Saint of the Week

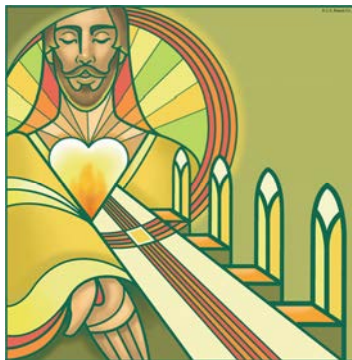
Gregory the Great
540—604
Feast Day—Sept. 3

This patrician prefect of Rome is counted among the doctors and Fathers of the Church. After his father's death, he gave family estates to the church, founding seven monasteries, including the one he joined in his family home in Rome. Following ordination, he served as papal nuncio in Constantinople, 579-586, then was an abbot in Rome until 590, when he became the first monk elected pope. Gregory I reformed the clergy, sent missionaries to England, promoted monasticism and chant, wrote prolifically, and assumed civic duties in Rome in the face of natural disasters and the warring Lombards. He is a patron saint of choirboys, musicians, singers and England.

"In the intimacy of conversation with God and in the regenerating contact with his grace, he can find the light and wisdom necessary to 'adapt his word to the audience listening to him, so that it may be grasped by the mind of everyone, without losing the power of being edifying for all' (Ibid. II, prol.). May this happen in your parish! Then will be realized among you that which St Gregory, in a poetic image, indicated as the ideal of every Christian community: that is, to be like a 'well-tuned lyre' which, skillfully touched by the artist, raises to God the harmonious sound of its melody (cf. *ibid.*)."— St. John Paul II, homily, February 18, 1979

Care of Creation

Scripture and Tradition Speak

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

Scripture Speaks About Creation

- Genesis 1:1-31
God made the heavens and the earth, and it was good.
- Genesis 2:15
Humans are commanded to care for God's creation.
- Leviticus 25:1-7
The land itself must be given a rest and not abused.
- Deuteronomy 10:14
All of heaven and earth belong to the Lord.
- Psalm 24:1-2
All the earth is the Lord's.
- Daniel 3:56-82
Creation proclaims the glory of God.
- Matthew 6:25-34
God loves and cares for all of creation.
- Romans 1:20
Creation reveals the nature of God.
- 1 Corinthians 10:26
Creation and all created things are inherently good because they are of the Lord.

Tradition Speaks About Creation

"A true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. . . . Everything is connected. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society." (Pope Francis, *On Care for Our Common Home* [Laudato Si'], nos. 49, 91)

"The notion of the common good also extends to future generations. The global economic crises

have made painfully obvious the detrimental effects of disregarding our common destiny, which cannot exclude those who come after us. We can no longer speak of sustainable development apart from intergenerational solidarity. Once we start to think about the kind of world we are leaving to future generations, we look at things differently; we realize that the world is a gift which we have freely received and must share with others. Since the world has been given to us, we can no longer view reality in a purely utilitarian way, in which efficiency and productivity are entirely geared to our individual benefit. Inter-generational solidarity is not optional, but rather a basic question of justice, since the world we have received also belongs to those who will follow us." —(Pope Francis, *On Care for Our Common Home* [Laudato Si'], no. 159)

"We human beings are not only the beneficiaries but also the stewards of other creatures. Thanks to our bodies, God has joined us so closely to the world around us that we can feel the desertification of the soil almost as a physical ailment, and the extinction of a species as a painful disfigurement. Let us not leave in our wake a swath of destruction and death which will affect our own lives and those of future generations." (Pope Francis, *The Joy of the Gospel* [Evangelii Gaudium], no. 215)

"The environment is God's gift to everyone, and in our use of it we have a responsibility towards the poor, towards future generations and towards humanity as a whole. . . . Our duties towards the environment are linked to our duties towards the human person, considered in himself and in relation to others.

It would be wrong to uphold one set of duties while trampling on the other." (See Pope Benedict XVI, *Charity in Truth* [Caritas in Veritate], nos. 48, 51)

"Changes in lifestyle based on traditional moral virtues can ease the way to a sustainable and equitable world economy in which sacrifice will no longer be an unpopular concept. For many of us, a life less focused on material gain may remind us that we are more than what we have. Rejecting the false promises of excessive or conspicuous con-

sumption can even allow more time for family, friends, and civic responsibilities. A renewed sense of sacrifice and restraint could make an essential contribution to addressing global climate change.” (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, *Global Climate Change: A Plea for Dialogue, Prudence and the Common Good*)

“Equally worrying is the ecological question which accompanies the problem of consumerism and which is closely connected to it. In his desire to have and to enjoy rather than to be and to grow, man consumes the resources of the earth and his own life in an excessive and disordered way. . . . Man, who discovers his capacity to transform and in a certain sense create the world through his own work, forgets that this is always based on God’s prior and original gift of the things that are. Man thinks that he can make arbitrary use of the earth, subjecting it without restraint to his will, as though it did not have its own requisites and a prior God-given purpose, which man can indeed develop but must not betray. Instead of carrying out his role as a cooperator with God in the work of creation, man sets himself up in place of God and thus ends up provoking a rebellion on the part of nature, which is more tyrannized than governed by him.” (St. John Paul II, *On the Hundredth Year [Centesimus Annus]*, no. 37)

“The dominion granted to man by the Creator is not an absolute power, nor can one speak of a freedom to “use and misuse,” or to dispose of things as one pleases. The limitation imposed from the beginning by the Creator himself and expressed symbolically by the prohibition not to “eat of the fruit of the tree” (cf. Gen 2:16-17) shows clearly enough that, when it comes to the natural world, we are subject not only to biological laws but also to moral ones, which cannot be violated with impunity. A true concept of development cannot ignore the use of the elements of nature, the renewability of resources and the consequences of haphazard industrialization—three considerations which alert our consciences to the moral dimension of development.” (St. John Paul II, *On Social Concerns [Sollicitudo rei Socialis]*, no. 34)

Children's Faith Formation (age 3 – grade 8)

We offer formation classes for children preparing for First Eucharist, Baptism (older than age 7), Continuing Formation (after receiving the sacraments), and the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program for children ages 3 to 5 (entering kindergarten).

The 2019-2020 season starts the week of September 17.

Classes: Tuesdays and Thursdays

Times: 4:30 p.m. to 5:40 p.m.
and 6:00 p.m. to 7:10 p.m.

Requirements:

- Parents or guardians are registered members of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish or a Catholic Parish in the Las Vegas Diocese. Regular attendance at Sunday Liturgy is part of the formation process.
- Registration fee is \$150.00 per child. No child will be turned away due to financial difficulty.
- Families must provide a Birth and Baptism Certificate and deposit at the time of registration. Sacrament preparation at SEAS is a family preparation process that requires the participation of the child and the parent throughout the formation years.

Sacraments:

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a two-year process for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason (7 years), are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil in their second year of preparation.

First Eucharist Initiation:

The two-year preparation process to celebrate First Eucharist teaches children about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The child and the parent will participate in retreats in their second year.

Continuing Formation:

Children in 3rd grade and higher who are baptized and have received First Eucharist will continue their formation in age appropriate classes. It is the practice of our faith that formation is ongoing and is a life-long journey.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS):

This is a hands-on, interactive working environment where children are guided toward a greater understanding of God's love in their life. They encounter Jesus the Good Shepherd, who loves them, cares for them and knows them by name. Children are most sensitive to a relationship with God between the ages of 3-6. For this reason, we provide formal faith formation for young children.
