm in the Parish Hall classrooms. Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

Relationship with God

Today's readings invite us into prayer, into relationship with God. Because relationships feel more natural when we know one another well, Sirach encourages us to

know God better. In his wisdom, Sirach tells us what God is like: fair, open-minded, compassionate, and attentive. "The Lord will not delay," he says. Knowing that God's help comes right on time, whenever we need it, calms our hearts and helps us trust the Lord. In his second Letter to Timothy, Saint Paul demonstrates his own trust in God. Despite the grueling struggles Saint Paul has faced because of his Christian faith, he praises the Lord for rescuing him time and again. Today's Gospel draws us close to Jesus too, revealing his special love for the poor and humble. As Jesus tells his parable about the prayer habits of a Pharisee and a tax collector, our hearts long to become as gentle as Christ's.

Fact of Faith

All the Faithful Departed:
Commemoration November 2

Prayers for the dead were an ancient tradition, even in some pagan cultures. In Jewish Scriptures, Judas Maccabeus “made atonement for the dead” (2 Mc 12:46), and early Christians inscribed prayers for their dead in Rome’s catacombs. Local Catholic churches started remembering all the faithful departed in the early Middle Ages, with a Spanish feast from the time of St. Isidore of Seville, who died in 636. The fixed November date is generally attributed to St. Odilio of Cluny, who decreed in 998 that all monasteries under the Cluny rule should sing the Office of the Dead the day after the feast of All Saints. This custom gradually spread throughout Europe and was adopted by Rome in the 13th century.

In the Rite of Welcome, those who are already baptized (candidates) are affirmed in their desire to grow in their baptismal faith and enter into the full sacramental life of the Catholic Church.

At this combined ceremony, our catechumens and candidates are presented by their sponsors so that our larger parish family can welcome them and assure them of our continued prayers and support on their journey to full initiation.



Raising a Saint

Padre Pio wore mittens when he celebrated Mass. The Church recently declared him a saint, but

the designation was hardly needed—anyone who knew him could tell the Franciscan priest was otherworldly. He was known to bilocate and read people's hearts and prophesy the future. But that's not why he wore mittens.

He wore mittens because he had a series of mystical experiences where he encountered the suffering of Jesus and bore the marks of his crucifixion in his body with the stigmata. What worried Pio most about the wounds was not that they were ever fresh and raw and tender—which is to say they were as painful as having nail holes in his limbs—but that they called attention to him. So he covered them up. He wore mittens to celebrate Mass so that he wouldn't distract the faithful.

The tempting thing to do with a saint like Padre Pio is to wonder if the signs of holiness shown by his life are real—the man was a walking miracle dispensary. But let's assume that God can do all things and dig below the surface. A deeper question emerges: How is it possible for someone to shape their lives such that they become a single-hearted lightning rod for the divine?

The answer to that deeper, more interesting question rests on the shoulders of Pio's parents.

Pio's family was unexceptional—hardworking and religious. His parents couldn't read, but they memorized stories from the Bible and told them to their children. Every day, the family prayed the rosary together and attended Mass, and they fasted from meat three days a week.

Pio grew up in a world where faith was just part of the air he breathed. Prayer was as regular as eating breakfast. When he was 5, he decided to dedi-

cate his life to Jesus with at least as much devotion as a kindergartener can offer, which is maybe more than we'd give them credit for. Just after his tenth birthday he met a Franciscan friar who was walking the countryside begging for donations and Pio ran home to declare that he knew what he wanted to do with his life—he wanted to do whatever this shoeless, wandering, begging friar was doing.

His parents listened, and that's an amazing thing if you think about it. They took him to a nearby Franciscan monastery to see if this was possible. The Franciscans said yes, but Pio needed more schooling than he'd gleaned from intermittently attending public school.

So Pio's father—who was illiterate, remember—got on a boat and sailed across the ocean to New York City to find work to pay for a tutor. I encourage you to read that last sentence again.

I came across this article recently that declared that religions are on the decline in America except for one denomination that is growing. And it is growing precisely because parents are dedicated to forming their children in its traditions—its practices and nuances and meaning. They commit to this religious practice in communities and in their homes. It shapes their schedules and meals. They tell their children about role models and the kids follow them with interest.

What is this single, growing denomination? The author named it *Athletica*: the culture of sports achievement that has become the center of gravity for many American families.

It is a biting critique. It made me wonder if we give as much time and attention to our family's religious practice as we do to the music lessons and sports leagues we facilitate for our kids. What is the air our children breathe? What is the center of gravity for our family rhythm? What is as regular as breakfast for them? What would Padre Pio's dad notice if he followed me around for a day?

