Dear Parishioners and Friends of SEAS,

GO INTO THE WHOLE WORLD!

"Brothers and sisters,

On this Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, we're given the simple command from Jesus in Mark's Gospel: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15) So, how do we do that? Simply put, by how we witness the love of God in all we say and do. St. Paul, in his Letter to the Ephesians, put it this way:

I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace: (emphasis added) one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all,

who is over all and through all and in all." (Ephesians 4:1-6)

In these days of political divisiveness and judgmental finger-pointing, we can't allow ourselves to get caught up in that trap. Those actions are not the actions of disciples! We are called to be better than that! As disciples of the Lord, we bear with one another and strive for unity, not necessarily uniformity. The Spirit moves where the Spirit wants, but the secular world wants the Spirit to stay put and take a back seat so it can have its own way.

When Jesus ascended into heaven, he didn't leave us, he didn't take a back seat. In Matthew's Gospel he assured us with his last words: "I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20) Certainly he remains with us, most substantially, in the humble gift of his real presence in the Holy Eucharist. But, we can't keep Christ just locked up in the tabernacle! He wants to live in and through us as well! May our words and actions, then, give witness to our belief in Christ's real presence in the Holy Eucharist and in the core of our own hearts.

May we "go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" armed with the love of God, the unity of the Spirit, and the bond of peace!

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

As Jesus ascended to heaven, his Mother, Mary, remained with the disciples as they all had to learn how to navigate this new life called "the Way." As we celebrate our Blessed Mother during every month of May, we know that we can rely on her as a most faithful friend and powerful intercessor as she helps us navigate the journeys of our own lives as well.

On this Mother's Day, we take time to honor all those special women, among the living, who help us navigate the complexities of our lives: our Mothers who have nurtured us from the very moment of our conception, our Grandmothers, Godmothers, Step-Mothers, Adoptive Mothers, Foster Mothers and all the special women who have "Mothered" us during our lives. Blessings upon them all on this special day of honor!

For some Mothers and Children, however, this day may not be a time of joy. The challenges and difficulties that can affect familial relationships in negative ways may also be opportunities to ask our Blessed Mother's intercessory help. May she help those who are hurting to journey through the hurt to hopeful reconciliation, acceptance and healing. There is hope for all in the words the Angel Gabriel said to Mary at the Annunciation, "for nothing will be impossible for God." (Luke 1:37)

And on this Mother's Day, let us not forget to acknowledge the special women in our lives who have died and journey on to eternal life. May the God of love, mercy and compassion welcome them home to their eternal destiny where we all hope to be reunited in love one day.




The Fátima Children

The Fátima children, Francisco Marto, Jacinta Marto, and Lucia dos Santos, were three young shepherds, ranging in age from 7 to 10 years old, from the small village of Fátima, Portugal. On May 13, 1917, their lives changed when all three saw an apparition of Mary while tending to their flocks. The apparitions of Mary continued for six months, culminating in the famous Miracle of the Sun, or Miracle of Fátima, on October 13, 1917, which was witnessed by thousands of people.

During the apparitions, Mary conveyed messages to the children and asked them to pray the rosary. She petitioned the children to pray for world peace, the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She also gave them three secrets — predicting the end of World War I and the start of World War II, a vision of those suffering in Hell, as well as a prediction of the persecution of Christians and a man dressed in white, probably a Pope, being shot. The Church officially recognizes this as the assassination attempt on St. Pope John Paul II's life in 1981.

Tragically, both Francisco and Jacinta fell victim to the Spanish flu pandemic, with Francisco passing away in 1919 at age 10 and Jacinta in 1920 at age 9. Lucia, the eldest of the three, grew up to become a Carmelite sister. She spent her life spreading the messages of Fatima and authored six memoirs that detailed the apparitions and the secrets she and the others had received. She lived a very long life and passed away in 2005 at the age of 97.

On May 13, 2017, the centennial of the first apparition, the Marto siblings, who died in their youth, were canonized as saints and Sister Lucia was declared a Servant of God. Lucia was elevated to Venerable on June 22, 2023. Saints Francisco, Jacinta, and Venerable Lucia, pray for us!

The Ascension of the Lord

A few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with greatest frequency was: Tutti dentro. It means, "Everyone in." He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church's primary longing is for everyone to join Her.

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis represents. Jesus' concern is unity, praying to the Father, "that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what he ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude toward Christian unity, and to commit to do whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope's desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Question: Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

Answer: This is an interesting question! During his earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and he is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good he does here on earth!

- 3. Married couples must exhibit a willingness to share your story and your wisdom with our engaged couples



How Often Do We REALLY Pray?








SEAS Women's Retreat June 15
