

MERCY FLOWS, LOVE REDEEMS

Dear Parishioners and Friends of SEAS,

PEACE BE WITH YOU

When we attend Mass with a Bishop presiding, after we make the sign of the cross, instead of hearing the phrase "The Lord be with you," we hear the Bishop greet us with the words: "Peace be with you." A Bishop is the only one who can say that greeting at the beginning of Mass. It is the same greeting we hear in the Gospel of John where Jesus, after his resurrection, greets his stunned disciples gathered in the upper room: "Peace be with you." (John 20:19) In the confusion experienced by the disciples at this moment, it's no surprise that Jesus' first word to utter is "peace."

The desire for peace is at the core of every heart. That desire comes from God. The question for us is, "Do we really seek God's peace?" Just take a look at the times when we mention "peace" at Mass:

- At the conclusion of the Lord's Prayer we hear the presider say, "...graciously grant peace in our days..."
- In the only prayer addressed to Jesus at Mass, the presider says: "Lord, Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will."
- Then we are greeted with "The peace of the Lord be with you always" and "Let us offer each other the sign of peace."
- We then conclude the Breaking of the Bread with "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us **peace**."

I don't think it's a coincidence that these encounters with the word "peace" surround the time when we encounter the Prince of Peace in the Holy Eucharist! It would seem to follow then, that this encounter with the Prince of Peace in the most intimate way possible in Holy Communion, would have an effect in our lives as well.

It is my prayer, on this Solemnity of Pentecost, that the Holy Spirit continue to help us be disciples of peace in all we say and do. Happy Pentecost!


BISHOP PEPE UPDATE



EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH



St. Pope Gregory VII

St. Gregory VII (c.1015-1085) was born in Italy and originally named Ildebrando di Sovana which translates to Hildebrand of Sovana. He grew up in a devout Catholic family and his uncle, Laurentius, was abbot of a monastery in Rome.

As a young man, Hildebrand became close with Pope Leo IX. He was made a cardinal subdeacon and a legate. As a papal legate he served in France, Germany, and Italy. After Pope Leo IX's death, Hildebrand became a leading figure in the papal court of the next few popes.

Shortly after the death of Pope Alexander II, Hildebrand was quickly ordained a priest and raised to the papacy. He chose the name Pope Gregory VII in honor of the first Pope Gregory whose writings heavily influenced him. During his time as pope, Gregory VII worked hard to reform the Church he so loved.

At the time, the Church was facing corruption. People in leadership were selling sacred offices and sacramentals, some clergy were unlawfully marrying, and kings and nobles, were controlling the appointment of Church officials. Pope Gregory VII fiercely resisted these corruptions. In fact, in order to put an end to the Roman Emperor Henry IV's control over which bishops were appointed, he excommunicated him three times. Pope Gregory VII's desire was to reunite the Church under the banner of Christ and the Holy Eucharist, instead of under the banner of whoever was richest and desired the most control.

Pope Gregory VII is remembered as one of the most important popes in Church history and lends his name to the Gregorian Reform, the period of reform in the Church that secured freedom from the intrusion of civil rulers. Saint Pope Gregory VII, pray for us!

Pentecost Sunday

When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. Now twenty-four years later, my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity — despite my many weaknesses. What makes that continuation possible?

This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The Holy Spirit is the means by which Jesus establishes a new family, one that crosses all possible boundaries of time, space, and culture. The Holy Spirit never tires in enthusing us for mission.



WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Question: How do we know when we receive the Holy Spirit?

Answer: My brothers and I discovered something as we got older. There's a little bit of dad in us. Each time we catch ourselves using one of his gestures, expressions, or comments about a meal, we say, "I'm getting more like Dad!" Many laughs and good-natured kidding have come out of it. Mom loves it, and so does Dad, although I doubt he'd admit it!

When we are confirmed, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is no radical change in us that makes us seem suddenly different. Over a period of time, we come to see that there is a little bit of the Spirit in us. We catch ourselves using the gifts, and often end up wondering where a bit of wisdom came from, or why we were so patient, or we feel an intensity in our prayer. Perhaps we felt drawn to deepen our spiritual life or found courage in witnessing to our faith. That's when we know we have received the Holy Spirit. We take on his image. Yes, we grow in age, grace and wisdom, but we also grow in our awareness and understanding of the working of God in our life. We become more godlike, realizing we're getting more and more like God. Our thoughts, words and actions carry that quality and others too, see it in us. You might call it holiness. But be confident! There's a little bit of him in all of us.