A Month of Hope

Death is a difficult topic. Yet, seeing it through the eyes of faith opens our hearts to the hope that it marks the entrance into the fullness of eternal life.

The Church celebrates All Souls' Day each November 2 to remind us of the reality of heaven and to remember the dead. We pray for our departed loved ones throughout the month, that we might assist in their purification and help facilitate their passage into the fullness of eternal life.

For those who have been involved in an abortion, November can be particularly heartbreaking. Mothers and fathers may be reminded of their children's deaths and find it difficult to forgive themselves. Some parents grieve their losses and wonder if their unbaptized children are in heaven.

The Church teaches us to hope in salvation for unbaptized children, whether they died through miscarriage, abortion, or another reason. She offers comfort for grieving parents and provides the support they need to entrust their children to God's loving care and to deepen their relationship with the Father of Mercies.

The Catechism says "As regards children who have died without Baptism, the Church can only entrust them to the mercy of God, as she does in her funeral rites for them. Indeed, the great mercy of God who desires that all men should be saved, and Jesus' tenderness toward children which caused him to say: 'Let the little children come to me, do not hinder them,' allow us to hope that there is a way of salvation for children who have died without Baptism" (CCC 1261).

For those who may have been involved in some way in the loss of their child, a diocesan-based Project Rachel Ministry can assist. Those feeling guilt, shame and regret due to an abortion can turn to the confidential guidance and support of ministry team members, who are priests, laypeople, or mental health professionals. The ministry helps grieving mothers and fathers to reconcile with the Lord and establish relationships with their children through prayer. Some parents experience a sense

of having been forgiven by their child. And, as we are reminded each November, our prayers help those who have died, and they can also pray for us.

Through prayer and the sacraments, we connect not only to our Father, who is boundless in mercy, but also to those for whom we have hope of salvation. Remember St. John Paul II's words to women who've had an abortion: "The Father of mercies is ready to give you his forgiveness and his peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. To the same Father and his mercy you can with sure hope entrust your child" (Evangelium Vitae, 99).

As members of the body of Christ, the Church, we are an Easter people, living with the hope given to us by Christ's Resurrection, His victory over sin and death. We are called to bear witness to the gift of every life, no matter how brief or small. This November, remember that every unbaptized child who has died can be entrusted to God's loving mercy. Let us pray especially that parents of aborted children are blessed with the hope of being reunited with them in heaven one day.

Stewardship and “Screwtape”

A Message for Halloween!

Imagine a stranger coming to your door, making demands accompanied by threats. Worse, he’s wearing a disguise.

The night is dark, the moon hidden by fall leaves still clinging to the trees. What a terrifying scenario.

But, wait! It’s October 31, and the strangers are very small. They’re disguised as little Batmen and ballerinas, pirates and princesses, and their demands and threats are accompanied by tiny “pleases” and “thank yous.” It’s Halloween, and it’s actually a magical scenario.

A great deal of life is framed by our perceptions, isn’t it? How we approach a situation, whether we see a threat or a promise, a trick, or perhaps a treat, depends so much on our own attitude and the honesty we bring to our lives.

In his classic book, *The Screwtape Letters*, C.S. Lewis portrays a senior devil, Screwtape, as a bureaucrat who is mentoring a young devil named Wormwood in how to be a tricky enemy of humanity. Screwtape knows that one of the best ways to seduce people to evil is to persuade them to rationalize their choices. The more dishonesty Screwtape can help us finagle into our reasoning, the more successful the devil’s enterprise.

It’s a great book for stewardship reading, because it makes us reexamine our own perceptions of evil and good in our lives.

“I think I should stay home from Mass this morning. God knows I really need the rest.” “I don’t really have any talents to offer my parish in this year’s ministry sign-ups.” “I earned this money and it’s mine. What I do with it is my business.”

Screwtape would probably be very pleased with those rationalizations. They help us to “trick” our-

selves into accepting a false scenario. This timeless book by C.S. Lewis helps us understand the varying methods that the devil uses to keep Christians shallow in their faith and disconnected from God. As the Apostle Peter writes in 1 Peter 5:8-9: “Be sober and vigilant. Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour. Resist him, steadfast in faith...” If you want to give yourself a “treat” for Halloween, pick up a copy of *The Screwtape Letters* and see how it relates to your own life.

The words of the Pharisee are very much centered on himself: he makes claims about his character. He highlights his own admirable activities. Good stewards of their prayer lives know that a prayer of praise and thanksgiving should focus on the goodness of God. Do your prayers of thanksgiving always stay focused on God’s unfathomable, immeasurable goodness and generosity?
