Born and raised in Pennsylvania, Fr. Renninger studied piano, voice, and guitar while in high school. He attended Ursinus College (PA), where he received degrees in philosophy and music history. In 1985, he began priestly formation as a member of the Norbertine Order at Daylesford Abbey (Paoli, PA). He later attended The Catholic University of America, where he received graduate degrees in theology and liturgy. He was ordained as priest for the Diocese of Richmond in 1993 and has served as Vicar for Vocations and Rector of the Cathedral. He currently serves as pastor of St. Mary's Church in Richmond, and travels throughout the U.S. giving presentations on spirituality, liturgy, music, and sacramental theology. Fr. Mike enjoys jogging, Oreo cookies, and Elvis. *He is considered* one of the top inspirational speakers in the country, and is one of the speakers at the Festival of Homilitics.
