Treasures From Our Tradition

Over the past century, a desire to recover a deep sense of unity among all believers in Christ has grown. The "ecumenical movement" (from the Greek word meaning the "the whole inhabited world") began among Protestant Christians, but was given great energy in 1920 with a letter from the Orthodox Patriarch of Constantinople, calling for closer dialogue and cooperation among Christians. In 1960, Pope John XXIII invited Protestant and Orthodox observers to the Second Vatican Council. In 1964, the Council's Decree on Ecumenism named these Christians "separated brethren," a huge leap forward from the time of labeling them as "outside the Church." A year later, a new pope, Paul VI, and the Orthodox Patriarch officially nullified the condemnations that walled off East from West for nine hundred years.

The pace and optimism of the 1960s has sadly waned, and the signs of progress toward unity are few; yet there are wider agreements on sharing Communion among various Christian denominations, and among Protestants agreements regarding sharing of ecclesiastical life and ministry. Among the success stories of the ecumenical movement are greater cooperation among Christian clergy, a similar Lectionary for Protestants and Catholics, and even experiments in the monastic life and common worship.





Saint of the Week

Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus Virgin and Doctor of the Church (St. Thérèse of Lisieux, "the Little Flower") January 2, 1873 - September 30, 1897 Feast Day - October 1

St. Thérèse was the youngest of nine children. Four died at a young age, and the remaining five girls, including Thérèse would all enter religious life. In her short life, Thérèse endured great suffering and gave great love.

At just four years old, Thérèse's mother died, a hard blow for the little one. She suffered greatly from the loss and carried this weight into her early teenage years. Still, she was supported by the love and care of her father and sisters. She was taught by her elder sisters, Marie and Pauline, until age eight. Then she went to a Benedictine school. While she exceled at school, students treated her badly and caused her great sorrow. Her sister Céline supported her through this time. At age ten, her sister Pauline, who had acted as her second mother, left for the convent, and loss again hit Thérèse. She experienced a serious illness with physical and emotional symptoms that doctors could not treat. After months of prayer by her and her family, Thérèse was miraculously cured. She attributed the cure to Our Lady of Victories.

Everything changed for Thérèse one Christmas Eve in 1886. Nearly 14 years old, she had a profound conversion. In a single moment of grace, she received the strength to set aside her past sorrow and turn her energy outward toward loving others. This freedom, joy, and strength of soul prepared her for the next stage of her life. She soon actively sought to join the Carmelite order, following in her sisters' footsteps. On a trip to Italy speaking out of turn—she asked the pope for permission to enter religious life early. At age 15, she entered a cloistered Carmelite convent in Lisieux, Normandy, and took the name Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face.


At the convent in Lisieux, she grew in her "little way" of holiness—seeking perfection in the ordinary things of life with a simple but total trust in God. Poor health made her dream of missionary work impossible, but the "Little Flower" soon realized that her true vocation was to love. She made small daily sacrifices for souls and sought to show love to her religious sisters by simple gestures. Thérèse's personal spirituality was preserved in her autobiography, which a convent superior had directed her to write. Summing up much of her spirituality, she wrote, "What matters in life is not great deeds but great love."

In 1896, Thérèse contracted tuberculosis and died the following year at age 24. The manuscript of her life story, *The Story of a Soul*, was published after her death and prompted popular devotion. She was canonized in 1925 and declared the patron saint of missions two years later. In art she is portrayed in her Carmelite habit with roses and a crucifix. St. John Paul II later declared St. Thérèse a Doctor of the Church.

The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist

Excerpts from the US Catholic Bishops' Statement

The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal, our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross through the ages and to entrust to the Church his spouse a memorial of his death and resurrection. As the Gospel of Matthew tells us:

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." (Mt 26:26-28; cf. Mk 14:22-24, Lk 22:17-20, 1 Cor 11:23-25)

Recalling these words of Jesus, the Catholic Church professes that, in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. . . . For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:51-55). The whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine—the glorified Christ who rose from the dead after dying for our sins. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. This presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This presence of Christ in the Eucharist is called "real" not to exclude other types of his presence as if they could not be understood as real (cf. Catechism, no. 1374). The risen Christ is present to his Church in many ways, but most especially through the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

What does it mean that Jesus Christ is present in the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine? How does this happen? The presence of the risen Christ in the Eucharist is an inexhaustible mystery that the Church can never fully explain in words. We must remember that the triune God is the creator of all that exists and has the power to do more than we can possibly imagine. As St. Ambrose said: "If the word of the Lord Jesus is so powerful as to bring into existence things which were not, then a fortiori those things which already exist can be changed into something else" (De Sacramentis, IV, 5-16). God created the world in order to share his life with persons who are not God. This great plan of salvation reveals a wisdom that surpasses our understanding. But we are not left in ignorance: for out of his love for us, God reveals his truth to us in ways that we can understand through the gift of faith and the grace of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. We are thus enabled to understand at least in some measure what would otherwise remain unknown to us, though we can never completely comprehend the mystery of God.

Stewardship



September: Recommitting to Stewardship

Summer's end brings with it nostalgia for carefree days, long nights, lazy weekend afternoons, reunions with families, and summer road trips. But in our parishes, autumn brings a burst of new life that makes September feel almost like spring. Why? For

the Christian steward, fall brings a renewed sense of commitment.

Literally, many of us make our commitment of time and resources to our parish during September or soon after. Stewardship and ministry fairs bring a sense of excitement to parish weekends, witness talks remind us of the good work to be done, renewed calls for sign-ups for Eucharistic Adoration are issued, and kids are everywhere – in our Catholic schools and in our faith formation programs – filling us with hope and enthusiasm for our young Church.

This is the time when we reexamine and reconfirm our stewardship. If you found yourself away from your parish this summer – either through neglect or through travel and visits to other parishes – now is the time to get reacquainted. Our parish is our primary faith community, where we built relationships based on our shared values and sacramental life, and September is a wonderful way to come "home" to that community. Some things which will draw you closer to your faith community during September:

- Spend time with people you may not have seen due to summer travels, and "meet and greet" any newcomers you spot.
- Make sure you go to your child's faith formation class and introduce yourself to the teacher.
- Consider a new ministry this year. Think of

something that will reinvigorate you, provide the greatest service, bring out your best talents, and help you to meet more of your fellow parishioners.

- Maybe you've gotten a new pastor or associate pastor over the summer. Now's the time to introduce yourself and issue a dinner invitation.
- Find out what adult faith formation classes or presentations are offered for the fall, and commit to at least one.
- Take inventory of your financial giving. Did you sometimes neglect the parish offertory during the summer months? Find out if your parish has online giving, or automatic withdrawal, so that your year-round stewardship helps provide the parish with a stable income.
- Make Sunday Mass your top weekend priority, ahead of sports, school activities, or other temptations.

In today's Gospel Jesus offers a warning about living selfishly in his parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. The Rich Man holds sumptuous feasts and dresses in fine clothes. But despite his affluence he does nothing to relieve the painful hunger and debilitating condition of his neighbor Lazarus. He neglects to love his neighbor as he loves himself and is sent to hell for his lifestyle and desire for self-gratification. The Rich Man represents those who spend their money on their own personal pleasures with no regard for sharing their material possessions with the poor and needy in their own neighborhood. Good stewards realize the practical implications of not only loving God, but loving their neighbor as they would love themselves. Who are the less fortunate in our neighborhood? Do we share a portion of our own blessings with them?
